COVID Christmas

Organizers scrambling to plan events

COVID-19 is already impacting Christmas plans, as local communities are scrambling to decide what to do in regards to annual holiday events. Opinions on how best to proceed vary widely, given the increase in COVID cases over the past few weeks and new restrictions stipulated by Gov. JB Pritzker.

In all cases, COVID is causing modifications. Here is a rundown on the information presently at hand, with a caveat that the situations could change.

Wyoming – Most of Moonlight Madness will be conducted virtually, but Santa Claus will be at the Paramount Theater ticket booth window today (Nov. 20) from 5-7 p.m. and Saturday from 10 a.m. to noon. Children can come greet Saint Nick in a socially distanced setting.

The Wyoming Chamber of Commerce is also holding decorating contests for business storefronts/front windows and for residences. Wyoming residents who wish to participate must sign up and be

decorated by today. Information is on-line at forms.gle/yRLAhv9f66UnvMoy9.

The Chamber also held an Ugly Mask contest, a wreath decorating contest and a turkey and ham giveaway. Information was on the chamber's Facebook page.

There will be no parade this year.

Toulon – The Toulon Civic Association will tentatively "encourage and sponsor" a Christmas Walk on Saturday, Dec. 5, from 5-7 p.m. Santa will arrive at 6 p.m. and, weather permitting, will be outside by the gazebo.

The Association will meet again Sunday to finalize plans. But at present, all activities will be outside due to COVID-19, and participants are asked to wear masks, observe social distancing and follow CDC guidelines.

Participating businesses are asked to set up a table outside and refreshments may be served, according to health department recommendations. Businesses are also encouraged to decorate

COVID clampdown

Additional restrictions start today

SPRINGFIELD – Gov. JB
Pritzker announced the
entire state would enter
Tier 3 of his mitigation plan
starting today (Nov. 20) as
he noted the best way for
Illinoisans to avoid another
stay-at-home order was by
staying home.

"Tier 3 boils down to this: if you don't need to do it, don't," Gov. JB Pritzker said of leaving the home as COVID-19 cases and hospitalizations continue to soar.

Pritzker said the Tier 3 mitigations stop short of a stay-at-home order, although staying home was the best option for limiting the virus' spread. More businesses are allowed to remain open than when he issued a stay-at-home

order in March because more is known about the virus, he said.

The announcement that certain businesses – including casinos and indoor gaming terminals – would close came as the Illinois Department of Public Health reported another 12,601 new confirmed and probable cases of COVID-

19 and 97 virus-related deaths.

Stark County was at 170 confirmed cases and three deaths as of Nov. 18, while Henry County stood at 1,928 cases and 12 deaths.

Tier 3 mitigations also call for limiting home gatherings to household members and banning gatherings at meeting rooms, banquet centers, private party rooms, private clubs and country clubs. Funerals are limited to 10 family members of the deceased person.

"To be very clear, we are relying on you here," Pritzker said. "Nobody will go door-to-door to check on you. But we're asking people to hold themselves and each other accountable."

Stark Co. postpones basketball

WYOMING – The Stark County School Board voted Monday to postpone basketball until the State of Illinois and the Illinois Department of Public Health downgrade the sport from being considered high-risk.

"We have met with our attorney, received information from our insurance carrier, and we have input from board members, administrators, our athletic director and coaches," Stark County School District Superintendent Brett Elliott said Monday. "A letter from all the superintendents in the [Lincoln Trail] conference is available and we are all in agreement that we are recommending that we postpone the basketball season until the IDPH [Illinois Department of Public Health] allows us to have a full season."

Currently the IDPH has categorized basketball as "a high risk sport at Level

One and that calls for no contact." Elliott said that talking with the coaches that a recommendation was two or three days of "no contact skill work – shooting and walking through out-of-bounds plays with no contact."

That could also change, as the Illinois High School Association announced that it is "temporarily pausing" the winter season.

The board gave Elliott autonomy to work with the Lincoln Trail Conference superintendents and the Stark County basketball coaches and athletic director to determine details on practices and frequency of those practices.

In other action, the board approved a contract with the Farnsworth Group particularly the engineering branch to move forward with the high school renovation project, which would begin the planning

stages with CORE Construction. Preliminary construction could commence during the summer of 2021. Replacement of fence posts at the high school football field, in Wyoming, was discussed. The board gave Elliott permission to submit a Health Life Safety inquiry on this project. The Farnsworth Group will examine the fence and make recommendations. Approved were two intergovernmental agreements with the Bradford

School District, allowing Bradford students to attend Stark County High School and Bradford Junior High students to participate in Stark County's athletic programs.

According to Elliott, all three schools in Stark County received "commendable" ratings on the 2019-20 State Report card. It was noted the report card did not include testing data due to COVID-19.

An annual presentation of the preliminary tax levy plan was approved.

The school district will see a 3 percent estimated increase in its' EAV and will schedule a hearing in December. After a closed session, the board approved hiring Emilie Hahn as a high school English teacher for fiscal year 2021 beginning Jan. 4, 2021; hired Logan Davison as a student crossing guard; and accepted the resignation of Kim Davis from the kitchen staff. Finally, schools will be closed Nov. 23-27 for Thanksgiving break and will resume Nov. 30.

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

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

AMPDOWN: Indoor sports put on pause

Hospitalizations pushed past new highs again at the end of Monday, with 5,887 hospital beds in use by COVID-19 patients, an increase of 306 from the day before. It's the 23rd straight day of increases.

"Right now this virus has backed us into a corner," said IDPH Director Dr. Ngozi Ezike. "And we are left making insanely difficult and weighty decisions. Instead of trying to buck the mitigations, can we all just follow them, acknowledging that these are what are needed to get back to some semblance of normal?"

Health and fitness centers will be allowed to operate at 25 percent capacity as long as all patrons wear a face covering and reservations will be required. Indoor classes will not be allowed.

The guidance also calls for a "pause" of all indoor group sporting and recreational activities including youth and adult recreational sports while Tier 3 mitigations are in place. This

includes park districts and travel leagues.

Outdoor sports and recreation are allowed but participant groups and practices outdoors will be limited to 10 people or less and social distancing and masks are required.

The Illinois High School Association has announced a pause to its high school sports. Executive Director Craig Anderson said, "The (IHSA) recognizes that today's announcement by Governor Pritzker will temporarily pause the IHSA's winter sports season. We remain optimistic that these new mitigations, coupled with the emergence of a vaccine, will aid in creating participation opportunities in the New Year for IHSA student-athletes in winter, spring, and summer sports."

Non-essential retail facilities will be allowed to operate at 25 percent capacity, while pharmacies and grocery stores may operate at 50 percent capacity.

Personal care services must operate

at the lesser of 25 clients or 25 percent of capacity but can remain open as long as everyone wears a face covering.

Indoor service is banned at bars and restaurants, which will no longer be allowed to operate gaming terminals. The businesses must close by 11 p.m. and table sizes cannot exceed six people.

The tier also closes indoor recreation centers such as theaters, performing arts centers and indoor museums and amusement centers. Outdoor activities are allowed at 25 percent of capacity or less, with outdoor group activities limited to 10 people or less, with face coverings and reservations required.

Manufacturing facilities may remain open with safety and risk guidelines and contact tracing procedures in place.

The state's rolling seven-day average case positivity rate sat at 12.7 percent Tuesday, an increase from Monday but a half point lower than Friday.

Bradford School approves intergovernmental agreements

BRADFORD - The Bradford School board approved two intergovernmental agreements at a Monday evening meeting, which allows Bradford students to participate in Junior High sports at Stark County schools.

Second, the intergovernmental agreement gives graduating Bradford students the choice between attending either Stark County High School or Bureau Valley High School.

The tax levy for the **Bradford School District** is estimated at a total of \$3,031,000. Adoption of the levy will occur at the December board meeting. A levy hearing will be on Monday, Dec. 21, at 7 pm at the Bradford Junior High building.

Discussed was Junior High sports, the Lions' Club breakfast, which will be discussed again in December and the school's Christmas break, with the school returning to session on Jan. 4, 2021.

Snow removal will again be accomplished by the Village of Bradford at the same rate of charges as was last year's rate. An agreement was approved by the school board.

A school safety meeting was held October 28 with Bradford Police Chief Landon Horrie; Veterans' Day was celebrated with a "virtual" assembly; and liability insurance carrier will continue with Bullis and Sundberg, LLC.

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Safely cooking a turkey for the holidays

The main centerpiece of a traditional Thanksgiving celebration may well be the turkey. The honor of carving is often reserved for a special family member. But before carving, the turkey must be cooked, and cooked safely.

Most stores sell turkeys frozen, leaving the task of thawing up to the customer. At Let's Talk Turkey – A Consumer Guide to Safely Roasting a Turkey, the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) recommends thawing in the refrigerator and allowing 24 hours of thaw time for every 4 to 5 pounds of turkey. So a 30-pound turkey can take 3-4 days to thaw. This makes planning ahead very important.

To thaw a frozen turkey, place the turkey in a shallow container in the refrigerator. The container will catch any liquids that may drip from the packaging. When removing the turkey from its packaging, do not wash the turkey - or any poultry before cooking. Washing poultry spreads bacteria around the kitchen and may make you, your family, or

guests sick.

Remember to remove the giblet packages - the heart, liver, and gizzard – from the turkey's cavity before cooking. If using giblets to make gravy, stuffing, or casseroles, check that these dishes reach at least 165°F, just like the turkey.

Cooking a turkey in the oven, requires the temperature to be set no lower than 325°F. The USDA estimates an 8-12 pound turkey will cook between 2 hours and 45 minutes and 3 hours. If your family wants to cook the turkey using a smoker, electric roaster, grill, deep fat fryer, pressure cooker, or slow cooker, visit the USDA's Turkey: Alternate Routes to the Table website for instructions and food safety tips. If carving is not too important to your family, consider cutting the turkey into pieces before cooking. Or spatchcock the turkey by cutting out the backbone with kitchen shears and laying the turkey flat.

Like chicken, turkey needs to reach an internal temperature of 165°F. Check the turkey's tempera-

ture by inserting a food thermometer at three spots: the innermost part of the thigh and wing and the thickest part of the breast.

Stuffing is a popular side dish served with turkey. For food safety reasons, USDA recommends cooking the stuffing separately from the turkey. If your family's preference is to place the stuffing inside the turkey, pack it loosely to allow for proper heating and make sure the stuffing also reaches 165°F.


Leftovers should be put in the refrigerator within two hours from when foods began sitting out at room temperature. Store all leftovers in shallow containers.

Use refrigerated leftovers within 3-4 days. Freeze any leftovers you do not plan to use within that time. When ready to eat leftover turkey, for recipes like turkey noodle soup, use a food thermometer to ensure the meat reaches 165°F when reheating.

GALVA - The Galva School Board unanimously approved a tentative tax levy for the same as last year's \$4.84 per \$100 of assessed valuation.




