Community leaders discuss Stark County economy

For The Prairie News TOULON - The Stark Council for Continuous Improvement (SCCI) held its' second brainstorming meeting Feb. 24, to continue presenting ideas on how to market Stark County. The group's goal is to interest people from outside of Stark County to visit, shop and move here.

SCCI also hopes to have Stark County residents support local businesses by shopping and bringing their business to area proprietors.

"The point of these meetings is to bring the entire Stark County

community together," moderator and Stark County School Superintendent Brett Elliott said.

"Our end goal is this - we know that in any community, the school district is the heart of that community and can affect jobs, our housing market, and so on," Elliott continued. "But really what we're trying to do is look past that and see how the community can also wrap around the school district, because they are interdependent."

Elliott said he believes that if this group can build Stark's communities and make them "tighter" while supporting one

another, the county will change and grow for future generations.

In conjunction with the school district, Architectural Manager Scott Burge of the Farnworth Group, gave a presentation on the new \$15 million high school building project. Burge used architectural concept drawings to show the new building and where it would be located on the Toulon campus.

Tami Rouse, of Career Link, was the featured speaker and gave a presentation concerning the benefits that Career Link can provide to students and anyone furthering their education. She

said Career Link can help people beginning a new job or changing a career. Scholarships are also available through Career Link.

During a brainstorming session, SCCI participants said:

• Wyoming's Mayor Pat Maher said his city is working on creating and establishing new businesses. Wyoming's Economic Director Denny Rewerts said Wyoming has developed a 10year plan for the future, but no details were given.

 Toulon Mayor Larry Hollis said Toulon continues to progress with a downtown beautification project as the city plans to revamp the look of Main Street. Also, he said the city is working with Kyle Howard on economic development to start bringing in new businesses.

Toulon man racks up 8th felony charge in 3 years

For The Prairie News TOULON - A 31-year-old Toulon man was charged last Friday in Stark's Circuit Court with his eighth felony in the past three years. In addition to Stark County, there are charges pending in two

and possibly three other counties. Shawn An-

thony Slightom was charged with aggravated battery of a peace officer for an alleged incident that ocburglary of a shed located on South Valley Road, driving DUI on a revoked or suspended license and in possession of methamphetamine from earlier this year.

Last year Slightom was charged with meth delivery and possession, plus he was charged earlier with driving DUI on a revoked or suspended license, aggravated fleeing of police, possession of meth and possession of a controlled substance - all in Stark County.

In 2018, Slightom was charged in Stark County, where his criminal history dates to 2008, with aggravated battery with the use of a deadly weapon and mob action. both of which were dismissed and also battery that he was found guilty of and sentenced to probation. These charges may be revisited, now.




