

# **Clean up or be fined**

## Wyoming mayor warns of \$100 fines

For The Prairie News WYOMING - After a long discussion with Wyoming Police Chief Mark James about the cleanup of residents' properties, Mayor Pat Maher warned local homeowners could be facing fines.

"It'll be a \$100 fine if the property isn't cleaned up," Maher said.

This came after Maher asked James, "They do realize that they are going to get a ticket if it's not done?" in reference to the 20-plus warnings that have been issued to residents.

Maher continued by saying that if residents don't pay the fine [at city hall], prosecution is possible.

"Not only are they going to get a ticket, they are going to clean it up," he said.

The mayor emphasized that he is tired of seeing properties not cleaned up and that he is serious about getting those properties into acceptable condition.

# Auditor says finances in good shape for Stark Co.

For The Prairie News TOULON - Auditor Ron Hilton told the Stark County Board at its latest meeting that the county's financial position is in good shape as of Nov. 30, 2020 according to the findings from the yearly audit.

Hilton said the county has \$5.9 million in assets and of that, \$4.2 million is in cash, which is up \$1.1 million over the prior year. Liabilities were \$460,000 and the fund balances equaled \$4.2 million.

Stark County had a total revenue in 2020 of \$4.4 million, up \$850,000 from 2019. Total expenditures were \$3.6 million. Hilton said that the board has "done a very good job of building up your fund balances" and "watching your costs."



## Toulon man sentenced to three years in prison

For The Prairie News TOULON - A 31-year-old Toulon man whose jury trial was to begin with jury selection on Wed. May 5th has been sentenced by Circuit Judge James A. Mack to three years in prison on one of numerous felony charges he faces.

Shawn Anthony Slightom, through Stark County Public Defender Robert M. McBride, chose to plead guilty in a negotiated plea deal to delivery of methamphetamine. Slightom could have received a maximum of five years prison without a cap of four years as part of the deal.

Also, all other charges have been dismissed in Stark County with the

exception of felony aggravated battery of a peace officer to which Slightom also pleaded guilty. That charge stemmed from a Feb. 24 incident at the Stark County Jail wherein Slightom pushed and scratched Stark County Deputy Sheriff Dawson Nuding.

Slightom is set for a sentencing hearing in July for that Class 3 felony aggravated battery, which could have brought a maximum of seven years in prison without the four year cap deal. According to Stark County State's Attorney Caroline Borden-Campion, Slightom's sentence in July will run consecutively with the meth conviction, or to be served one after the other.

Slightom receives day-for-day credit while in prison, which cuts the three years to one and a half years, plus he is credited 76 days while incarcerated in Stark County's jail. It is possible that he could only spend approximately 10 months in prison on the meth conviction, if he receives additional time off the sentence.

Slightom still has to face other counties' charges. He is charged with aggravated fleeing of police and driving on a suspended license in Knox County and Peoria County has charged Slightom with aggravated unlawful use of weapons, resisting a peace officer and possession of a firearm without a valid firearms owner's identification card.



#### COVID restrictions shifting to 'bridge phase'

SPRINGFIELD – Today marks the switch to the "bridge phase" of COVID-19 restrictions in Illinois by order of Gov. JB Pritzker.

Various different capacity regulations are changed in the bridge phase. For instance, restaurants can increase from 25 to 30 percent of capacity, as long as people maintain six feet of distance from one another, while offices, personal care facilities and retail service counters can increase from 50 to 60 percent of capacity.

Residents can also now obtain COVID-19 vaccines from their physicians' offices, rather than just designated vaccine sites, as public health officials continue to confront hesitancy within many communities to accept the vaccines.

And, barring any reversal of trends, Phase 5, or full reopening, will come June 11. When the state reaches Phase 5, Pritzker said, virtually all mitigation restrictions will be lifted, although the state will still follow guidelines from the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention regarding wearing masks in large, crowded situations and maintaining safe social distancing.

Pritzker's announcement was triggered late last week after reaching a vaccination benchmark of 55 percent of adults age 16 and over and 80 percent of people age 65 and over having received at least one dose. Daily numbers of new cases and hospitalization rates have also been falling.

# Galva church starting women's Sunday school



# Stark County shining on track

Boys, girls teams enjoy multiple wins, place 2nd at Princeville

For The Prairie News PRINCEVILLE - The Stark County track teams keep racking up event wins this spring.

The latest showing came last Friday at Princeville's new track, during the Princes' first home meet in more than 20 years. The Stark County boys and girls both placed second overall and had numerous highlights.

Lindley Johnston took first in three events, winning the 200 in a personal best 26.76 seconds, the 400 in 1:03.91 and the high jump, clearing 5 feet, 1.75 inches.

Lena Becker was also a multi-event winner, sweeping the 100- and 300-meter hurdles in times of 16.73 seconds and 53.01, respectively.

Ashley Orrick (6:02.35) and Paige Rewerts (6:27.89) swept the top spots in the 1,600. Orrick (2:41.15) was second in the 800 and Rewerts (2:46.66) placed third.
