### Clean up or be fined Wyoming mayor warns of \$100 fines

WYOMING – After a long discussion with Wyoming Police Chief Mark James about the cleanup of residents’ properties, Mayor Pat Maher warned local homeowners could be facing fines.  
“It’ll be a \$100 fine if the property isn’t cleaned up,” Maher said.  
This came after Maher asked James, “They do realize that they are going to get a ticket if it’s not done?” in reference to the

20-plus warnings that have been issued to residents.  
Maher continued by saying that if residents don’t pay the fine [at city hall], prosecution is possible.  
“Not only are they going to get a ticket, they are going to clean it up,” he said.  
The mayor emphasized that he is tired of seeing properties not cleaned up and that he is serious about getting those properties into acceptable condition.

### Auditor says finances in good shape for Stark Co.

TOULON – Auditor Ron Hilton told the Stark County Board at its latest meeting that the county’s financial position is in good shape as of Nov. 30, 2020 according to the findings from the yearly audit.  
Hilton said the county has \$5.9 million in assets and of that, \$4.2 million is in cash, which is up \$1.1 million over

the prior year. Liabilities were \$460,000 and the fund balances equaled \$4.2 million.  
Stark County had a total revenue in 2020 of \$4.4 million, up \$850,000 from 2019. Total expenditures were \$3.6 million. Hilton said that the board has “done a very good job of building up your fund balances” and “watching your costs.”

### Galva’s Super 8 Motel closed indefinitely

GALVA – The Galva Super 8 Motel located at 301 Commercial St. has closed. Galva’s city administrator David Dyer said late Monday that the motel has been closed for about a week.

Dyer said the Galva Police have been making sure the building is secure.  
The Wyndham Super 8 corporate office confirmed Monday night that it is closed and no reservations are being taken.  
The 38-unit motel was first

opened in Galva in 2005 by McClean County Management as a Super 8.  
It was closed one year later and went to a Rock Island bank. The facility was then re-opened about 2007 as Galva Inn and Suites.  
About three years ago, the

owners at the time purchased the Super 8 franchise after the Kewanee Super 8 gave up the franchise to become a Motel 6.  
The fate of the Galva motel is unknown at this time.

# Toulon man sentenced to three years in prison

TOULON – A 31-year-old Toulon man whose jury trial was to begin with jury selection on Wed. May 5th has been sentenced by Circuit Judge James A. Mack to three years in prison on one of numerous felony charges he faces.

Shawn Anthony Slightom, through Stark County Public Defender Robert M. McBride, chose to plead guilty in a negotiated plea deal to delivery of methamphetamine. Slightom could have received a maximum of five years prison without a cap of four years as part of the deal.

Also, all other charges have been dismissed in Stark County with the

exception of felony aggravated battery of a peace officer to which Slightom also pleaded guilty. That charge stemmed from a Feb. 24 incident at the Stark County Jail wherein Slightom pushed and scratched Stark County Deputy Sheriff Dawson Nuding.

Slightom is set for a sentencing hearing in July for that Class 3 felony aggravated battery, which could have brought a maximum of seven years in prison without the four year cap deal. According to Stark County State's Attorney Caroline Borden-Campion, Slightom's sentence in July will run consecutively with the meth conviction, or to be served one after the other.

Slightom receives day-for-day credit while in prison, which cuts the three years to one and a half years, plus he is credited 76 days while incarcerated in Stark County's jail. It is possible that he could only spend approximately 10 months in prison on the meth conviction, if he receives additional time off the sentence.

Slightom still has to face other counties' charges. He is charged with aggravated fleeing of police and driving on a suspended license in Knox County and Peoria County has charged Slightom with aggravated unlawful use of weapons, resisting a peace officer and possession of a firearm without a valid firearms owner's identification card.

ported that the Wyoming Police Department had 25 calls, 7 assists, and 13 traffic stops. Additionally, the department's Chevy Tahoe has broken down again and needs repairing and that replacing it with a newer vehicle is in the works.

City attorney Michael Evans updated the city council about:

- The sale of city property to Mid-Century;
- A review of right-of-way fees that he continues to work on the ordinance concerning them;
- A lien on the old Wyoming

Locker property that is in place to pay for the cost of cleaning the property of rubble, trash, etc.

• Two properties that were the subject of past cleanup efforts at 408 N. Main St. and 119 E. Williams St.

At the beginning of Monday's council meeting, Jim Mercer was sworn into office to fill Ryan Breese's Ward 2 position.

Economic Development Advisor Denny Rewerts reported that work has begun on establishing a new subdivision in the southwest portion of the city, just south of Pub-91. Rewerts said that if the subdivision

comes to fruition, it would be part of the TIF-2 district.

City superintendent Joe Kinsella said the locker property has been cleaned up and that a water leak at Pub-91 is repaired. Water and Sewer manager Greg McCauley reported progress on bids to replace the reverse-osmosis membrane filters.

Maher said the annual budget is due by July 31; a new storage building was ordered on April 27; and that the city will receive an estimated \$157,276 in two payments over two years from the American Rescue Plan.

said he is waiting for a better quality patch mix from Henry County to begin filling potholes around the county. He will submit the Motor Fuel tax aggregate and sealcoating bid package plus advertise the bid. A mowing bid was awarded to Forstrom's, which was the sole bidder for the job.

Giffin discussed the proposed new county highway building and said that the Highway Department would like to obtain 200 feet of property

north of its property from the City of Toulon for the purpose of storing material stockpiles.

County Treasurer Paula Leezer said "nothing major" stood out on the county's budget. She reported that real estate taxes were sent out April 29 and that people were paying them immediately, which continues steadily. So far, as of a few days ago, taxes paid equaled \$762,000-plus, with the June 1 due date approaching. Approximately \$100,000 per day is deposited for

real estate taxes, Leezer said.

Also, at the county board meeting Tuesday, the board of supervisors approved: Robert Joe Winans to fill the LaFayette Fire Department board vacancy; John Leezer as a member of the Farmland Review board; and Phil Shaner's appointment to the Board of Review. In addition, the supervisors approved a resolution to sell a Goshen Township - Village of LaFayette property to Alvah McNaught for \$827, minus \$45 that he overpaid.

### COVID restrictions shifting to 'bridge phase'

SPRINGFIELD – Today marks the switch to the “bridge phase” of COVID-19 restrictions in Illinois by order of Gov. JB Pritzker.

Various different capacity regulations are changed in the bridge phase. For instance, restaurants can increase from 25 to 30 percent of capacity, as long as people maintain six feet of distance from one another, while offices, personal care facilities and retail service counters can increase from 50 to 60 percent of capacity.

Residents can also now obtain COVID-19 vaccines from their physicians' offices, rather than just designated vaccine sites, as public health officials continue to confront hesitancy within many communities to accept the vaccines.

And, barring any reversal of trends, Phase 5, or full reopening, will come June 11. When the state reaches Phase 5, Pritzker said, virtually all mitigation restrictions will be lifted, although the state will still follow guidelines from the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention regarding wearing masks in large, crowded situations and maintaining safe social distancing.

Pritzker's announcement was triggered late last week after reaching a vaccination benchmark of 55 percent of adults age 16 and over and 80 percent of people age 65 and over having received at least one dose. Daily numbers of new cases and hospitalization rates have also been falling.

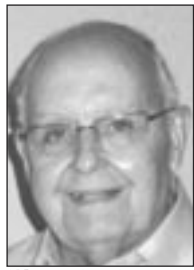

## Stark County shining on track

Boys, girls teams enjoy multiple wins, place 2nd at Princeville

PRINCEVILLE – The Stark County track teams keep racking up event wins this spring.

The latest showing came last Friday at Princeville's new track, during the Princes' first home meet in more than 20 years. The Stark County boys and girls both placed second overall and had numerous highlights.

Lindley Johnston took first in three events, winning the 200 in a personal best 26.76 seconds, the 400 in 1:03.91 and the high jump, clearing 5 feet, 1.75 inches.

Lena Becker was also a multi-event winner, sweeping the 100- and 300-meter hurdles in times of 16.73 seconds and 53.01, respectively.

Ashley Orrick (6:02.35) and Paige Rewerts (6:27.89) swept the top spots in the 1,600. Orrick (2:41.15) was second in the 800 and Rewerts (2:46.66) placed third.

Blake Orwig and Keagan Newton led the SC boys. Orwig won the shot put with a throw of 42 feet and hurled the discus 130-3 to win easily.

Newton also won two events, taking the triple jump with a leap of 39-6 and the 300 hurdles in 46.7.

Caden Daum won the 3,200 in a season-best 12:00.81, Colby Carroll topped the long jump by soaring a personal-best 19-8.5 and the Rebels 4x800 relay of Carroll, Daum, Jared Prindiville and Payton Stahl won in 9:46.56.

Galva's Caden Rachel won the 110 hurdles in

23.68 and the Wildcats boys had two second-place finishes: Jaxson Meier (12.98) with a PR in the 100 and Jacob Pierce (36-0.25) in the shot put.

The Galva girls won a pair of relays, taking the 4x200 in 2:05.74 and the 4x400 in 5:11.64. The 4x200 consisted of Lexi Stone, Kali Yelm, Ava Anderson and Ava Strom, while the 4x400 was made up of Yelm, Olivia Jones, Strom and Sarah Kaiser.

Placing second for Galva was Anderson (14.39) in the 100, the girls 4x100 relay (57.49), Anderson (4-1.5) in the high jump, Kaiser (12-6) in the long jump and Strom (28-7) with a personal record in the triple jump.

Princeville's Grant Hunt won four events (100, 200, 400 and high jump) for the winning boys team and Denver Hoerr won two (800, 1,600) and anchored a winning 4x400 relay.

### Stark County Baseball

Stark County (1-6) out-hit Bureau Valley 7-4 Tuesday on the road, but lost the game 11-1, as Rebels pitchers yielded 10 walks.

Jacob Best and Timothy Giesenhagen had two hits apiece for Stark County and Daniel Kiser doubled. Giesenhagen drove in Stark County's lone run.

"Rebel baseball is a very young team. We have
