School cost rises

New Stark Co. school price tag up \$1 million

WYOMING – There was bad news Monday evening for the Stark County School Board at its monthly meeting when the school's engineer, Farnsworth Group, and construction manager, CORE, gave a 50-minute school renovation update.

"Our goal was \$15 million and now we're over \$16 million," CORE representative Caleb Wyss said in regards to the cost of a new school.

Market prices for oil-based products and steel required for the new school's construction have increased from February through April from 13 to 20 percent, Wyss said.

"In the last three weeks, prices have escalated even more," Wyss added. "There's a lot of uncertainty in the market."

Wyss said soil borings were

done and showed the soil at the school site is soft. That requires longer and larger foundation supports, which increases construction costs, as well.

School Superintendent Brett Elliott, in an email, said, "We have several options to consider; using stimulus funds toward the [\$1 million] deficit in lieu of pursuing a new gym; making cuts where needed; [and thirdly] use part of the \$5 million in working cash that we can access."

Elliott also emailed, "Once we receive solid numbers from the Health Life Safety survey on the Wyoming Sports Complex, and from CORE regarding bid costs, we can better decide which direction we want to pursue."

The latter email was in regards to building a new gymnasium at the Toulon campus, which was

Galva OKs 8-man football

GALVA – The Galva School Board unanimously approved starting eight-man football this fall in a vote at Monday's meeting.

Galva's eight-man team will reportedly play five home games and four away games vs. teams in the southern region. After one year, Galva will move into the northern region, so games will be closer.

The move to eight-man football was precipitated by Galva opting not to extend a cooperative agreement with Mid-County, which now consists of ROWVA and Williamsfield. The Illinois 8 Man Football Association lists 28 members on its website, including Amboy, Lowpoint-Washburn, West Central, Peoria Heights and North Fulton.

Galva Athletic Director Kurtis Smyth said he will begin hiring officials and looking at equipment immediately. Smyth said 20 students have expressed interest in eight-man football.

"We are pretty excited," said Andrew Larson, a board member.

It was noted that Galva should consider upgrading its restrooms for five home games this fall.

ditional \$2.8 million. The new gymnasium would be in addition to the present gymnasium - not a replacement.

Farnsworth and CORE projected a completion

date of December 2022 for the new school construction, if the project isn't postponed until the materials market settles.

In other action, the board approved a quote for \$24,085 from Interstate Fence to replace the

fencing at the Wyoming football stadium. Also approved was an annual increase of student breakfast/lunch costs for fiscal year 2022 of 10 cents. Breakfast will be K-12: \$1.30; lunch K-5: \$2.50; lunch 6-8: \$2.75; and lunch 9-12: \$3.00.

The board approved:

- the letting of bids for bread, milk, Rebel Reporter, and trash pick-up;
- the tentative amended budget proposed for fiscal year 2021;
- the board retreat for July 19; and several per-

sonnel changes.

After Executive Session the board: hired Terrie Patterson as head custodian with a pay raise; hired Mike Bunch as technology director; hired Amy Toothaker as third grade teacher; accepted the retirement of Dale Heinold as technology director and the resignations of Theresa Rediger as high school clerical, Victoria Harmon as art teacher, Brittany Venson as speech coach and Sarah Steighorst as Junior High cheer sponsor.

Continued from Page 1 Smyth said he checked with several area districts about cooping in football, but heard reluctance since that move would bump those schools up a class. And Smyth said several schools indicated they might also be going to an eight-man team in the near future.

"I am very excited and this will bring excitement to the community," board member Mike Clucas said. He also thanked the administration for their work on behalf of the football program.

Golf will be approved at a future meeting by the board, but current plans are for Galva to field their own team, which would play at The Dunes instead of Oak Run.

School fees will remain

the same for the 2021-22 school year.

The board approved summer sports camps.

And while the last day of the regular school year is Tuesday, May 25, some students may be able to take classes in June.

Thanks to a grant, both the elementary and juniorsenior high school will offer in-person classes in June for those who need to make up work. High school students can take a class they failed, though Superintendent Jerry Becker said a problem is that some failed more than one class. Parents may enroll students and the district will also recommend students.



Toulon Council approves sidewalk project

TOULON – At the May 12 Toulon City council meeting, Mayor Larry Hollis appointed Miller, Hall and Triggs [of Peoria] as city attorney with Kathlene Carter as their representative; The Farnsworth Group as city engineer; water and sewer superintendent will be split between Josh Allen and Jake Streitmatter; deputy city clerk is Teresa Macy; Chief of Police Gary Bent; TIF administrator is Jacob and Klein; and TIF assistant is Teresa Macy.

Hollis also appointed Ryan Kelly as Ward Three Alderman for a twoyear term. Elected officials took their oath of office: Hollis as mayor; Connie Jacobson and Ryan Kelly as aldermen; Valerie Wagher as city treasurer; and Barb Cantwell as city

Representatives of the Stark

County Historical Society, Sam Rice and Jim Winslow, spoke with the council concerning a new sidewalk, gutters and curbing in front of the Society's West Jefferson St. properties. Rice said the entire sidewalk is cracked and broken.

"The Society has put up a new building and you might as well have a good sidewalk," Rice said.

In addition, Rice pointed out that the high point of the street is in front of the new building and that the building company recommended a new gutter be installed to keep water out of the building and off the property. Rice said the present gutter is broken and needs to be replaced.

Ultimately, the city decided to pay for the entire sidewalk project at the Historical Society property.

The city continues to wait on permits in regards to the proposed sanitary sewer system lift stations and the uptown sidewalk project.

Hollis reported that he had received word from Kyle Howard that he is unable to fulfill the city's role as economic developer. Howard is refunding the city the fees that he collected to perform economic development. The position is currently vacant.

Two bids were received for the former police department truck that was advertised for sale. Ron Rice, of Victoria, bid \$7,613 for the 2006 Dodge pickup and his bid was approved for the sale.

The concrete for the ball diamond concession stand has been poured. Plumbing and electrical work remains to be completed. Hollis said that the concession stand should be built and finished for approximately \$10,000. The council made a motion and approved the cost to be no more than \$10,000.

Stark County boys 2nd at Aledo

Carroll, Orwig, Newton lead strong effort for Rebels track team

Keagan Newton, the Stark
County boys track team
placed second overall at a
Lincoln Trail Conference
meet on May 11.

Stark County's 79 points was second to host Mercer County's 119. The SC girls were fifth.

Carroll won the 200 meters in 24.37 seconds and was also first in the 300 hurdles (45.12). Both were personal records. Carroll also placed third in long jump, with a leap of 18 feet, 4 inches.

Orwig dominated the throwing events, winning in shot put with a toss of 42-3 and in discus with a PR throw of 140-7.

Newton also scored well for the Rebels, winning the triple jump (40-5.5), while placing second in the high jump (5-8), second in the 300 hurdles in a personal best 45.86 and second in the 110 hurdles (18.72) with another PR.

Payton Stahl was second

in the 800 in 2:18.14 and took fourth in the 400 in a personal best 59.97. The SC boys had third-place relays in the 4x400 (4:03.09) and 4x800 (9:56.87).

Lena Becker was the top girls finisher, winning the 100 hurdles in 16.76 and the 300 hurdles in 51.95.

Riley Menssen was second in high jump after clearing 5 feet and Emily Norsworthy was second in the 100 with a personal best of 13.52 seconds.

Ashley Orrick was third in the 800 (2:37.97) and 1,600 (5:47.22).

Galva was at Princeville on May 11 and saw the Princes boys place first.

Galva's girls 4x400 relay of Olivia Jones, Sarah Kaiser, Ava Strom and Lexi Stone was first in a time of 5:25.52. Ava Anderson was also fourth in the 100 (14.38) for Galva.

Jacob Pierce was top Galva boys finisher, placing third in shot put (36-6.5) and fourth in discus at 85-7.5. Both throws were personal bests. Cal Clucas was fourth in the 1,600 (5:35.18) and second in the

Looking to the June 11 Class 1A Sectional at Wethersfield, Newton is tops in the 110 hurdles, while Carroll is first in 300 hurdles and Orwig is the leader in discus.

The nightcap was a different story, as the Rebels *Continued on Page 6*


