Stark County board passes 5 measures

TOULON – The Stark County board of supervisors approved five resolutions at their monthly meeting Tuesday evening, plus they heard reports from the county highway department, county finances and Sheriff’s office.

Approved was a payment of \$26,750 by Stark County to the University of Illinois Extension office to provide services to “help families, businesses and communities solve problems and learn new skills.” This is an annual payment to the extension to provide those services for citizens of the county.

The supervisors approved a resolution appointing Steve Jackson to the Stark County Board of Review for a period of one year, June 8 to June 8, 2022; two resolutions reappointing Dr. Remi Satkauskas and Claudia Plumer to the Stark County Health Board; and finally a resolution for \$760,000 of Motor Fuel Tax funds of Stark’s Highway Department for the purpose of maintaining streets and highways in the county.

County Engineer Judd Giffin highlighted several activities that the highway department has performed during the month of May.

Back to normal

COVID capacity restrictions lifted today

SPRINGFIELD – The state’s COVID-19 metrics continued to improve ahead of Friday’s planned statewide reopening.

Gov. JB Pritzker’s office has confirmed that Phase 5 will begin Friday, essentially lifting all COVID-19 capacity restrictions in place for over one year. That means businesses, large-scale events, conventions, amusement parks and seated-spectator venues can all return to full capacity beginning Friday.

That announcement came as the state’s COVID-19 case positivity rate – a disease spread indicator that has been widely used to determine what level of restrictions would be in place throughout the pandemic – continued to plummet, hitting a new low of 1.1 percent Monday.


That’s far from the recent 4.4 percent peak from April 12 and well below its 13.2 percent height since June 2020, when testing became more widespread.

“After a tremendously challenging year, Illinois has now reached a defining moment in our efforts to defeat COVID-19,” Pritzker said. “Thanks to the hard work of residents across the state, Illinois will soon resume life as we knew it before – returning to events, gatherings, and a fully reopened economy, with some of the safety guidelines we’ve adopted still in place.”

While businesses will still be allowed to have stricter masking and social distancing policies than the state, the new guidance follows the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommendation that face coverings are not needed indoors for vaccinated

individuals.

Masks are still “recommended” for unvaccinated individuals, according to the governor’s office.

Masks will still be required for people traveling

on public transportation, in congregate settings, in health care settings, as well as in schools, day cares and educational institutions, according to the governor’s office.

“The vaccine is giving us

our freedoms back and allowing us to move to Phase 5. Let’s keep the vaccination momentum going so we can put this pandemic in the rearview mirror and not look back,” Illinois Department of Public Health Director Dr. Ngozi Ezike said

According to IDPH, more than 11.6 million vaccine doses have been administered in the state, with 50.3 percent of the state’s aged-12-and-older population having been fully vaccinated. About 60 percent of those 12 and older have received at least one dose, while that

number increases to 62.5 percent for those 18 and older and 82 percent for those 65 and over.

About 38,975 vaccines were administered as of Monday, meaning the pace has slowed substantially. That vaccination number was over 130,000 in mid-April.

But as the vaccination pace has slowed, so have the number of new COVID-19 cases recorded and the number of people hospitalized for the disease. For 12 straight days, there have been fewer than 1,000 new cases reported each day.

Giffin said that he continues to work with the Illinois Department of Transportation concerning use of funds and closing out of past projects.

The highway department opened and awarded township sealcoat bids to pavement maintenance and they have tilled up and graded two miles of County Highway 24, plus approximately one mile of Duncan Road.

Giffin reported that a hole on the eastbound lane

of the North Valley Bridge has been temporarily repaired with the installation of a metal plate, with a permanent repair scheduled in the near future. Also, filling of potholes with aggregate has commenced on the county’s highways.

Finally, the old cold storage building has been prepared to move it to a new site north of the salt storage hoop building.

County treasurer Paula Leezer reported that the county’s finances “are doing ok” and that as of June 8, the county has collected \$7,783,000 in taxes with \$320,000 being collected with the online tax payments service.

Stark County Sheriff’s Office Chief Deputy Chuck Demetreeon informed the board that Stark County is below other surrounding counties in its pay for deputy sheriffs and that Stark County loses deputies to these counties, which pay more in base salaries and benefit packages.

The county board police committee is to research this situation to see if a resolution is possible for pay increases to retain deputy sheriffs and dispatchers employed by Stark County, plus the hiring of new personnel.

Johnston, Becker shine at sectional

Lindley Johnston and Lena Becker put together dominating sectional performances last week for the Stark County track team.

Due to a COVID-related format change for Thursday's Class 1A state meet, there are no preliminaries. Instead, sectional times determine heat assignments.

With that in mind, Coach Clint Terwilliger had clear goals for his standout pair at last Thursday's Knoxville Class 1A sectional.

"We said going over, with the way the state was running things, you have to run your best time," Terwilliger said. "Lena and Lindley both did that."

Both runners set personal records in their events and broke school records. Johnston set PRs in winning the 200 (26.69 seconds) and 400 (59.85, also a school record) and won the high jump by clearing 5 feet, 3.75 inches.

Becker had a PR and broke her school record in the 100 hurdles (15.84) and won the 300 hurdles

(50.44).

"For both Lena and Lindley, they've had some competition, but they haven't really had anyone push them hard," Terwilliger said. "They will both get in really good races [at state] and I think they have their best times ahead of them."

Going into state, Johnston was seeded third in high jump, fifth in the 400 and 14th in the 200. Becker is fifth in the 100 hurdles and 18th in 300.

As an added bonus, senior Riley Menssen also qualified for state in high jump by clearing 4-11.75. Menssen was also a state qualifier as a sophomore.

The Lady Rebels tied for third in the sectional team standings with 62 points, behind Farmington (66) and Knoxville (64).

Other scorers for SC were: Emily Norsworthy (4th in 100, PR of 13.37) and Ashley Orrick (5th in 1,600, PR of 5:40.7).

Ava Strom was top Galva finisher, placing fourth in triple jump (30-9).

The Stark County boys compete today in the Wethersfield Class 1A sec-

tional. Field events start at 3 p.m., running at 4.

Blake Orwig is seeded first in shot put and discus for the Rebels and Keagan Newton is first in the triple jump and 110 and 300 hurdles and fourth in high jump. Colby Carroll ranks second in the 300 hurdles, third in the 400, fourth in long jump and fifth in the 200 and triple jump.

The Rebels also have the No. 3 4x400 relay and No. 2 4x800 heading into the sectional.
