Galva weighing offer to close R.R. crossing

GALVA – The City Council is strongly considering an offer of \$165,000 from Burlington Northern-Santa Fe to close a railroad crossing east of town near the Galva Catholic Cemetery.

City Administrator David Dyer said about \$15,000 would be used to close the crossing and remaining money would be used for Galva streets. The latest offer was \$100,000 more than the railroad offered a few years ago.

The council tabled a decision on the crossing until they can sort through the use of 20 acres of city-owned land located on the north side of the tracks. That land is rented to Jeff Kaiser for \$363 per acre as farm ground. Kaiser might be willing to pay less in rent if he has to take a longer route to reach the farmground, according to Mayor Rich Volkert.

It was stated that solar panels

could be put on the 20 acres and it was also noted that a cannabis plant had looked at the property.

In other news, Galva has been consulting with PGAV about the downtown TIF district, which expires Dec. 31. PGAV has worked with Galva on its downtown TIF since 1986 and is consulting on a new TIF agreement, the boundaries of which will most likely change.

The council discussed which buildings could go in a new TIF district. Buildings mentioned include the old REA lot, former Bob Evans building and others.

Police Chief Kraig Townsend said Sergeant Jerrod Hedden has resigned as a full-time officer. Townsend said Ralph Brown, the school officer, is filling in this summer so they won't be in real need until school starts in August.

Officer James Robertson has been promoted to Sergeant. Second ward alderman Jim

Townsend said he has talked to the owner.

Townsend also said he checked the 110 properties that were in violation sev-

eral months ago for junk or unlicensed vehicles. He said there were 27 properties that still had a violation. He gave each of those until June 30.

Anderson said he wants to see a plan to market 23 lots remaining in Galva's two subdivisons, which sell for \$9,400 per acre.
