Artist Shawn Hall paints the town

For The Prairie News TOULON - Local Toulon artist Shawn Hall recently completed his second patriotic mural in Toulon at the Newsroom/Bistro building in time for the Fourth of July Weekend.

Hall's latest mural depicts Ben Franklin, John Adams and Thomas Jefferson writing the Declaration of Independence.

Hall plans to paint two more patriotic scenes next to the one just completed with the Statue of Liberty and the Constitution themes. Hall's first mural was painted at Nelson's Auto Sales for the Memorial Day Weekend and depicts a soldier carrying a wounded comrade out of a battle.

Recently, the 49-year-old Hall decided to pursue his dream of being an artist and quit his regular welding occupation.

"Welding is a very labor filled job, but mostly because of health reasons and the art-bug was just too much to resist anymore," Hall said.

As to the cost of having a mural painted, Hall said, "It's really hard to tell. One like the one I'm doing now – if I wasn't donating my time and getting donations for the paint and material – you would be looking at somewhere in the \$1,200 to \$1,500 range."

Stark Co. may join Peoria Co. for 911

For The Prairie News TOULON – According to Stark County Sheriff's Chief Deputy Chuck Demetreon, Stark County may finally be getting Enhanced 911 with the help of Peoria County. Peoria County has indicated that it will accept Stark County.

Sheriff Steven Sloan spoke with Peoria County representatives on a conference call on Wednesday, July 14. According to Sheriff Steven Sloan, the Stark County E911 cooperative with Peoria County is in the planning process, but it will take a couple of months before anything is known..

Stark County has attempted for years to obtain E911 without much success. In the past, other counties have declined to aid Stark in partnering on their E911 boards and systems mainly because of the cost that would be incurred by other counties.

The 911 development was the major news at Tuesday's meeting of the Stark County Board of Supervisors.

In other business, the board also approved a contract ex-





For The Prairie News TOULON - Nelson Auto Sales has been supplying quality vehicles to the local area for 35-plus years, according to Zack Nelson. And thanks to modern technology, Nelson's can now also sell to customers across the United States.

"With the internet, it has really helped us average 20 car sales per month," Nelson said. "It's probably half and half - local to outside buyers. I've sold cars all over the states, like Texas and Florida. They come to us for a car because there is a shortage of cars due to COVID."

Nelson said the pandemic has

created more demand for used vehicles and has driven up prices since new vehicles are not being produced in the same volume as normal.

"People come to us from other states because nobody has that many cars for sale," Nelson said. "The word is that it'll be a couple of years before things return to normal."

Nelson's buys from a variety of sources to stock their inventory.

"I buy them online from different area auctions at Morton and the Quad Cities," Nelson said.

Nelson said he only lets vehicles sit on the lot for about 100 days.

"That keeps our inventory fresh," he said.

When possible, Nelson tries to get local cars for inventory because he knows the history of them if they've been properly maintained, etc.

Customers can special order vehicles from Nelson's, as well. "I can get the color, make, model, down to the trim levels a customer wants," Zack said.

Who makes up Nelson Auto Sales? At the top is Ivan Nelson and his wife Marlene, the office manager. Zack Nelson and Jan Gage sell vehicles. Jeff Nelson runs the repair shop with mechanics Gary Krause and James Sellers. And Mike Steelman handles oil changes, brake work and detailing.

oulon businesses rebound from COV

TOULON - As the COVID pandemic begins to fade somewhat, Toulon businesses are emerging from last year's restrictions with a different perspective.

State Bank of Toulon President Doug Parrott said, "Coming out of COVID, I would say the state of Toulon businesses are looking up. Restaurants are back open and they seem to be busy. The ag community - farmers and agri-businesses and such are doing much better - prices are higher and local crops are probably looking the best in the state."

Parrott says the bank's growth is

unprecedented in the past 18 months because of stimulus payments, Paycheck Protection lans and other COVID payments.

ryout business, it was much, much better last year. On Friday nights, we just couldn't keep up with the orders, everything was busy-busy. Now that everything has opened back up, this year's ordering has gone back to normal. There are still people who are a little leery of coming in [to dine] – the older people.

"Last year when we were closed down for several months that really hurt breakfast and lunch for people who came in regularly. But, now that things have opened back up, people feel that they can go out again."

Connie said last year's carryout business made up for a lack of dinein customers.
