Remodeled Oak Run station to be unveiled

DAHINDA – A long-planned open house for the expanded, remodeled Oak Run Fire Station will be held Saturday, July 10.

After the Oak Run Station finished its remodel and expansion, an open house was set to take place in 2020. Due to COVID-19 restrictions, the event was postponed and has been rescheduled.

Now that the Williamsfield Fire Protection District has been given the opportunity, they will soon be displaying their recent upgrades and updates to the fire station, including a new fire/medical skid unit purchased with a \$5,000 grant from Ameren Illinois.

The open house will be Saturday from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. at Oak Run Station, 1497 Knox Rd. 1725 N. in Dahinda, or just east of the Oak



Run Golf Course. The event will include a dedication ceremony at 11 a.m. followed by a light lunch. Members of the community are welcome to come see the recent building upgrades.

"We're looking forward to letting the public in here to see what we did and what their tax dollars

got spent on," said Mary Bush, wife to Assistant Fire Chief Bruce Bush.

Since the Oak Run Community began developing around 30 years ago, the population has grown rapidly. There are currently more than 500 homes at Oak Run, with an average of 15 new homes built per year. Approximately half of these homes are vacation second homes and half are occupied by full-time residents, many of the latter being retirees. As such, the fire department has tried to serve what it sees as a growing need for a more adept emergency response program in Oak Run. The goal of the new station remodel and expansion was to help meet this need.

With added space inside the building, emergencies can be re-

sponded to more efficiently, according to Bruce Bush.

He said the expansion also enables the district to store more equipment and provides a multi-purpose room that can be used for monthly meetings, hosting monthly training session and community events.

Currently, the Oak Run Fire Station currently includes a fire engine, a first responder vehicle, a brush truck for grass fires and a recently acquired side-by-side, featuring the new fire/medical skid unit purchased with the grant from Ameren.

The unit is comprised of a water tank, a motor and

pump for water discharge and a platform to attach a basket stretcher. This will assist firefighters in performing lifesaving tasks with greater ease, especially in difficult terrain.

Bruce Bush said that in the past, firefighters had to carry hand tools into remote areas.

The Williamsfield Fire Protection District is also looking for volunteers to help meet the emergency-response needs of the area. Any potential volunteers are encouraged to attend

the upcoming open house or to contact the district.

Oak Run, (309) 879-2100, has one of three stations in the Williamsfield Fire Protection District.

The others are in Williamsfield, (309) 639-4353, and Dahinda, (309) 639-4444.

“We’re looking forward to being able to do lots of networking. We’re [also] looking to pick up a few more volunteers. That would be huge for us,” Mary Bush said.



Of ducks, postal woes, Anaconda & Mo. gas

All the honking about ducks and geese in Elmwood lately has been interesting, though perhaps misguided. If you missed the news, somebody in town had ducks in their fenced yard. But city ordinances say ducks and geese are illegal to possess in city limits. So are chickens, as you may have read previously in this space.

Anyway, when the powers that be in City Hall decided to start enforcing the poultry ordinance, the ducks had to go. This set off quite a Facebook discussion.

While I understand people are upset, griping on Facebook will generally accomplish very little, except maybe getting your posts deleted.

The issue here is the ordinance. Until something changes, poultry is illegal in Elmwood. Lawbreakers don't have much of a leg to stand on. Rule of law is a backbone of our society.

Now a cynic might argue there are plenty of other ordinances in the Elmwood code that seldom get enforced. In fact, I was going to write a column about them, but there's not enough hours before deadline to read the entire voluminous code (which stipulates, among thousands of other

things, that it is illegal to litter in town out of an aircraft).

But even a brief read of Elmwood's code (posted on the city website) is fascinating. For instance, I didn't know all bicycles had to be registered with the city clerk and must pass a safety test. Or that, if aldermen so choose, all tax funds for West Park Playground shall be turned over to a five-person board that includes four citizens. And how about this doozy: "No person shall, upon any City street, fly any kite or play any game of ball or engage in any amusement or practice having a tendency to injure or annoy any person passing in the streets or on the sidewalks."

Sure, the code could use some cleaning up. The larger point here is that some believe a quacking duck is more of a nuisance than the many other noisy nuisances that regularly go unpoliced.

As for the future of the poultry ordinance, that issue is still before the council. If you truly have strong feelings, skip the Facebook posts and attend a council meeting.

Speaking of Elmwood, a reader recently informed me we are "ignoring" the most important issue in town: When will the Post Office re-open? Well, work is progressing on the Horeb Lodge building that houses the post office and Uptown Cafe. According to lodge member

Mit Beres, general work should be done by Aug. 13 and additional work to ready the post office and cafe should be done by early September. "We're looking at the day after Labor Day for people walking in the doors," Beres said. ... Quiet Lotto winners stun me. If I won \$950,000, like some lucky person did in Princeville last Friday, I'd announce my win by buying a case of Jim Beam whiskey. Next thing I'd do would be to pour free shots as long as the hooch lasted - right here at TWP HQ. Might even light cigars with \$1 bills. ... Curse Texas Hold'em. How is Hold'em the game that made so many poker classics obsolete? What about 7-27 or Anaconda, or Night Baseball or Low Hole or Guts or Seven-Card Stud. All anybody wants to play is Hold'em. Shame.

Parting shot: Good news! Illinois is top 10 among U.S. states in something: 10th highest price per gallon of regular gas, according to AAA, which recently averaged the Prairie State rate at 3.363 per gallon. California (\$4.303) was most expensive and Mississippi (\$2.752) was cheapest. Worth noting is that if you plan a trip to Missouri (\$2.807), Iowa (\$2.947), Wisconsin (\$2.972) or Indiana (\$3.099) any time soon, wait to fill up once you cross the border.

The ag politics of being agriculturally apolitical

It's a widely held belief that if you want to get ahead in farm group politics, you can't be political. Well, not overtly political, anyway. Quietly, sure; loud and you're outa' here.

For example, according to OpenSecrets.org, the best tracker of campaign cash in American politics, the nation's largest, richest farm group, the American Farm Bureau Federation (AFBF), contributed a stunningly puny \$6,932 to all federal candidates in the 2020 general election.

The year before, however, AFBF, spent a staggering \$3,282,414 for its 18 lobbyists to plant, cultivate, and harvest its politically-conservative/subsidy-liberal ag policies on Capitol Hill.

It's similar in the agricultural academy; Land Grant University officials rarely, if ever, comment on state or national politics. The overriding public view is that university farm and ranch experts should focus on efficiency and profits, not politics and politicians.

But that's an impossibly fine line to walk. Land Grant Universities, after all, were born through politics, the Morrill Act in 1862, and continue to receive large portions of their funding via the increasingly partisan, federal and state political process. As such, most Land Grant administrators are as adept at realpolitik as they are in political science and animal science.

Still, pity the ag professor who possesses the poor judgment – not to mention nerve – to go public about the use or misuse of public money at the Big U. Just ask Mark Rasmussen, the just-retired director at the Leopold Center for Sustainable Agriculture at Iowa State University.

In public remarks to the Iowa Farmers Union's "Lunch & Learn" webinar series June 24, Rasmussen rattled some of Iowa's political and ag leaders by wondering if a new state initiative to sequester carbon was "just another subsidy scheme" rather than a serious attempt to address climate change.

His proof? Gov. Kim Reynolds' newly named carbon sequestration panel "has no environmental-group representation," reported the Iowa Capital Dispatch, June 26, "but plenty of ag-group members," including one of the gov's biggest Big Ag campaign contributors.

And that was just part of what he said; throughout much of his 16-slide presentation, Rasmussen questioned heaps of ag theology. For example, he asked the group if climate change is at least partial proof that our mission "to feed the planet" is, in fact, "degrading the planet."

Shortly thereafter, Rasmussen crossed the metaphorical Rubicon of farm politics: he dished dirt – literally – on ethanol. His entire quote, again, courtesy of the Iowa Capital Dispatch, was pure political heresy to Big Ag.

"The other one that's upset people is I like to use this term 'putting dirt in your gas tank' with regards to the ethanol industry. They [ethanol promoters] never in their propaganda

mention the impact that juicing up the corn market had on soil erosion in bringing highly erodible land into production and taking it out of growing grass or other perennials. So ethanol to me is not as green as they like to say it is, if you really look at the life cycle analysis, and include soil in that equation."

Most economists would say that's sound science; most ag economists, however, wouldn't touch that side of ethanol with a 10-foot barn broom.

But sound science was, in fact, behind the 1987 founding of the Leopold Center and the state's steady funding of its work. Its goals were simple and direct: "To identify and develop new ways to farm profitably while conserving natural resources as well as reducing negative environmental and social impacts."

The state abandoned Leopold, though. In an overtly political move, the Iowa legislature stripped it of state funding in 2017 and since then, explains Rasmussen in a telephone interview, Leopold has operated on crumbs, or about 10 percent of its pre-2017 budget.

Now, with Rasmussen's June 30 retirement, the Center loses its campus office space and its full-time staff. In short, it's a goner; both a child of and a victim to agriculture's parochial politics.

But no one really wants to talk about it because we don't do politics in agriculture. At least not out loud.

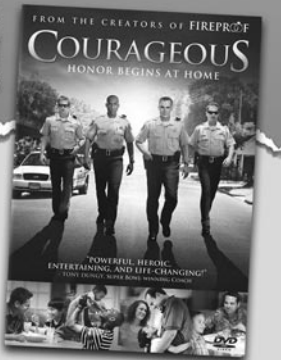

stop in North Carolina for a national Troutman family reunion on Oct. 9. After some time to meet relatives, it's off to Texas, which Troutman plans to reach by January to enjoy warm weather. Once winter passes, Troutman said he plans to walk the last 1,200 miles home by July 10, 2022.

But Troutman is well aware those plans could change.

Troutman's 700-mile walk in 2014 in memory of his late wife, Peggy, raised \$70,000 for Troutman Park in Princeville. In 2015, he walked from

Princeville to Memphis, Tenn., and raised over \$10,000 for St. Jude.

But four years ago on a walk to Texas, Troutman was hit by a pickup truck. The collision, in broad daylight, wrecked the three-wheel buggy he walks behind and injured his knee.

"I was six feet off the road standing dead still. [The driver] claimed he had dropped a cigarette and ran off the road," Troutman said. "My knee was hurting so bad I couldn't keep going. I only got in 51 miles."

Since then, his knee has "just gradually gotten better."

"I'm older, but I still don't take any medication and I can still walk. And I don't think I'll ever be able to start another one of these," Troutman said. "So if I can do any good for these kids at St. Jude, I'm going to do it."

Troutman said he will continue his trek as long as his body is willing – and as long as donations keep coming in for St. Jude. He is asking donors to give a penny per mile, or \$36. Information is on Facebook at "Troutman Trek 2021" and on the St. Jude website (fundraising.stjude.org) by searching for "Troutman".

CHANTERELLES: Check IDs!

and early season teal. Their delicate flavor, however, is often overpowered by heavier, red meats.

With a delicate apricot/peachy/fruit-like scent, this fleshy wild mushroom fairly glows with golden or orange light when seen from a distance in the deep green of the forest. Also known as “golden chanterelle” and “egg mushroom,” it is a highly prized and sought-after fungi for many foodies.

Most yellow/golden chanterelles found east of the Mississippi average the size of a fist. Black and orange varieties, however, are usually smaller, more thumb and finger-sized.

Chanterelles equal gold in more ways than one: on the open market they fetch a pretty price, their color is golden and the taste is referred to as “golden” by many, as well.

Finding Chanterelles

Generally speaking, chanterelles begin appearing in July and often produce several flushes before frost arrives. They are usually found in groups near the roots of hardwood trees (especially oak) and scattered throughout the forest understory. Those who shudder at trooping through muggy, buggy late-summer woods can also find chanterelles along trail edges. They thrive in deep, old leaf litter. Thankfully, chanterelles are not prone

to the same insect infestations and forest creature munching as other fungi.

I cannot stress enough that when gathering wild mushrooms, one MUST be sure of identification before eating. There are a few species that can be mistaken for chanterelles to the untrained eye, and these will indeed cause you some severe gastric upset.

So use a good field guide and have an experienced mushroom hunter check your initial finds before consuming. I have disappointed many people with a bag full of jack o lantern mushrooms who thought they had just made a considerable chanterelle find.

Chanterelles are yellow mushrooms with a fleshy cap that displays wavy, rounded cap margins tapering downward to meet the stem. A critical factor in identification is the gills, which are not thin, straight panels hanging from the lower surface of the cap, as is common in most cap-styled mushrooms. Instead, they are more ridged, appearing somewhat rounded, shallow and widely spaced.

At the edge of the cap, they are forked and interconnected. The gills also run down the stem rather than being confined to the cap. The gill arrangement is such that it doesn't even seem chanterelles have a cap and stem but rather look like a solid vase-like object from the underside.

Always harvest chanterelles with care. If you follow simple guidelines, you can likely harvest chanterelles from the same spot a few more times before frost and for years to come, as they routinely reappear in the same places. Most importantly, do not disturb the ground where the mycelium (the vegetative part of the mushroom) grows. Unlike the harvesting of other mushrooms, chanterelles should be pulled from the soil and then neatly trimmed to prevent dirt and debris from ending up in your mushroom basket. This is because cut stems can be vulnerable to an infection that could wipe out an entire patch.

Cleaning Chanterelles

Cleaning chanterelles can be a chore. The cap edges fold tightly to form lots of small nooks and crannies that can hold debris. Use a toothbrush or a vegetable brush to whisk away any surface material under a slowly running faucet. Do not soak them. The less water, the better. Drain on paper towels. They keep well in a waxed paper or brown paper bag in the refrigerator until cleaned. Cleaned chanterelles can be stored in the fridge for a few days.

Cooking Chanterelles

Before cooking chanterelles, cut them into chunks of a generous size to appreciate the flavor.

One of the best ways to cook them is to slice and sauté them in butter. Cream, half and half and chicken broth all make good additions.

Chanterelles should not be consumed raw.

Preserving Chanterelles

Freeze chanterelles in recipe-sized containers after sautéing with butter. When defrosted, they will retain most of their flavor. Dried chanterelles tend to lose flavor and, if dried improperly, the texture can become rubbery. Dried chanterelles are best used in sauce, stews and soups.

Princeville hears COVID-19 testing summary

PRINCEVILLE – The Princeville School Board heard a summary of the impact of COVID-19 on the school population in 2020-21.

During the year, a total of 1,266 students were isolated or quarantined, 58 students tested positive while 150 staff members were isolated or quarantined and 35 staff members tested positive.

At its June 15 meeting, the school board also approved an amended budget for Fiscal Year 2021 that showed deficits in the Education Fund (-\$252,807), Operations and Maintenance Fund (-\$10,628) and IMRF/Social Security Fund (-\$36,971).

Students fees for the upcoming year will be the same as last year, though

it was noted that breakfast and lunch fees may increase pending federal guidance.

The board also heard that the renovation of the Unit Office and Head Start building appears to be on schedule.

In other facilities news, the 3rd through 5th grade classrooms are being painted this summer. Also, work is being done to determine the problem with air conditioning in the speech room.

In other business, the board:

- Heard that Illinois State Scholars this year were: Ashley Brawley, Camille Daugherty, Job Feucht, Isabelle Johnson, Libby Martin, Lindsey Meisenheimer and Taryn Steidinger.

- Accepted the resignations of Charissa Ouart as high school volleyball

Williamsfield trustees approve 2 water treatment plant projects

WILLIAMSFIELD – Voting Monday at a regular meeting, the Village Board approved two projects to be done at the Williamsfield Water Treatment Plant.

Trustees voted to re-route

a portion of electrical conduit after hearing a request from Ameren Illinois, which indicated that the current layout is not up to their guidelines, according to Village President Matt Tonkin.

Trustees also approved the purchase of two re-

placement globe valves. Tonkin said the two valves in use at the plant are badly corroded and, since they need to be custom made, having replacements on hand will prevent a protracted shutdown when a valve fails. Estimated cost of the valves is \$7,000, but

Tonkin said estimates have been increasing, “which is one reason for jumping on it sooner rather than later.”

Trustees also discussed recommendations from the Veterans Park Committee, but indicated they wanted to wait for a final design before voting on potential

landscaping and design options. The committee has recommended a shared-use design that honors veterans using existing and future memorials and a new park sign, and that also celebrates other elements of Williamsfield history, including the railroad.

The board agreed that a target date for completion of renovations at the park is on or before April 23, the park’s centenary.

Trustee Andrew Scott discussed purchasing an asphalt pothole patcher and also talked about an assessment of storm-water management upgrades, since the village system is struggling to handle the large volumes of water passing north to south through town.

In other business, the board:

- Heard oil-and-chip surfacing of streets is scheduled the week of July 19.
- Heard that a USDA grant to repair the Village KP Hall has been approved. The goal is for the project to be completed in August, Tonkin said.

The next meeting will be Aug. 2 at 7 p.m.

Pritzker signs bill expanding Medicaid

SPRINGFIELD – Illinois residents who have health coverage through Medicaid now have access to a broad range of services including mental health counseling, substance abuse treatment, smoking cessation and dental services.

Gov. JB Pritzker on Tuesday signed Senate Bill 2294, which passed unanimously out of both chambers during the spring legislative session.

Among many provisions, the bill provides that people covered under Medicaid will continue to be eligible throughout the COVID-19 public health emergency and for up to 12

months after the emergency expires.

It also calls on the Department of Healthcare and Family Services to establish a program for implementation of certified community behavioral health clinics by Jan. 1, 2022, and to develop a “comprehensive behavioral health strategy” that is to be submitted to the governor and General Assembly by July 1, 2022.

Other provisions include recognizing veteran support specialists as mental health professionals under the state’s Medicaid plan; coverage of both individual and group tobacco cessation programs; requiring in-patient treatment for anyone experiencing an opioid overdose or withdrawal

if it’s determined to be medically necessary; coverage of kidney transplant medications regardless of a patient’s U.S. residency status; and providing a 10 percent increase, through March 31, 2022, in reimbursement rates for supportive living facilities, to be paid for with federal funds from the American Rescue Plan Act.

House Majority Leader Greg Harris, a Chicago Democrat and member of the Medicaid working group, said this year’s bill is aimed at addressing many of the health care disparities that have existed in Illinois for years but which were exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic.
