Mask mandate

Gov. Pritzker to require masks in schools

SPRINGFIELD – Against a background of rising COVID cases in Illinois, Gov. JB Pritzker on Wednesday announced that wearing masks will be mandated for the start of the 2021-22 school year.

Pritzker said all students and teachers in schools will be required to wear masks while indoors, regardless of vaccination status. The requirement takes effect immediately, and will also apply to all students and coaches participating in indoor sports. At present there is no requirement for outdoor sports.

"As your governor, it's my duty to say that we must all take immediate and urgent action to slow the spread of

the delta variant," he said.

State employees who work in congregate care facilities, veterans' homes, developmental centers and correctional facilities will also be required to receive COVID-19 vaccinations.

As of Monday, 96 of Illinois' 102 counties were experiencing "substantial" or "high" levels of community transmission.

Stark County saw 8 new COVID cases in the past week and Henry County had 31 new cases, which means Henry County is rated at a "substantial" level of community transmission while Stark Co. is at a "high" level.

The state reported 2,682 new cases of COVID-19 on Tuesday, a high since May 7.
