Memories of LaFayette Home Nursery

TOULON – A once-thriving business in LaFayette was the focus of a historical presentation at the Stark County Genealogical Society's last meeting at the Toulon United Methodist Church

Kay Ingels gave a historical presentation on the former LaFayette Greenhouse and Home Nursery.

The founder of the LaFayette Nursery was Irvin Ingels, who started the business in 1887. He Irvin returned to LaFayette to run the family farm located just north of town. Farm prices were low, so Irvin made extra income by selling trees for an eastern nursery, and eventually began the LaFayette Nursery a few years later.

In the 1890s, Irvin sold fruit to neighboring communities, which required laborers, or "pickers" to be employed to harvest the fruit. During harvest the nursery employed 20-40 people. That included Irvin's son, Gaar, who put in long hours at west end of Toulon City Park. That has since been filled in with dirt.

In the 1920s, Irvin's five sons began to run the nursery and Irvin began traveling the country. Irvin was killed at the age of 72 in an automobile crash in Ohio in 1932.

Irvin's oldest son, James, became owner in 1932 and ran the business until 1956. John Matson was the acting manager from 1946-1955 because James had suffered a serious heart attack. Corliss Ingels became owner of the Nursery from

Company discussing building in Wyoming

For The Prairie News WYOMING – An investment company is interested in purchasing one acre of land from the City of Wyoming for a possible business expansion.

The Wyoming City council discussed the possible sale at Monday's council meeting. Economic Development Advisor Denny Rewerts said the company wants to purchase a portion of the former Fehrenbacher property, located at the southeast corner of East South Street and Route 91.

Rewerts said the city wants to retain the other three acres for a possible future Senior Living facility. The price tag for one acre is \$45,000. The council approved proceeding with negotiations with the company, which would build a building to house two new businesses.

The roots of disenchantment go back as far as the Vietnam War, which coincides roughly with the beginnings of American Decline, certainly as perceived by older Trump fans.

For example, our political leaders have taken us into long, drawn-out wars, of immeasurable cost in men and treasure – only to keep losing them, pulling out, our tails between our legs. Not the stuff of The Greatest Generation.

Explaining the continuing Trump fervor

About the same time as Vietnam, business leaders began sending our jobs to China, enfeebling the American manufacturing base, and without so much as a "Thank you very much" to American workers.

More recently, we have been educating China's future tech wizards on our best engineering and science campuses, shoveling invaluable technological know-how into the laps of our primary competitor.

In addition to saving our allies' bacon in the Big War, we continue to spend jillions protecting Europeans from harm. In return, Europeans look down their noses at us with barely concealed contempt.

At home, Trump fans yearn for the good old days of two-parent families, with some respect and discipline in the home. Yet, our social policy experts push Congress to adopt scores of costly social programs that appear to diss traditional family life, instead encouraging dependence on government handouts, rather than building the resilience needed in the home.

All the while, the political and economic classes reap the benefits. Washington is seen as a widening cesspool of big-paying jobs for politicians, lawyers, lobbyists and staffers. Some of the staffers go on to Wall Street, to assist in knowingly pushing such things as toxic mortgages onto unsuspecting investors and ill-suited homeowners – never to pay a price for their criminality or for almost leading the world into global economic collapse.

Worse, the nouveaux elites, from the Clintons to the Obamas, appear to feel good about the jobs they think they have done, seemingly oblivious to the national decline that angers the Trump base.

To add insult to injury, a clueless Hillary Clinton describes the Trumpers as "deplorables," which is like arousing caged lions with red meat.

So, "Make America Great Again" continues as the perfect rallying cry against the failures of the American power structure, say Trump fans.

The Trump base, at least those around us here in struggling central Illinois, can overlook the personality flaws of Trump because he talks a blunt, unvarnished, bar-room language, in stark contrast to the hyperpolitical correctness that smothers direct conversations about America's problems.

We think his fans cling to Trump because they fear when he goes, our elite will again go unchallenged, and American decline will continue.

We are not Trump fans, yet in reflecting on what we hear, we think the Trump base makes an arguable case that we deserve better than we've been getting.

For The Prairie News TOULON - The Stark County Board heard reports and passed three measures Tuesday evening.

County engineer Judd Giffin reported that MFT sealcoating was completed on township roads. The county highway department did not perform a sealcoating program this year and an attempt to bid out for rock did not receive a single bid, Giffin said. Rock bidding will be scheduled for next year.

Sheriff Steven Sloan said he wants to get the courthouse parking lot sealcoated and striped next year, plus make additional parking spaces available. He also said Stark County representatives met Monday with the emergency telephone system board [ETSB] and Stark County will be going with Peoria County.

"We'll be on their board," Sloan said, "with dispatching coming from the Sheriff's Office [for Stark County only]." Sloan added that it will take a year and a half before "we're up and

running."

The board approved a resolution to maintain confidentiality of the minutes of closed meetings. Also approved was an intergovernmental agreement between the Henry County Health Department and the Stark County board for medical care of "retainees of the Stark County Jail." Third, the board approved the appointment of board supervisor Tim McMillen to the Central Illinois Agency on Aging, Inc. for a threeyear term beginning Oct. 1.

For The Prairie News KNOXVILLE – Stark County football ran into the new bully in the Lincoln Trail Conference last Friday.

The Rebels hit the road to face a big, strong Knoxville team that racked up 540 yards in offense and scored on its first eight possessions in a 55-14 win.

Knoxville (3-0, 3-0 Lincoln Trail) led 41-7 at halftime and wound up averaging 16.2 yards per carry for the game.

"They are big and fast and hit us in the mouth," Stark County Coach Jade Noard said. "You've got to play pretty flawless to be in a game with a team like that and we didn't, obviously."

The Rebels (1-2, 1-2 LTC) did battle to tie in the first quarter on a nifty trick play that saw Daniel Kieser take a pitch and then pass to Connor Wagenbach for a 68yard touchdown.

Next up for Stark County is a trip to face Elmwood-Brimfield (1-2), which has lost to Rushville-Industry and South Fulton since winning its opener.

"It's going to be a little bit of a test for which team can come out and put [the last two games] behind them," Noard said.
