Trains a part of life in Galva

GALVA – Trains. If you live in Galva, you can hear a train about every 15 minutes. Sometimes there will be two trains at one time. And, if you live close to the train tracks, your house will shake, pictures on the walls will become askew and chotskies will dance across end tables.

I have come to live with seismic activity as a daily presence in my life - not because of earthquakes but because of trains.

Three years ago, I moved from Elk River, Minn., to Galva to marry my husband, Kem Martin. I met Kem at a wedding in 2009 and always had my "eye" on him. When he became available,

Stark Board donates to emergency center

For The Prairie News TOULON - The Stark County Board of Supervisors heard a presentation from **Emergency Management** Agency Director Mat Schnepple Tuesday concerning a new Mission Readiness Center for Henry and Stark Counties. The Center would move the **Emergency Management** Agency offices from Cambridge to Kewanee.

"The Mission Readiness Center will include and house the operations center, the regional training center, an alternative housing center, and a multi-agency resource center," Schnepple said.

Schnepple wants the Center moved so that the distance to Stark County is reduced in case of an emergency response.

"We need to have a place to bring all county employees to a pre-determined location," that mimics their offices, Schnepple said.

The Stark County Sheriff's Office dispatchers would be able to utilize the center to dispatch emergency responders, for example, if the existing facility would be rendered unusable.

The center is to be located at the former Henry-Stark Health Department building just south of Kewanee, on Route 34. Schnepple said the Health Departments donated the building.

Renovation would be partially funded by both Henry and Stark Counties. Schnepple requested 8 percent of each counties' COVID funds be donated toward the project. Eight percent of Stark's funds equals \$89,000. The board approved the donation. Henry County approved \$767,000 **Continued on Page 2**

Joe Brone was drafted and served during the Vietnam War at the age of 18 as an aircraft mechanic in the U.S. Air Force.

Joe attended Dunlap High School and enjoyed working on cars. He was 1967. His most frightening experience was when an enemy flew over. The most interesting experience

was of a Recon plane coming back to base while running out of fuel. The pilot was eventually forced to bail and the plane crashed. Brone described his most exciting experience as this: "I was fueling up a plane when a C-47 had one engine running

and one of the most impressive U.S. weapons was a F-111 fighter. He met Bob Hope at the air base in Thailand and regularly wrote to his girlfriend who eventually became his wife.

When his tour ended, he was glad that it was over and he received the Marksman ribbon. He had pictures of himself when he was serving, but they burned in a fire. After his wartime experience ended, he remained in the military for six months. His highest rank was an E-3 and his job after being discharged was truck driving. He belonged to the VFW.



proud and excited to enter the military and had the skill to work on things. The rules were really tough and in his free time he'd record music. The uniforms were blue and green. He traveled by a C-130, from Macdill Air Base; to Anchorage; to Tokyo; then to Thailand around

and one wheel was shocked and broke off on the same side. The plane spun around and the prop hit a gaspowered starting unit and it started a fire. I capped my fuel tank and jumped off."





for a Saturday morning 5K run event.





A Few of My Favorite Things TRAINS: Wakeup call is now a train whistle

Continued from Page 1 and began painting and decorating all the while melding two households into one. I fell in love with Galva and my new home. However, early on it became quite clear that trains would play a huge role in my life as a Galva resident.

At first, I jumped every time a train would go by. I then braced myself, cursed at them, and occasionally hollered "just shut up, please – just ... shut ... up." All to no avail.

Regardless of my feelings, Kem assured me that I would get used to the whistles blaring, ground shaking, nerve grinding trains.

The question I asked myself was, "Why would anyone build a house so close to the train tracks?"

Kem knew some history of our home in that it was built around 1909 and it was one of the first on this block. While in quarantine last year and with a keen interest in finding an answer to my question, I had the opportunity to complete research. Thanks to Galva Public Library's Digital Archives, I discovered that our home was built by the late Mr. and Mrs. Alfred Harold 'Fred' Kermeen (Emma).

It all began to make sense to me. Kermeen was a railroad man -a veteran conductor on the Burlington Northern Railroad from 1891-1936. He built his home for convenience, as it was close to work at the Galva Depot, located just four blocks away.

Further, this house is an equal distance from downtown, shopping and Galva's schools. It seems Kermeen also had an aptitude for writing and contributed to The Galva News for many years. He wrote a weekly column called "Links and Pins" which discussed the railroad. By all accounts, Kermeen's column was very popular and I found several of his articles via the Galva Public Library's Digital Archives. The articles are rich in Galva's history as it pertains to the railroad.

Kermeen lived here until his death in 1948. Dorothy Searles, Kermeen's daughter, then gained ownership of the property and resided here until 1995. In 1995, my husband purchased the property which I now call home.

Ultimately, Kem was right. I have gotten used to the trains and can now discern type of train, where the train is coming from and how many miles the train is outside of Galva. My wakeup call is the train whistle. Once a week, I straighten picture frames and move chotskies back to their original places.

It is all part of life in Galva.


