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## Field lease for Farmington JFL in limbo

FARMINGTON – Transfer of the old Farmington High School football field to the Farmington JFL hit another snag Monday night.

Concerns over an easement and a possible alternative road to enter the JFL parking lot from Apple Street came up during a meeting of the Farmington School Board.

The JFL is prepared to sign a 10-year lease agreement with the school district that would facilitate transfer of the

field, something both parties seek. The JFL would pay \$1 per year for the lease, would take on added insurance for liability on the property and would do all maintenance.

Superintendent Zac Chatterton said the school district no longer wants "to be the controlling interest of the property" since it is of no use to students. Farmington Township gave the field back to the district a few years ago.

But the field is a good home for the 200 or so youngsters who participate in the JFL program, JFL Director Tom

Oldfield said.

At issue is an existing easement, which allows the JFL to access a parking lot west of the field from East Vernon Street. Sue and Scott Smith own a building north of the field that houses the Gator Guards business they started. The Smiths approached the school district about ending the easement and moving access to the west to come off Apple Street, according to Chatterton. Chatterton said the Smiths offered to upgrade access via an existing roadbed

## Princeville recycling costs to see increase

PRINCEVILLE – Recycling services are to cost Princeville residents an additional 50 cents per month, beginning this summer.

The monthly charge is to increase in each of the ensuing five years, albeit by smaller amounts. That's according to Eagle Enterprises Recycling Inc. of Galva, whose proposal the Princeville Village Board accepted earlier this month.

Approval extended Eagle's recycling contract with the village. In the first year, the monthly residential fee will be \$3.95 per household. That is to rise to \$4.11 in the second year, \$4.27 in the third year, \$4.44 in the fourth year and \$4.62 in the fifth.

Currently, the monthly rate is \$3.45, according to Julie Delbridge, village treasurer. The new deal takes effect July 1.

Eagle is to provide three varieties of recycling carts – 48,

64 or 96 gallons each. They are to be collected curbside every two weeks. There will be no charge for second carts.

Large recyclables that don't fit in carts can be placed alongside them and also will be collected, as will overflow items, according to Eagle.

The average monthly cost to the village over the length of the contract is to be \$3,081.60, based on 720 residential units, according to Eagle.

As is the case under the current deal, Eagle is to provide free recycling for Princeville schools.

The board also approved granting up to \$7,500 in tax-increment-financing money to Princeville Pharmacy to help pay for rehabilitation and renovation of its parking lot.

Once the project at 206 E. Main St. is completed, TIF money is to be paid, no later than April 30, 2023. Project cost is to be \$19,700, according to village documents.

that was used years ago. But at Monday's meeting, Apple Street resident Jimmy Nichols said he was worried about extra traffic and Oldfield voiced concerns about the road. "We want to make sure that they're not going to come here and spread 10 truckloads of gravel and call it done," Oldfield said. "We just want to make sure things are done correctly. There's a lot of traffic there during the week and on weekends." The Smiths were unavailable for comment.

The board tabled the issue until its June meeting. In other business, the board approved buying a New Holland skid steer from Fliginger Equipment, Inc., of Trivoli, for use in snow removal. Cost is \$24,000 after trading in a Mahindra 2555 cab tractor, a 15-foot batwing mower and another mower. The board also approved increasing lab fees by \$10 to \$20 for several classes for the 2022-23 school year and instituting a \$20 parking fee, with the increase not to exceed \$100 for any family. Meal prices will be

reinstated for 2022-23 and are expected to increase by 20 cents. The board also approved transferring \$100,000 from working cash into the tort fund to help pay for an ongoing project to replace emergency pole stations and lights in the school. Work started last fall due to concerns over material availability. But product delivery has been timely and the project is on schedule, necessitating payment. The board intends to pay back the transfer next month once property tax payments start to arrive.

Kindergarten teacher Rhonda Unkrich was given the Helen Farmer Haggerty Award and selected Elliott Ward as student recipient. Bailey Kennelly was named the Harvest Team Member of the Year. In personnel, the board approved hiring: Kim McSherry as a special education teacher; Kaylee O'Donnell as an elementary school teacher; Brianna Fellers as playground supervisor; Amara White as a junior high counsellor and high school English teacher; Dale Horn as junior high student supervisor and high school health teacher; Deb Uryasz, Sam Fletcher, Ryan Lambert, Jennifer Littrell and Brian Littrell as summer technology assistants; and numerous extended learning block teachers and staffers. The board also granted FMLA leave to Kristin Lock and accepted the following resignations: Travis Wilkinson as special ed teacher, Jennifer Littrell as class sponsor, Julie Springer as speech coach, Steve Nebergall as student facilitator, Jess Ossman as custodian (effective August 2023) and John Carver as groundskeeper (effective September 2022).

**Dems lost in the pandering, posturing weeds**

One of the more confounding political riddles pundits love to debate is how Democrats “lost” rural America. If the past month is any indication, however, it looks less like the Dems lost rural America and more like they are just lost in rural America.

For example, on April 28, the White House asked Congress for \$33 billion to purchase more weapons of war and supply more “economic and humanitarian aid” to Ukraine. According to Politico, \$500 million of the request is targeted at

There are several problems with this request, but two stand out. First, as described, \$100 million of the new money “would go toward providing a \$10-per-acre payment to farmers” who plant a soybean crop after a winter wheat crop in 2023.

If this is such a red hot idea – and a \$10-an-acre subsidy is, at best, lukewarm – why wait a year? The 2021-22 winter wheat crop will be harvested in the coming months, leaving tens of millions of acres ready for double-crop soybeans this year.

Second, the Biden proposal offers “another \$400 million [to] fund a two-year increase in loan rates for U.S. producers to encourage them to grow more select food commodities, including wheat, rice and oilseeds like soybeans, sunflowers and canola.”

It’s very unlikely, however, that higher loan rates will deliver more of these needed commodities – let alone in the time frame the White House says they will be needed – because that’s not how commodity loan rates work.

“Loan rates really give producers liquidity to hold on to a harvested crop until they market it. I don’t know if they encourage more production,” a senior Republican Senate aide (with kind deference to the White House) told Politico shortly after the Administration announcement. So, “I’m not sure how loan rates are going to be helpful.”

If the Biden request survives Congress – and already there’s talk of modifying the plan – both ideas might have a short shelf life. Even Joe Glauber, the chief economist at the United States Department of Agriculture under Secretary Tom Vilsack during the Obama Administration, is at a loss to explain Biden’s Big Ag ideas.

“I don’t think that this sort of intervention from the government makes any sense, other than to read it in a pure political sense...” Glauber remarked shortly after the proposals were announced.

The same is true for the Biden Administration’s other big April farm idea: expanding sales of E-15, gasoline with a 15 percent ethanol blend rather than the usual 10 percent, between June 1 and Sept. 12. The announcement, made in ethanol-loving Iowa, was touted as a way to lower nationwide gasoline prices by 10 cents per gallon.

That’s a big job for such a tiny hammer since less than 2 percent of all gasoline stations nationwide have E-15 pumps. Indeed, there’s little ev-

idence that this relatively tiny boost in ethanol sales – if it materializes at all – will impact U.S. gasoline prices this summer.

Moreover, the Biden ethanol plan overlooks an authoritative March report from the National Academy of Sciences that “estimated that corn-based ethanol was at least 24 percent more carbon-intensive than gasoline when emissions from land-use changes ... were included,” reported the New York Times April 12.

So, in fact, the Biden announcement of summer E-15 sales “...will actually work in the opposite direction of the administration’s climate goals rather than being a benefit,” Jason Hill, a professor of bioproducts and biosystems engineering at the University of Minnesota, told the Times.

If Land Grant University professors think government expansion of ethanol is a bad idea, it’s probably a really bad idea. But bad ideas rarely stop politicians from pandering and posturing to constituents – even if it’s the wrong pandering and posturing.

So, pundits, stop wondering about rural Dems; they’re there. They just don’t know where “there” is anymore.

# Williamsfield saving money with solar panels

WILLIAMSFIELD – The Williamsfield School Board heard good news about electric costs at its Monday meeting.

Thanks to the installation of an array of solar panels, Williamsfield has seen its electric costs decline by 41 percent this fiscal year according to Superintendent Tim Farquer. Costs are down from \$52,751 in FY 2020 to \$31,381 for FY 2022, with one month left in the billing cycle.

Meanwhile, Farquer also noted that diesel costs have increased by an

average of 8.6 percent annually for the past four years.

With that in mind, the district is moving forward to apply for funding to purchase an electric bus under the federal Clean School Bus Rebate program. Farquer said first-round grant winners will be announced in the fall. He reported that “everything indicates” Billtown will qualify for up to \$395,000 per bus/charger/infrastructure.

The plan is to main at least one diesel bus in the school’s fleet until infrastructure for electric vehicles improves across Illinois.

Farquer said third quarter revenues and expenditures “came in strong” with a 15 percent revenue increase.

In other action, the board recognized the ROWVA-Williamsfield cross country team for being sectional qualifiers and recognized the R-W girls track and field team for winning back-to-back ICAC Conference titles.

The board also approved hiring Garret Rau as a full-time staff member for the 2022-23 school year. Rau will teach chemistry and physical science, with plans to help coach football and basketball.

# Elmwood OKs leases for skid steer, backhoe

ELMWOOD – Elmwood’s City Council approved two lease agreements with Altorfer-Cat for a new Caterpillar skid steer loader and a new Cat backhoe loader at its May 4 meeting.

Selling price of the Cat 262D3 XPS skid steer is \$77,000 while the selling

price of the Cat 420XE backhoe loader is \$145,645 (with a \$32,500 trade-in and a doc fee of \$350 brings that price down to \$113,495).

The council approved a lease proposal for the skid steer that costs \$12,177 annually for four years, and the second lease option for the backhoe loader that costs \$17,860 annually for four year. It is the intent of the council not to purchase the two pieces of equipment, but rather to lease again after five years. The skid steer will be used for snow removal and other jobs.

Treasurer Bonnie Beal stated, “There’s not much going on.” She said that the council “has done well” with staying within the budget with expenditures under budget and revenues over.

Police Chief Aaron Bean presented his monthly April report that showed 0 arrests, 5 traffic stops, 3 citations, 3 warnings, 23 reports taken, no notices to appear issued, 1 open door, no ordinance violations and 35 incidents handled. Bean said that \$351 was spent for canine medication, but was “totally donated.” And,

Farmers’ State Bank donated \$108 to the canine fund for Rebel the city’s police dog.

Economic Development Director Amy Davis said eight building permits were issued, Elmwood did not receive the Arts Mean Business grant from the Central Peoria Community Foundation, she has completed the first ARPA funding report and extended support to Uptown Cafe, which is moving to 118 E. Main St., previously occupied by Cerno’s. Owner Cory Jones said he is hoping to open at the new facility in early June.

Upcoming events include: May 28, VFW Ruck 22 John Pettit Memorial Walk; May 30, Memorial Day Celebration at Central Park and the cemetery; June 4, Strawberry Festival; June 5, Sunday summer band concerts begin; and, June 10, Friday farmers’ market starts at Central Park.



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# Redbud trees are showy spring bloomers

The spring-flowering trees are in fine fettle right now. Crabapple, cherry, and plum are all showing off their spring attire. Flowers of pink, maroon, and white completely cover the branches. What a sight.

The first to bloom is usually the serviceberries, but you have to look quick or you'll miss the show. Their blossoms disintegrate after just a few days, their petals falling to the ground like a skiff of snow. The flowers of the other ornamental trees last considerably longer, but still not long enough. But hey, would we appreciate them just as much if they hung around for a month or two? I think not.

One of my favorite flow-

ering trees is *Cercis canadensis*, the redbud tree. And this spring they are really earning their keep. Native to the eastern United States and Canada, redbuds are blooming in neighborhoods, along roadsides, and in woodland edges. They're in full bloom right now but, in another week or two, depending on how hot and windy it gets, they'll shed their blossoms and disappear into the surrounding landscape.

Nurseries keep a good number of redbuds in stock during the blooming season because that's when folks get the itch to have one in their own yard. Once the blooms are gone, they're just another tree.

The genus name *Cercis* comes from "kerkis," the Greek name for a weaver's shuttle, which the tree's ripe brown seed pods resemble. Each pod contains up to 12 seeds. Redbuds are members of the Legume family, botanically speaking, making them kissing cousins of the garden pea. That's why redbud and pea flowers and pods look so much alike.

However, the common



name redbud is a misnomer. Arnold Arboretum's Dr. Kenneth Robertson once wrote that whoever named the redbud tree must have been colorblind, because the flowers are not red at all, but bright lavender-pink.

In spring before the leaves appear, clusters of magenta flowerbuds come forth, so numerous that they literally cover the branches. The tree takes on a rich magenta hue. Then the buds open to expose the lavender-pink petals of the flowers, brightening the hue of the tree overall. A practiced eye can tell from a distance if a tree's

flowers are fully opened by noting the color.

As the redbud flower show draws to a close, the distinctive heart-shaped leaves appear, glossy green with a reddish hue. The leaves arrange themselves horizontally in two rows along the branches in a neat and orderly fashion, giving the tree a kind of tailored look throughout the summer. Autumn arrives and the foliage turns yellow for a very short time before becoming dark brown and falling to the ground. The seedpods linger on the branches into the winter.

Redbuds can be grown as a single or multi-trunked tree, growing 25 feet tall and wide at maturity. Although you may be tempted to buy a large specimen, you'll have better luck with a small plant. Redbuds don't take well to transplanting. Though not real particular about soil type, redbuds don't like wet feet. They do fine in full sun or partial shade.

You may hear our native redbud referred to as a Judas tree, but that name rightly refers to another redbud species, *Cercis siliquastrum*, which is native to the Mediterranean. Legend has it that Judas, in despair after betraying Jesus, hanged himself from a branch of the tree. In shame, the tree turned its flowers from white to red.

There are several cultivars of redbud available in the trade. *Cercis* 'Hearts of Gold' has rich golden yellow foliage in the spring which becomes chartreuse in the summer, more yellow if in full sun. I have one of these, a gift from a friend. It is about 10 years old and is struggling.

Another cultivar, *C.* 'Rising Sun', has apricot-colored foliage in the spring turning to bright green in summer. I had one of these too, but it died young.

My experience says that these "specialty" cultivars are not strong enough to survive the long haul. My run-of-the-mill redbuds with green leaves and pretty pink flowers are doing way better.

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# McKown excited to coach Brimfield girls hoops

BRIMFIELD – If there’s one thing Josh McKown wants known regarding the Brimfield High School girls basketball head-coaching job, it’s this:

He’s pretty pumped about it.

McKown is in line to become the next coach of a program that two months ago won the Class 1A state championship.

During its meeting Wednesday night, convened after The Weekly Post deadline, the Brimfield school board was expected to make official McKown’s new coaching position. McKown is a 1999 Brimfield graduate, a former Brimfield athlete and longtime Brimfield educator.

“I’ve been a member of the community pretty much my whole life,” McKown, 40, said last week. “I’m really honored to have the opportunity.

“I cannot be happier right now. I’m really, really excited about it.”

If approved, McKown is to replace Maribeth Dura, who last month was hired as girls basketball head coach at Canton.

An eighth-grade mathematics teacher, McKown holds degrees

from Bradley University in Peoria and Lewis University in Romeoville. His wife, Katie, teaches in the Dunlap school district. They reside in the Brimfield district and have three children; the oldest is in fifth grade.

This is to be the first varsity head-coaching job McKown has had. He was a Brimfield assistant coach in baseball and boys basketball. He also has coached junior-varsity baseball and basketball.

“I’ve always kind of wanted my own program,” McKown said. “I enjoy coaching. I think that my passion is coaching.

“When (this) job came open, I talked to my wife a little bit about it. The timing was right, and I decided to go after it.”

Dura left Brimfield after six seasons, during which she compiled a 142-38 record. On March 5 in Normal, the Indians defeated Galena 32-31 to cap a 32-4 season and win their first girls basketball state title.

About a week earlier, Canton finished 14-19 but advanced to a Class 2A sectional final.

Dura applied for a Canton job that opened when five-season coach Jessica Jones resigned. During a meet-

ing April 18, the Canton school board approved Dura’s hiring unanimously, according to athletics director Brad Hulet.

“My work was easy,” Hulet said in an email. “We are very excited to have Coach Dura as a Little Giant and can’t wait to have her working with our girls basketball program.”

Dura did not return email and telephone messages. Dura is a Peoria-based attorney.

“She set the bar high,” McKown said. “It can’t get much higher than the state championship. It’s a bit daunting in that regard.”

Junior guard Elly Doe is the top returning scorer for Brimfield, which graduated four senior starters, including Eastern Illinois recruit Ella Lune. Doe will form the first-season base for the 10th coach of a program that is approaching 1,000 victories over almost 50 years. Brimfield has won 20 regional and six sectional titles and finished fourth in Class 1A in 2009. This year, it reached its pinnacle.

“The tradition in this community ... I’m just so excited the administration has given me a chance to build on something Coach Dura helped build,” McKown said.

# Illinois starts co-responder program

SPRINGFIELD – Police departments in four communities in Illinois will be part of a co-responder pilot program that aims to send social workers and mental health professionals on law enforcement calls.

That was part of House Bill 4736, a measure signed into law Tuesday

by Gov. JB Pritzker in Peoria, one of the four communities in the pilot program along with Waukegan, Springfield and East St. Louis.

The program would send social workers along with law enforcement on certain calls with a primary focus on victim assistance, as well as diversion from the criminal justice system.

Responsibilities would include connecting victims with social services, providing guidance for receiving orders of protection and filing police reports, working with police investigators within confidentiality laws, and providing guidance to families of juveniles who have been arrested.

The Fiscal Year 2023 budget signed into law last month provides \$10 million for the pilot programs this year. It would need a reallocation of funding each year and would expire in 2029.

HB 4736 also created a tip hotline grant program that would fund organizations or units of local government to establish anonymous tip hotlines that provide cash rewards for tips that lead to an arrest.
