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Brimfield seeking new bus operator

BRIMFIELD – Which organization will operate buses for Brimfield School District students next academic year isn’t clear.

It might be one of two vendors the district is soliciting. It might be the district itself.

But it almost certainly won’t be Heinz Bus Co. of Brimfield. The company cited a lack of drivers in deciding not to renew its contract with the school district, according to Superintendent Tony Shinall.

“We’re sad to see Heinz go. We had a great relationship,” Shinall said May 11 following a school-board meeting. “(But) I get it. That’s what I told them. It’s not personal.”

District officials were expected this week to review student-transportation bids. Shinall said at least a pair of bids is expected – one from Peoria Executive Limousine Service of Peoria Heights, another from Cincinnati-

Farmington council adds new member

FARMINGTON – The Farmington City Council moved one person closer to a full complement Monday night by backing the appointment of Jeni Crusen as alderman for Ward 3.

Crusen replaces David Black, who earlier this spring resigned the position he won in the April 2021 election by 17 votes in a race against Crusen.

Mayor Ken Stufflebeam referenced that election in appointing Crusen to the position.

“I just felt the right thing to do was to see if she was still interested because we almost had her on the council already,” Stufflebeam said.

The Council voted unanimously to appoint Crusen, 44, a lifelong Farmington resident who was accompanied to the meeting by her husband, Joe, and two of their three children, Addison and Aria.

“I’m happy to be here,” said Crusen, who runs a photography business. She will serve as Ward 3 alderman until the April 2023 election, when she can run for the position again.

Crusen had several chances to vote Monday, as the council passed three ordinances associated with payments from the TIF District to homeowners and businesses.

Ordinance 2022-11 sets aside \$75,000 for res-

Williamsfield 17-year-old set to become RN

GALESBURG – Caitlin Evans came home one day and had a question for her parents. Who is Doogie Howser?

As Evans gets set to graduate today, May 19, from Carl Sandburg College’s associate degree nursing program at only 17 years old, it’s understand-

able that she’s drawn comparisons to the teenage doctor played by Neil Patrick Harris on the 1990s sitcom.

“Someone called me that, and I had no idea (what it meant),” Evans said. Thirty-year-old pop culture references are among the few things Evans isn’t well schooled in.

When she was 13, Evans took a placement test at Sandburg so she could enroll in dual-credit courses while at Williamsfield High School. By taking dual-credit classes during the school year and summer, Evans graduated from Williamsfield with

her high school diploma in the spring of 2020 and from Sandburg with her Associate in General Studies that summer at 15. She applied for Sandburg’s College of Nursing, got accepted and began nursing school in the fall of 2020.

“It was kind of a culture shock,” Evans said. “I went from being 13 and in seventh grade, then going to high school and then doing college and graduating all in the span of two years. Then when I started the nursing program it was like, this is my

focus right now.”

Evans said she always knew she wanted to work in health care. Her original plan was to become a pharmacist, but that required being at least 18 years old, which didn’t match up with her fast-track. She turned her attention to nursing like her mom Sarah, a 2012 graduate of Sandburg’s nursing program. Her dad Brandon, a lawyer, checked to make sure she’d be eligible to take the NCLEX. Other than Evans being unable to use a Hoyer lift (operators need to be at least 18), they didn’t find any age issues.

Evans has been on the dean’s list each semester and will graduate with highest honors, reserved for students with a 3.9-4.0 GPA. Next on her to-do list are bachelor’s and master’s degrees in nursing. She wants to go into research care and perhaps get her doctor of nursing practice.

“I’ve gotten straight A’s throughout all of nursing school just because I like to – not be a perfectionist – but I like to set high goals for myself,” Evans said.

The restaurant roulette wheel is spinning in Elmwood, where the Uptown Cafe is soon moving to the former Cerno’s location at 118 E. Main St. Occupying the space vacated by Uptown Cafe at 110 N. Magnolia St. will be a Mexican restaurant operated by **Dana Cardenas** of Havana. Cardenas is seeking a liquor license from the City of Elmwood and plans to call her restaurant Mi Ranchito. Opening is likely slated for July. Margaritas on Magnolia anyone? ... **Tom Shissler** floored me with a farming stat recently. At one point this spring, the Ukraine had planted 30 percent of its crops while the U.S. stood at 20 percent. That disparity has changed, as farmers have been going hard of late. As comedian **Steven Wright** has aptly noted, “I think it’s wrong that only one company makes the game Monopoly.”

Baby formula is just one of many shortages. As two school board stories in this paper prove, there is also a dire shortage of bus drivers. Again I ask, “How can that happen?” Why are bus companies and so many other employers posting “Help Wanted” signs but getting no response? Say what you will, but the government handing out money is part of the problem. Another likely

cause, pointed out by a local bartender, is lack of pride. When did it become OK not to have a job?

The squirrel world is full of intrigue this spring. ‘Harvested cattle, slaughtered markets’

You don’t need to be a vegan to know that livestock and poultry aren’t “harvested,” the squeaky clean verb that’s become fashionable among farm and ranch groups to minimize the end – as in The End – of most animals their members grow.

Soybeans are harvested; pigs are slaughtered. Wheat is harvested; cattle are slaughtered.

It’s not a minor point, insists C. Robert Taylor, Eminent Scholar of Agricultural Economics and Public Policy at Auburn University, in his recently released treatise on today’s badly broken cattle markets. Taylor telegraphs the paper’s theme through its title, “Harvested Cattle, Slaughtered Markets?”

The semantic sarcasm isn’t accidental: While U.S. farm and commodity groups spent decades polishing meat’s image (“harvesting”), global agbiz spent their time and resources buying up, then dominating – ahem, slaughtering – farm and food sectors like seed, cattle, poultry and grocery retailing.

Now, one market, cattle, is so near death that both the Senate and House Ag committees recently held widely publicized hearings to push ideas on how to resuscitate it. Two plans were showcased. The first “would create a new U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) office to monitor for anti-competitive practices in the meat and poultry industries,” reported the Washington Post on April 27.

The second, labeled “The Cattle Price Discovery and Transparency Act,” hopes to establish “minimums

for negotiated sales and require clear reporting of marketing contracts to ensure ranchers are getting a fair shake in a highly consolidated cattle market,” it continued.

Either or both ideas may have had merit 20 years ago when it was already evident that major meat-packers were tightening their grip on cattle markets. Today, however, both plans are window dressing from late-to-the-party politicians. Neither will have a nickel’s worth of impact on prices paid by packers for cattle or for altering any “anti-competitive practices in the meat and poultry industries,” says Taylor.

Why? Because, as his readable, 49-page report makes clear, major packers long ago learned how to minimize competition in the live cattle market while maximizing confusion over today’s USDA maze of reporting requirements. The data bears witness to their ever-growing prowess at the expense of both cattle growers and consumers.

Over the last two decades, Taylor writes, “Retail beef prices in constant [deflated] dollars have trended strongly upward... from about \$500/cwt [per one hundred pounds] to over \$700/cwt... Grocery store profitability has also trended upward, about doubling in the last three decades...”

“Profitability of independent cattle feeding has trended downward... from an average profit of \$50/head to an average loss of \$50/head.”

Moreover, these “Sustained financial losses for independent feeders likely explain, in part or in whole, the loss of 83,000 feedlots with a thousand or fewer head capacity in 25 years and 48,000 in the last decade” alone.

These feedlots’ get-out-while-you-can math was pretty simple, offers Taylor. The \$50-per-head loss

they faced in just the past decade alone would have totaled a devastating \$1.5 million-per-feeder had they stayed.

Somehow, though, the uber-big feeders escaped similar losses and a similar fate: The number of feedlots with over 50,000 head capacity actually increased from 45 in the late 1990s to 77 today. How?

“Sweetheart deals with large captive feeders” – independent feedlots contractually-tied to one of the big four packers – “may explain, in part or in whole, how they have survived and even (grew) in the last decade... Publicly available data on costs or returns for giant feedlots are not available to address this question.”

If neither Congressional effort holds little to no hope to even partially repair today’s broken cattle market, what might?

Taylor offers four “options for further discussion.” All hold some merit, he explains in a May 9 telephone interview, but also, all require a level of government intervention that hasn’t been seen in most ag markets for decades.

“The bottom line,” Taylor admits, “is that after decades of watching cattle markets become more integrated with meatpackers and meat retailers, I don’t have a good solution that’s politically workable.”

Bottom line? If the experts say it’s slaughter, it’s slaughter.

based First Student Inc.

According to Shinall, there is no minimum dollar amount for bids. The firms can bid to provide buses and drivers, as Heinz did, or to provide drivers only.

In the latter case, the school district would lease buses.

If school officials deem the potential bids unsatisfactory, they could decide to acquire buses and drivers to create an in-house transportation operation.

Shinall didn't appear to relish that possibility.

"We'll have to lease buses, come up with a place to store them and hire drivers and take care of the mechanics of school buses," he said. "From going to nothing to this would be a huge undertaking."

Of almost 700 students in the Brimfield district, about 400 take buses to and from school, Shinall estimated.

District bus service also includes transportation to and from extracurricular events.

Shinall crunched numbers for an in-house option, but viability depends on bids received. In June, the board is expected to decide.

"I'm taking a wait-and-see approach," Shinall said. "It's one of those things that you don't have any control over at this point."

The meeting last week included a hearing regarding the board's intention to sell up to \$1 million in bonds that would facilitate infras-

tructure improvements. No members of the public addressed the board during the hearing.

According to Shinall, some bond money is likely to help pay for a \$700,000 roof-repair project at Brimfield Grade School. Work is to begin this summer and end in 2023.

The board approved a 2022-23 student-fee schedule that is unchanged from 2021-22. It also approved a \$15 increase, to \$125, in the daily rate of pay for substitute teachers.

McKenna Weaver was approved to replace Penny Silzer as high school volleyball coach. For the past two years, Weaver was women's basketball coach at Carl Sandburg College in Galesburg. She is to remain there as COVID-19 coordinator, according to Sandburg spokesman Aaron Frey.

Josh McKown was approved as high school girls basketball coach, and Kevin Faulkner was approved for the same position for seventh and eighth grades.

idents living in the TIF to apply for home improvement grants of up to \$2,500.

Ordinance 2022-12 sets aside \$30,000 for business commercial facade renovation.

And Ordinance 2022-13 stipulates that \$25,000 be allocated for improvements to residences located outside of the TIF.

All ordinances passed unanimously, though Crusen actually abstained from voting since she is so new to the council. Details on applying for the grants are available on the City of Farmington website.

The council heard that one such grant of \$1,181.25 was paid to Jim and Sandra Van Houten for work on their home.

The council also heard that a sinkhole that devel-

oped on Illinois Route 78 east of Lozier Oil Co. was repaired by Saturday. The road was closed May 10 after IDOT discovered a small hole in the road that was later found to be nearly 21 feet deep and “the size of a car” according to Stufflebeam.

“It could have been bad,” he said.

Instead, city crews and workers from G.A. Rich & Sons had the road back open by Saturday.

City Manager Rollen Wright said that two residential sewer laterals made a 90-degree bend and went down 15-18 feet in the area of the sinkhole. Over the years, clay tile cracked and collapsed causing clay and other materials to wash down into the sewer.

Stufflebeam also discussed a tire collection event for Fulton County on June 7-8 that is open to the city, but not to the general public. He encouraged residents to contact the city office if they have tires to dispose of.


“I know you can’t get rid of tires like you used to be able to,” Stufflebeam said.

‘Undecided’ leading
GOP governor race

SPRINGFIELD – Less than a month and a half from the June 28 primary, and “undecided” is the lead vote-getter in a poll of 1,000 likely GOP primary voters, with 36.9 percent of respondents in that camp.

For those polled who have picked a candidate, Aurora Mayor Richard Irvin had the lead at 24.1 percent, followed by state Sen. Darren Bailey, R-Xenia, at 19.8 percent, Gary Rabine at 7.8 percent, Jesse Sullivan at 7.3 percent, Max Solomon at 2.3 percent and Paul Schimpf at 1.9 percent.

The poll, by WGN-TV, The Hill and Emerson College, was conducted May 6-8.

Bailey’s camp said it shows the primary “is a two-person race for the heart and soul of our Republican Party.”

Bailey has a staunch conservative

voting record in the General Assembly and he’s also been jockeying for the endorsement of former President Donald Trump. Per the poll, 57.4 percent of respondents said they would be more likely to vote for a candidate endorsed by Trump.

The Irvin campaign, meanwhile, said it’s Democrats who are propagating Bailey’s campaign.

The Irvin campaign pegged the total combined spend of his opponents and outside groups in the GOP primary at \$22 million, including \$8 million directly attacking Irvin.

Irvin’s campaign has spent at least \$12 million, backed by \$45 million from GOP megadonor Ken Griffin, founder of the investment firm Citadel and a financial backer of Republican former Gov. Bruce Rauner.

Bailey’s biggest backer is Uline founder Richard Uihlein, who has given Bailey \$3.5 million.

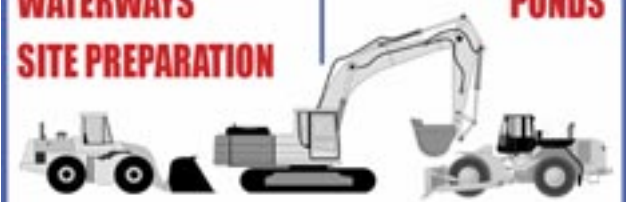

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Princeville hiring teacher in place of four aides

PRINCEVILLE – In one specific circumstance in the Princeville School District, one employee might be a better long-term solution than four employees.

During its meeting May 10, the school board approved promoting Hilary Melick to the position of interventionist at Princeville Grade School. Melick

teaches first grade there.

In her new job, Melick will offer individual or small-group instruction to students struggling academically. Usually, four long-time teacher’s aides handled such responsibilities. But two aides left those jobs, and replacing them has not been easy, Princeville Superintendent Shannon Duling said.

“We’ve struggled to get aides,” he said. “It’s just been kind of a revolving door. It takes so much training that it’s impossible to serve kids.

“It’s always been kind of discussed about utilizing a teacher to provide those services instead of aides. The reason we haven’t looked at it before is because the aides we’ve had have been phenomenal.”

The other two aides won’t be replaced when they leave, Duling said. Melick then is to handle the grade-school caseload.

At first blush, such a swap appeared odd to Mike Harmon, the school-board vice president.

“Does it seem insane for me to think we’re going to replace four people with one person?” Harmon said.

Duling suggested a learning-loss gap caused by the coronavirus pandemic probably will dissipate.

“Once that gap is closed, I don’t necessarily think we’re going to need four aides to do it,” Duling said.

An enrollment decrease at the grade school will help facilitate Melick’s impending move, according to Duling. Melick’s interventionist focus is to be on reading among students in kindergarten to third grade.

“(Melick) has been teaching first grade forever and has been a phenomenal reading teacher,” Duling said.

Melick’s salary is to be

\$58,885. In the current fiscal year, the four aides were paid \$72,431.

The board also approved a two-year lease with Midwest Transit Equipment Inc. for two additional 14-passenger activity buses at about \$17,000 per bus. The district already leases two activity buses.

A shortage of school-bus drivers led the district to lease more activity buses, which anybody with a driver’s license can operate, according to Duling.

The board also approved hiring Kyle Dennison as assistant principal. Dennison spent the past three years as a junior-high math teacher in Princeton. The board approved hiring Clark Brown as a junior-high science teacher; Malley Zadrzynski as junior-high cheerleading coach; and transferring Jamie Huber to become a fourth-grade teacher.

Coaches juggle athletes for boys track sectional

Finding the best use of a gifted track athlete is one of the challenges for a coach, particularly come sectional time when there's a decision to be made about winning the meet, advancing a relay or moving on to state as an individual.

So it goes heading into the Friday, May 20, Class 1A IHSA boys sectional at Kewanee Wethersfield. Field events start at 3 p.m., running events at 5. Elmwood-Brimfield, Princeville, Farmington and ROWVA-Williamsfield are all at the same event.

E-B has a shot to defend its team title in this balanced meet, but to do so, Coach Gregg Meyers may need to use every ounce of the skills of senior Thomas Harmon – who was named Athlete of the Meet last week at the John Livingston relays in Lewistown, has set school records in the

400 and 800 this spring and is also a gifted distance runner.

Too bad he can only compete in four events, right Coach Meyers?

“Obviously, we’re going to put him in the 800 and the mile,” Meyers said. “After that it’s look and see. He’s got the potential to get us a lot of points.”

E-B also figures to score with sophomore Isaiah Hill, seeded second to Harmon in the 800 and 1,600. And E-B is traditionally dominant in the 3,200, where Nick Feller is seeded second (10:55.36), and in the 4x800.

If healthy, the Trojans also look strong in the 4x200 relay, where school record-holders Aiden Frail, Gavin Buhl, Brayden Lehman and Johnny York are first at 1:34.40. But Lehman and York have been battling hamstring issues, meaning York’s top seed in the long jump could also be tenuous. And in the 4x200 E-B is barely ahead of Knoxville (1:34.48)

and not far ahead of Farmington’s quartet of Hunter Darsham, Dane Hitchcock, Jake Martin and Logan Morse (1:35.65).

That same Farmington quartet is seeded first in the 4x400 with a time of 3:35.20, just ahead of Princeville’s 3:35.39. And that raises the question of Princeville senior standout Grant Hunt, seeded second in the 100, 200 and 400 but also a top relay performer. Princes Coach Jon Carruthers expects Hunt to run in the 100, 400, 4x100 relay and 4x400 relay.

“It’s his decision to be in the 200 or 4x400,” Carruthers said. “It shows the type of kid he is. He wants to get the 4x400 team down to state and have a shot at running good and possibly getting a medal.”

In other events, Farmington’s Brayden Morse is top seed in pole vault while Logan Morse is second in high jump.

Speaking of school records, the E-B 4x100 relay of Peterson, Howerton, junior Ainsley Faulkner and sophomore Emma May broke a 2003 Trojan record of 52.32. The quartet posted a time of 51.64 seconds to place second to United and to rank 15th headed into the state meet.

“I’m glad I came out this year because I’ve been having a lot of fun,” said Peterson, who has not competed in track since

freshman year. “I wasn’t really expecting to go far in it. I was just doing it to stay in shape and be a little more social with everybody and it panned out great.”

Sophomore Etta Wagner was second in shot put with a throw of 35-7.25 that has her seeded 14th.

May was second in long jump with a leap of 15-9.75 and is the 28th seed.

E-B Coach Kyle Anderson said all qualifiers have been “extremely coachable” and were “out to get after it” at sectional. He hopes for the same at state.

“Both of our 300 hurdlers have more pop in them on a warm track and our 4x100, after setting the record, if they have another pop I think they’re in the mix,” Anderson said. “And the only [qualifier] we lose to graduation is Elynn.”

Princeville’s state qualifier was senior Jesenia Horton-Meza, who advanced in the 200 with a personal record 27.39 that was good for second and has her seeded 22nd.

Princeville sophomore Brianna Brodie was third in discus with a throw of 110-6 that left her six

inches short of qualifying.

ROWVA-Williamsfield senior Ali Cain, who had a p.r. in shot put with a throw of 35-6, was also 6 inches short of qualifying.
