Hackett is new Toulon Congregational pastor

TOULON – Pastor Joe Hackett, 58, will take to the pulpit this coming Sunday to preach the Good Word at

the First Congregational Church, in Toulon.

"We are excited to be in Toulon and excited to see where our ministerial journey will take us here in Illinois," Hackett



said of his and wife Chris' arrival, in Toulon.

After a transition period wherein numerous guest speakers addressed

the congregation, the Congregational Church is "thankful to have found a full-time pastor."

The Hacketts were seeking a rural or small-town ministry and searched through the National Association of Congregational Christian Churches' website for available positions. They chose Toulon because it was the closest of several sites to Milwaukee, home of their three grown sons, Matt, Nick and Matthew.

The Hacketts are transferring to Toulon from St. Jacobi Congregational Church, in Richfield, Wisc., which is outside of Milwaukee.

Ministry work is Hackett's second

career, which he has been doing for the past five years after finishing seminary courses. His first career was with a fire service and he was an assistant chief for an EMS operation.

Hackett decided to become a pastor after he had a calling for approximately eight years that he didn't answer at first. Once he answered the calling, Hackett attended Wartburg Seminary and the University of Dubuque Seminary. He still has to complete an internship in order to receive a formal seminary degree that he will add to his Bachelor of Arts history degree earned at the University of Wisconsin, at Milwaukee.

Unique award

Toulon grad Winans receives diesel tech scholarship

TOULON – A ceiling fan has helped spark a bright future for Jonathon "Jack" Henry Winans.

Winans traces his curiosity and interest in motors and engines back to that ceiling fan he took apart as a youngster in order to see how it worked. From there, Winans asked for an engine for his 13th birthday. His father, Joe Winan, bought a V8 Ford truck engine for Jack to take apart.

That early interest in how things work has led Jack, a recent Stark County High School graduate, to a major step in securing his future. Winans applied for and received Martin Tractor, Incorporated's diesel power technician's scholarship opportunity

with the help of his high school Ag teacher, Taylor Wilkinson.

Wilkinson informed Winans and his parents, Joe and Lisa Winans, last year about Martin's diesel power technician's scholarship.

"My parents said, 'If you think this is a good idea, then go for it," Jack

said. "I applied for it back in November and had an interview just before Christmas. I had a second interview a couple of months later and then had the signing at the school last month."

Bradford man pleads guilty to firearm felony

TOULON – A rural Bradford man pleaded guilty last Friday in Stark's Circuit Court to a Class 4 felony charge of reckless discharge of a firearm in exchange for the dismissal of two Class X felony charges of murder/intent to kill and aggravated discharge of a firearm. He also pleaded guilty to a misdemeanor charge of aggravated assault.

Carter Leo Scott, 38, is scheduled to be sentenced on July 22 for the felony, which is punishable by one to three years prison as a maximum, or by receiving probation, according to Scott's legal counsel, Kevin F. Sullivan, of Peoria.

Sullivan added after Scott's court appearance that a firearms expert concluded Scott's rifle discharges a flash from the side of the muzzle, which disputed then Stark County Sheriff's Deputy Dawson Nuding's testimony that he saw the flash of the discharged rifle and concluded by his experience that it was aimed toward him.

Sullivan said that Nuding did not testify to hearing a "crackling noise" that would have come from *Continued on Page 2*

The mascot contest started after the school board agreed to "rebrand" the old Civil War rebel caricature due to concerns about it being out of date.



Continued from Page 1 sentative Amy Nelson, Jack is one of 13 high school graduates who received a diesel power tech scholarship from Martin. He will attend Illinois Central College, in East Peoria, for two years to earn an Associate's degree in

Diesel Power Technology. Students may choose what school to attend.

Jack will also be doing intern duties at the Martin's Kewanee dealership on U.S. Route 34,



Amy Nelson added that interns will be paid \$17.50 an hour while attend-

ing school. That increases to \$20 per hour after graduating from college.

After a complicated schedule of college credits for two years, Jack will graduate ready to start his career. At first, he will be supervised while an intern with "set-ups" of smaller equipment. He will then move on to inspections and preventative maintenance on larger pieces of equipment, eventually working on combines. Typically this process will take two to five years to get to combines, depending upon the individual.

In addition to paying 75 percent of a student's tuition, Martin provides students with a tool allowance.

Jack's grade point average is 3.85 out of 4.0 and, while in high school, he prepared himself for his chosen field by taking various Ag classes, some of which were dual-credit courses at Black Hawk College.

Once graduated from college, Jack

will have the option of working at any of Martin's 13 dealerships, be it Kewanee, Galesburg or any other location. He is obligated to work for Martin for four years.

Martin Tractor decided as a company to recruit and retain diesel techs in an effort to mold them to the company's needs, Nelson said.

"This is a pretty specialized field and Martin is a very good company that is investing in young people by giving them this great opportunity," she said.

While Jack's hobby is tinkering with motors, he also is a runner and fisherman, something he may not have time for while learning to become a diesel technician.

Barbara and Bill Winans are Jack's grandparents and his sister, Holly, is a senior at Stark County High School. Barbara indicated that Holly intends to become a life-flight nurse.

Scott was arrested and originally charged in October of 2020 for an incident at a North Modena Road residence. Court documentation showed that Shawna D. Cassidy called the Stark County Sheriff's Office stating that she and her children had locked themselves in a bathroom

because there was a man outside the bathroom with a gun.

After court Friday, Cassidy said in the hallway that she and the children were "not held hostage." At some point during the incident two years ago, Cassidy and her children went to a neighbor's residence.

Nuding went to the neighbor's residence first upon his arrival at the scene, then traveled to Scott's residence. Nuding made contact with Scott, but remained at a distance from him not knowing if Scott had a firearm. While conversing with Scott, Scott fired three shots from his firearm according to Nuding's report. Scott then placed the firearm against

Memories of drives many summers ago

My grandfather, Elwood Lampe, makes more sense to me every day.

Some of that is due to maturity, some due to common experiences that we only now share. Either way, the end result is a happy one.

Perhaps you had a grandpa like mine. He had big, tanned hands and always seemed larger than his actual stature. When we were little, he often wore a tired smile after he was done working, but he was still willing to talk or to offer a lap for sitting. One of

my favorite pictures is of grandpa in his chair, still wearing the white t-shirt he wore into the field. He's obviously exhausted, but he's smiling, even though my brother and I are squirm-

ing all over him.

Elwood was a World War II veteran, but never talked about The War until the last years of his life. He saw the need to serve and to do his duty, but didn't see much glory in it all. While that was once confusing, his logic now makes sense.

I have vivid memories of him spraying his corn field out of an open cab tractor, a yellow umbrella his only protection from the elements or from the "more effective" chemicals of that era. Even then, making a living off farming was a near thing. So he worked several jobs: township assessor, Funk's G seed salesman. But he was proudest of farming, which for him ended in 1979, before interest rates went crazy and bankrupted so many.

Grandpa's sale bill shows a 1967 No. 55 John Deere combine, a 1967 John Deere 4020 tractor, a 1962 John Deere 4010 tractor, a Deere No. 1240 four-row planter and plenty of other green implements. Nothing new, but all running well. He called the sale, "The worst day of my life."

We spent most summers in Iowa and one year we helped grandpa walk the beans. Every morning my brother and I got up early and trudged through dew-drenched spider webs to hack at cockleburs, milkweed and velvet, grandpa's mortal enemies. Seems he paid us \$3.50 an hour, which made us rich by summer's end.

After all that time in the field, it baffled me that most evenings we'd pack up into his big four-door Oldsmobile and go look at those same fields. Grandma came too and provided the mints that made the drives worthwhile. We'd inspect grandpa's crops, which didn't take long, since farming was on such a smaller scale then. If we saw a weed in rows we had walked, he'd tell us who missed it. The next morning, we'd go back and get that weed, then try to do better.

After we were done eyeballing his ground, we'd keep going, surveying the neighbors. As good a person as he was, grandpa was not perfect. Every now and then he'd point to a weedy field with crooked rows and mutter under his breath. Only as I got older did I learn his term for such an operation: Horseshit farmer.

Ironically, in the years since, those are the farmers we sought out during returns to Buena Vista County, since they often had weed patches that offered cover for the pheasants we sought. Only a few still remember Elwood, who died in 1996.

After his funeral, I visited his desk in the breezeway – a glorious office space between the garage and house. He spent every morning and evening at that desk, taking cryptic notes while listening to farm reports on the radio. Sitting there, I opened the top right drawer and found a notebook filled with prices for corn and bean, faithfully recorded every day. In another notebook was a log of farm improvements. Buildings built. Fence taken down. Fields tiled. The last entry, in his unmistakable hand, read, "I hope we left it better than we found."

I am no farmer. But after heavy rains last Thursday left time for conversation at Mike Hanley's Kickapoo Creek Saloon, I found myself driving to look at our 40 acres, something that is happening with increasing regularity. The corn is coming nicely and stood above pools of standing water. There's tiling that needs to be done. Even my non-farmer eyes can see

What that field will make remains to be seen, leaving months of worry ahead. Some is my own doing. When corn started moving past \$7 a bushel for October delivery, I sold some. It's scary to be on the hook for something that doesn't exist, but this was important. Someday, God willing, I'll tell Elwood about the day his grandson sold corn for \$7 a bushel. His smile will be wide. Even just imagining that conversation brings me peace.



ISU Teacher's Civil War regiment included local men

The 33rd Illinois Infantry, which originated at Illinois State University in Normal, was famously known as the "Teacher's Regiment" since a high number of the men were students. The nickname was a nod to the original purpose of ISU, which was teacher training.

A number of men from Toulon and Wyoming were in the 33rd, which holds a special place in the history of both the university and the state.

The outbreak of the Civil War in April 1861 riveted the university, which had been founded only four years before as the state's first public institution of higher learning. Many students remembered that the war was foremost on students' minds

and they could barely concentrate on their studies.

Lincoln's first call for troops was for a 90-day enlistment. Soon it became apparent that more time and men were needed. As one student wrote, the Illinois State president, Charles Hovey, eventually suggested that the Normal men should become prepared for the call to action.

As a result, Hovey organized the students into a quasi-military unit. An old brickyard near the school was converted into a parade ground, and a local military leader was hired as drillmaster.

Nearly all male students and many teachers joined in, and female students watched the daily drills with anticipation. The group was eventually dubbed the "Normal Rifles" and became a daily part

of life at Illinois State.

The 90-day enlistments expired in July as scant military action had ensued, and Lincoln called for 500,000 more volunteers. Hovey accompanied Jesse Fell, an energetic Bloomington businessman and close Lincoln friend, to Washington during the third week of July, seeking authority to organize what he dubbed a "Schoolmaster's Regiment."

Just after the Union debacle at First Bull Run, Lincoln granted permission for Hovey's plan. Hovey returned to Bloomington and within a short time, over 900 men signed up for the regiment, including at least 46 Normal students and teachers.

The regiment was eventually mustered at Camp Butler near Springfield on Sept. 18, 1861, as the 33rd Illinois Volunteer Infantry. Many of the Normal students in the 33rd, including the bulk of the "Normal Rifles," went into Company A.

Dozens of other Illinois State students enlisted in other regiments. In all, at least

Continued from Page 8 117 members of the university community were in uniform. At least 15 Normal men served as officers in African-American units.

In a time of lower literacy levels, the Normal men stood out in the ranks. The 33rd became famously known as the "Teacher's Regiment" or "Normal Regiment," though some simply called it the "Brains Regiment."

The regiment included some Stark County men, though not all were ISU students. One that was a

"Normal man," however, was Cary Judson Gill of Toulon, who was the original first lieutenant of Company B. He was promoted to captain on Jan. 23, 1863.

Other county men were scattered across Company B of the 33rd, and some never made it home. One was Murray Hotchkiss, a Toulon man whose vocation was listed as "farmer." He died of disease in a St. Louis hospital on Dec. 20, 1861, just four months after enlisting at age 18.

Another Toulon casualty was Charles Johnson, who was listed as a "waiter." He have much force in it." died at Ironton, in southeastern Missouri, on Feb. 6, 1863, at age 19. Then there was Andrew McKee, 23, a farmer from Toulon, who died at Pocahontas, Ark. on May 3, 1862.

Like most Illinois troops, the 33rd saw little action early in the war. But on July 7, 1862, Hovey was ordered to lead a brigade, including the 33rd, across the Cache River against two Texas cavalry regiments.

The ensuing battle was nearly a disaster as the Federals were overrun, but Hovey and his men stabilized the situation quickly. In 1993, acclaimed Trans-Mississippi theater historian William Shea wrote that "in a moment of inspiration, Hovey dismounted and picked up a rifle and cartridge box from a wounded soldier. He walked forward a few yards, found an unoccupied tree, and methodically began to load and fire in the general direction of the enemy."

Hovey managed to fire two or three rounds before he was struck in the chest by a spent bullet. Shea wrote that Hovey "picked up the bullet and shouted above the din that the reThe tide of the battle

soon switched from retreat to advance, which carried the fight for the Union.

The 33rd was also involved in siege of Vicksburg The assault of May 22, 1863, was particularly brutal for Illinois troops, including the 33rd. Of the 250 men of the regiment who participated, at least 76 were hit, with 12 dead on the field and several others mortally wounded.

The 33rd later served in the Red River campaign of 1864 and the offensive against Mobile the following year. The regiment was finally mustered out on Dec. 6, 1865.

In all, 10 Illinois State students sacrificed their lives for the Union. In the decades that followed, the university became renowned for the number and accomplishments of alumni in public education. Many of those alumni were veterans of the 33rd.

Continued from Page 11 16th in 110 hurdles with a personal record of 16.31.

Orwig finished eighth in shot put with a throw of 50 feet, 2.25 inches. His personal best coming in was 52-1.25, which would have been good for fifth place in Class 1A had he replicated that throw.

"Did he leave a few feet on the table? Yes," Frey said. "But he did the best he could for the day. For him to be on the podium after just missing last year was really good.

"The reality is he did exceptional." Frey said he thinks Orwig is the first Stark County athlete to earn a state medal in shot put. And he noted that Orwig had won the shot put at every other meet in which he competed this outdoor season.

"Blake was in a tough spot because he didn't really have any competition to push him all year until the end,"

Frey said.

Stark County senior Colby Carroll also qualified for state and placed 15th in the 300 hurdles in a time of 42.95 seconds during prelims.

"Colby had been in the low 41s in practice over at Galva," Frey said. "But he didn't get that first hurdle cleanly [at state], and after that it was a bit of a struggle for him. We still felt like it was a pretty good performance for him."



Newton, Orwig earns medals

For The Prairie News CHARLESTON - Even after all their wins at track meets over the past four years and numerous school records, one final honor had eluded Stark County High School track standouts Keagan Newton and Blake Orwig.

But last Saturday, the two seniors added that last bit of hardware to their trophy cases: medals from the IHSA Class 1A state track meet.

In an impressive performance at Saturday's finals at Eastern Illinois University, Newton had three personal record jumps in the triple jump. His best, a leap of 43 feet, 1.75 inches, earned Newton fifth place in Class 1A. Newton had been tied for ninth after prelims on May

"He really showed up when it was needed" Rebels Coach Bart Frey said. "And in [his best jump], he was a foot behind the board when he took off. If he could have put that together he would have been right there" with state champion Mason

Kooi of Springfield Lutheran, whose winning jump was 44-1.25.

Frey said Newton had been battling "ankle stability" most of this season. So they taped one ankle in prelims and then went ahead and taped both ankles for the finals.

"I think that really helped him," Frey said. "Plus, he's a strong little kid that's going to do whatever he needs to when adversity is in front of him."
