Bailey, Hathaway, Stoller, Weaver winners in primary

Gov. JB Pritzker will find out Nov. 8 whether spending millions to pick his Republican foe was a good idea or not.

After trailing in polls a few months ago, State Sen. Darren Bailey (R-Xenia) won the Republican gubernatorial primary held Tuesday. Bailey led a crowded Republican field with 57.5 percent of the vote. Jesse Sullivan was at 15.7 percent and early frontrunner Richard Irvin was third at 15 percent.

Pritzker, who won easily on the Democrat side with 91.5 percent of votes cast, spent heavily on ads for Bailey in the primary, a prac-

tice that seems certain to end before the general election.

The Republican governor race was one of the most interesting statewide in an unusual June primary that saw light turnout in many areas and was necessitated in part by a protracted process of redrawing Illinois voting maps.

In Stark County, turnout was 24.39 percent while in Henry

County turnout was 21 percent, which is better than Peoria County's 18 percent turnout.

Locally, one of the more interesting races involving a new district saw Travis Weaver defeat Pekin Mayor Mark Luft to serve as State Rep. in the 93rd district. Weaver had 63.6 percent of the vote to beat Luft, who was technically the incumbent, though his

district changed dramatically.

Weaver did better than that in Stark County, outpacing Luft 401-145 for 73.4 percent. Weaver won in Henry County 1,648-982 for 62 percent.

The race was much closer for incumbent State Sen. Win Stoller of Germantown Hills in the new 37th Senate District. Stoller outpaced Brett Nicklaus of Dixon, 11,122-10,595 votes for 51.2 percent. Stoller dominated in Stark County, 191-42 and in Henry County, 979-479.

In Henry County, Colby Hathaway of Galva defeated Lance Camp of Kewanee for the 14th Judicial Circuit Judge nomination, 2,817-2,343. Hathaway is

Henderson County State's Attorney and will be Republican nominee to replace Judge Jeffrey O'Connor.

In Knox County, former Deputy Douglas Sampson topped Williamsfield Police Chief James Robertson in the Democratic primary, winning by a mere 30 votes. Sampson moves on to run against Republican Jack Harlan and Independent Zachary A. Cox.

Also on the Democrat ballot, Knox County Public Defender David M. Hansen of Galesburg outpaced Jim Harrell of Rio, 611-273, to fill a vacancy as a Judge of the Circuit Court for the Ninth Judicial Circuit.

PROLIFIC LIFE IN PROGRESS

Lived experience Service, the spice of life for Robison

BRADFORD – Living a life that has had enough experiences for three people, James "Jim" Edward Robison committed himself for decades to the organizations he participated in, be it the Scottish Rites (a Masonic association) or driving a school bus for 40 years.

In his personal life, Jim and Louise Myrtle (Yepson) Robison have been married for 63 years, which testifies to Jim's dedication to someone, as well. The Robisons were married in Neponset on June 7, 1959, by a blind Methodist minister.

The Robisons have six children:

Diane (deceased at age 32), Tim, Thomas, Janelle, Sheila and Greg. They are also proud of their 9 grandchildren and 14 great-grandchildren.

Jim's life experiences include serving on the Stark County board from 1978-86, being a volunteer fireman for 30-plus years, helping organize the Bradford Rescue Squad in 1975 and serving on it for 27 years and continuing to be a

Mason from age 21 to today.

Jim, 84, was born Sept. 3, 1937, in Marshall County on a farm located seven miles southeast of Bradford. His parents are Stanley J. and Jennie Bell (Evermon) Robison, who lived in the Milo area in the early 1900s.

"We moved to Wyoming, and I was in the first grade down there for just the first grade," Jim said.

Galva council hears golf-cart complaint

GALVA – The Galva City Council heard a complaint submitted by a resident about golf carts in Galva carrying small children with no seat belts or car seats.

The complainant said they witnessed a golf cart carrying a small child which ran a stop sign, hit a bump and threw the child off. The complainant also noted that she witnessed another golf cart with four in the front seat, some small children and two in the back.

Police Chief Kraig Townsend said he had spoken to Mayor Rich Volkert about Galva possibly changing its ordinance to check golf carts once a year. Chief Town-

After moving to a farm 7 miles northeast of Bradford, Jim attended the Mason School in Bureau County for grades 1-4, then went to Milo for 5th grade and after the school consolidated was at Bradford for grades 6-8 and at Bradford High School, graduating in 1955.

"I bought a new car in August of 1955, a Bel Air Sports Coupe Chevy," Jim said. "I started working in Ohio, Indiana and Illinois for the next couple of years putting up round steel bins."

After that, Jim worked for Harvey Winslow putting up bins in the Stark County area for a year. Then he went to work for FS, in Wyoming, in 1958. Jim worked in the feed department there and eventually "took

over" the department selling feed.

"After I was at FS for a year or so, I went to being a feed manager at an elevator, in Annawan. I was there from 1960 to 1965," Jim said.

"I came back to Bradford to run the Standard Oil route. I was in the Standard Oil business for 40 years, owning my own business."

In 1965, Jim drove a school bus in Milo for three years until all the small schools consolidated into Bradford. He drove a school bus for the next 40 years for Bradford schools retiring from that, in 2006.

Jim was classified 1A in the military draft but never called for duty. "I was called to go to Princeton [for the draft board] and I said I had three children and worked in Annawan. The woman there wrote me a card

and told me that I wouldn't go now," Jim remembered.

The Robisons over the years have seen Bradford go from a thriving village with a center of commerce to today's few businesses on Main Street.

"When I was a kid, we would bring in eggs and cream to Paul Manning and exchange those for groceries, on a Saturday night. Bradford would be full (of people)," Jim recalled.

A surprising fact of Jim's life is that he would drag race cars at Cordova. "Around town here, there was always someone wanting to race. We had a hangout at Jim Johnson's out at the [Route 40 and 93] junction," Jim explained.

"We've had a successful life," Jim stated, encapsulating his full lifetime.

ELECTION: Salvi to face Duckworth in Senate race

Here are preliminary results in other elections:

- **U.S. Senate** – Attorney

Kathy Salvi of Mundelein was the leader among seven Republicans vying to run against incumbent Sen. Tammy Duckworth in November. Salvi had 30.3 percent of the vote, while Peggy Hubbard was at 24.7 percent and Matt Dubiel was third at 12.7 percent.

- **Congress, 16th Congressional District** – Rep. Darin LaHood won easily with 66.3 percent in the Repub-

lican Congressional primary against retired Rockford engineer Walt Peters, Rockford attorney JoAnne Guillemette and Minooka business owner Michael Rebresh.

- **Attorney General** – Greenville Attorney Thomas DeVore will face Democrat Kwame Raoul in November despite spending the least of three candidates in the primary.

DeVore collected 44 percent of the vote compared to 35 percent for Deerfield Attorney Steve Kim.

- **Secretary of State** – In the race to replace Jesse White, former State Treasurer Alexi Giannoulias will be the Democrat nominee after collecting 52.9 percent of the vote. His foe will be Republican Dan Brady, who won easily with nearly 77 percent.

would rather see police spend their time on junk vehicles than "harrass people on golf carts."

Chief Townsend said his department has registered several carts from out-of-town residents who come to Galva to drive them. And he noted that seat belts and car seats apply for children on golf carts.

He said there have been no accidents reported involving carts, aside from a vandalism incident in Washington Park when a cart ran over some small trees.

No action was taken on the golf carts at Monday nights meeting

City administrator David Dyer said Bow Renewables is looking to install solar panels on Galva's closed landfill property. He said they would give a one-time payment for parks and recreation of \$50,000, a yearly \$10,000 scholarship and would hire workers within a 50-mile radius of Galva.

The council approved a recommendation by the Planning Commision for Ethan Olson at 116 SW 4th St. to replace his old garage with a new one that will be closer than the required property-line offset.

The July council meeting was also rescheduled from July 25 to July 18.

More to high gas prices than President Biden

To the Editor:

Yes, Richard Schrimp, inflation and the high price of oil and gas continues to be major news. You believe that President Biden’s actions caused this but let’s look a little closer.

The Keystone pipeline is in operation bringing crude oil from Canada to the Gulf refineries. The construction that was stopped was the spur, Keystone pipeline XL. Even if this project was finished, experts say it would not relieve our pump prices.

There are over 9,000 permits available for drilling on federal lands that aren’t being used; besides it takes years to go from permit to production. Actually, the Biden administration is now being sued by environmental groups for over 3,500 permits it did approve in their first 16 months.

When President Biden took office, our country was still dealing with

COVID and we were still unvaccinated, hoping for our lives to return to normal. Last year there was little demand for oil, and prices were very low. Oil companies reduced production and even before Russia invaded Ukraine, supply was starting to lag behind demand.

This year’s first-quarter profits for the top five oil companies alone (Shell, ExxonMobil, BP, Chevron, and ConocoPhillips) brought in more than 200 percent more in profits than in the first quarter of 2021 – more than \$35 billion in profits in just three months.

U.S. gas prices remain low when compared to the rest of the developed countries who are also facing inflation and shortages. The average cost of a gallon of gas in Canada for April-June was over \$6.50. Yes, we Americans are facing financial challenges but we should look at the big picture and be proud to live in the U.S.
