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## Every statewide office, General Assembly seat on line Nov. 8

SPRINGFIELD – In the Tuesday, Nov. 8, election, Illinois voters will cast a ballot on a state constitutional amendment, every statewide constitutional office, every seat in the General Assembly and, in 12 counties, a spot on the state's Supreme Court.

For more information about voting, including how to and where to cast an in-person ballot on election day and prior to it, you can visit your local election authority. You can find informa-



tion for all local election officials on the Illinois State Board of Elections website.

As of Monday, the Illinois State Board of Elections had reported 590,333 early votes had already been cast, including 362,604 mail-in ballots, 224,595 early in-person ballots and 3,134 grace-period ballots.

### Governor

Gov. JB Pritzker is facing off against state Sen. Darren Bailey, a Republican farmer from downstate Xenia. The candidates' views diverge widely on just about every topic, from abortion to state spending to pandemic response to addressing gun crime. The Libertarian candidate is Scott Schluter.

The candidates' differences are

demonstrated by Bailey's voting record on some of the major policy proposals backed by Pritzker. Bailey was a "no" vote on almost all of them, saying in one public appearance that he'd like to repeal "everything" Pritzker signed into law during his first term.

Bailey voted against the state's operating budget each year, saying it contains wasteful spending. Pritzker, meanwhile, has cited those budgets as the reason Illinois was able to pay down a backlog of unpaid bills that ballooned to \$16 billion under Republican Gov. Bruce Rauner, along with other interest-accru-

ing debt.

Bailey also opposed the legalization of marijuana and a \$45 billion public works infrastructure plan. The public works plan was funded by a measure that doubled the motor fuel tax and increased license-related fees, as well as a gambling expansion. Bailey voted against both proposals.

He was one of just 13 lawmakers to vote against a measure capping insulin prices for some insurance plans, and he voted "no" on increasing the minimum wage to \$15 hourly by 2025.

## Report card shows COVID learning loss

SPRINGFIELD – Student test scores continued to fall last year but new data shows Illinois' students are on the path to recovering from the learning loss that occurred during the pandemic.

Numbers from standardized tests administered last spring show steep declines in the percentage of students who met or exceeded state standards in English language arts and math compared to 2019, the last year tests were administered before the pandemic.

Those numbers were reported in the latest state report card from the Illinois State Board of Education. In addition to test results, the report card includes information on a wide range of education metrics.

While proficiency rates were down

## Q&A with candidates for Knox Co. Sheriff

Two candidates are running for Knox County Sheriff. Here are questions and answers from the two candidates, Republican Jack Harlan and Democrat James Robertson.

across the board, State Superintendent Carmen Ayala said the growth students are showing is improving, suggesting strategies to help students catch up in their academics are working.

ISBE devised a new metric this year to track growth rates. This year's report card suggests students in 2022 showed greater growth than their academic peers in 2019. Overall, only 27.4 percent of third graders in Illinois met or exceeded state standards in reading, down from 36.4 percent in 2019. A 2010 study by the Annie E. Casey Foundation found that students who are not proficient in reading by third grade are four times more likely to drop out of high school.

Likewise, eighth-grade math proficiency is considered crucial to future success in science, technology, engineering and math. Last year, only 23.1 percent of Illinois eighth-graders scored proficient in math, down from 32.6 percent in 2019.

The four-year graduation rate in 2022 was 87.3 percent, the highest in 12 years, and 64 percent of Illinois' 2020 graduates enrolled in a post-secondary program within 12 months of graduating – down from 75 percent in 2016.

Also released was a U.S. Department of Education "national report card" that showed in 2022, the majority of states saw average scores decline in both reading and math compared to 2019. Illinois actually fared better than many states on the USDE scale.

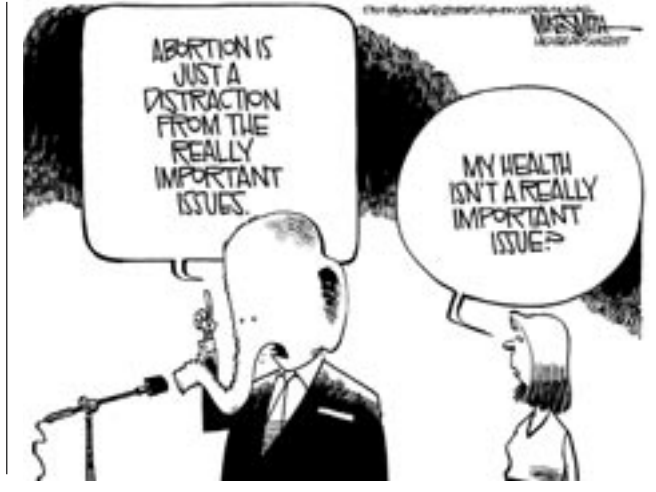

## Vote no on 'Workers' Rights Amendment'

To the Editor:

Next Tuesday, I am voting "No" on the proposed Illinois Amendment 1, which has the misleading nickname, "Workers' Rights Amendment."

Proponents of the amendment want us to believe that it protects the rights of all workers in Illinois, but that is not true. This amendment only enshrines and greatly expands the bargaining rights of public sector unions. Private sector unions get no benefit because they are governed by federal law which preempts any state regulations. Thus, if this amendment is vetoed by the voters, workers both public and private will lose none of the rights they now have.

This amendment, if approved by voters, would make Illinois' public sector unions, including teachers' unions, the most powerful unions in the United States. Very few states even mention labor unions in their constitutions and for good reason. Such amendments take away the ability of lawmakers to effectively negotiate with these unions on behalf of us, the taxpayers.

This amendment is vaguely worded with terms like "economic welfare" rights and "safety" rights. These concepts are undefined in the proposed amendment, leaving the door open to unlimited interpretation. Rest assured the vagueness is no accident.

I'm especially concerned with how this could affect the ability of our communities to control the curriculum in our schools. Teachers' unions could work controversial issues, such as critical race and gender theories, into their labor negotiations with school boards. Any public sector union could use such tactics to negotiate pay raises and pension increases.

That this amendment found its way onto the ballot is a prime example of

the power these public sector unions already have.

If you're a parent, a taxpayer, or a private sector worker, there is nothing in this amendment that is good for you. I'm not ready to give free rein to these unions. I'm not ready to pay even more outrageous property taxes, a sure result of unbridled union demands. I'm not ready to give up even more control of what goes on in our communities' schools. If we vote "No" on this amendment, nobody will get hurt and everyone, including our children, will benefit.

## Illinois unions already have enough power

To the Editor:

We citizens of the United States of America take pride in having the right and freedom to make personal decisions according to our circumstance. Employees should have the right and freedom to decide if they want to be part of a collective bargaining unit and band together for their common good.

According to SmithAmundson LLC 2022, "The National Labor Relations Act protects unions and private sector employees in their ability to organize and bargain collectively over wages, hours, working conditions and other issues in the workplace. The Illinois Public Labor Relations Act does the same for public sector workers. The "Workers Rights" amendment will prevent the passage of any law or local ordinance aimed at allowing an individual to decide if he/she wants to join a union or not, without the loss of their job. It would prevent the needed change to the Illinois pension act."

According to Cause IC 2022, "There are 2,901 labor unions in Illi-

nois. Combined, these Illinois unions employ 13,083 people, earn more than \$1 billion in revenue each year, and have assets of \$2 billion."

It seems evident that these present safeguards are working quite well. According to the United States Bureau of Labor Statistics:

- 46.4 percent of Illinois public sector employees are unionized, compared to a national average of 33.9 percent.
- 8.7 percent of workers in Illinois' private sector are union members.
- 25 percent of employed military veterans are unionized in Illinois, compared to 15 percent nationally.
- Union workers in Illinois enjoy an average of 11 percent higher wages than their nonunion counterparts, compared to 10 percent nationally.

There appears to be no rational reason to adopt a constitutional amendment that would put any changes or corrections to that amendment out of the hands of the will of the people in the future.

To conclude, here is a quote from James Madison from 1788. "We may define a republic to be, or at least may bestow that name on, a government which derives all its powers directly or indirectly from the great body of the people, and is administered by persons holding their offices during pleasure, for a limited period, or during good behavior. It is essential to such a government that it be derived from the great body of the society, not from an inconsiderable proportion, or a favored class of it."

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# SHERIFF: Candidates agree, drugs the biggest problem in Knox Co.

environments. I am a leader who leads from the front. I will not require any of the men and women to do something that I myself will not do. I have dedicated my life to serving and defending my country and community for almost 30 years.

I will always have an open door and ear to listen to those upholding the vision of the Knox County's Sheriff's Department. I understand that this office is about "We the People" and I will always have your rights at the forefront and will never falter from my core values of faith, family and service.

**Robertson:** I have 24

years of law-enforcement experience with extensive executive-level experience specifically in law enforcement.

I've worked all facets of the sheriff's department including patrol, jail, state and federal transports, and court-security. I've served as a field training officer and union president, all within the very office I am seeking. My experiences allow me to understand exactly how the sheriff's department operates. I will be able to facilitate necessary changes and address any issues that arise from day one.

*Q: What is the biggest crime problem in Knox County?*

**Harlan:** Drugs. I have readily seen that drugs are the root of most crimes committed. In the case of relapse, many will turn to crime to fulfill their needs. Violent crimes are common among hard drug users for this reason. With the change in the SAFE-T Act, offenders with drug and mental problems will be held in jail so we can get them the help they need.

**Robertson:** Drugs! Specifically, methamphetamine and heroin. These are contributing factors to property crimes like burglaries, thefts and many others. Providing resources so these individuals can seek treatment is an important issue especially when incarcerated. They are provided a list of facilities and resources they can seek when released from the jail, however the task at hand is getting it for them prior to incarceration or on their own accord.

*Q: What is your view of the SAFE-T Act?*

**Harlan:** There are a few things that I agree with in the SAFE-T Act. I'm per-

fectly fine with making us accountable, more transparent and better trained.

However, eliminating cash bail completely is not the way to go. What about victims of crimes? How is this protecting them?

And what happens when someone doesn't show up to court? Judges will no longer be able to issue an arrest warrant if someone doesn't appear. The court will now issue a subpoena and that order has to be taken and served upon that defendant within 48 hours of the hearing. If they are not served, they don't have to appear.

In addition, the SAFE-T Act establishes a cite-and-release procedure for non-violent crimes such as Class B and C misdemeanors, traffic offenses, petty offenses and business offenses. What does that mean? Criminal trespass is a Class B misdemeanor in Illinois and currently law enforcement can detain for this offense. As of Jan 1, 2023, law enforcement will no longer be able to detain for this offense and only issue a citation, unless the suspect fails to provide identification or is a threat to one's self or to the property owner.

We have to do better protecting the victims and property owners and the wording in this bill just doesn't do it right now. In addition, when 100 of 102 states attorney's disagree with the SAFE-T Act and over half of them have filed lawsuits citing constitutionality and public safety concerns, this should be a

warning sign.

**Robertson:** I have the same views of the SAFE-T act as many of my peers in law enforcement. I agree with our current administration seeking litigation to reword many of the reforms as they would limit law enforcement to hold individuals accountable and strip away a vast amount of authority law enforcement needs to enforce statutes.

Trailer bills, as we call them, are nothing new when it comes to new laws however, the sheriff's duties are to enforce statutes impartially, not to make them.

Instead of establishing an opinion or support about reforms, I put more focus on making sure the men and women of the Knox County Sheriff's department will be properly trained to effectively enforce the new reforms come Jan. 1.

I believe it is better to be proactive rather than reactive (prepared) for the upcoming events rather than rely on them being repealed.

*Q: Where did you grow up and where do you live now?*

**Harlan:** I grew up in Abingdon and graduated from Abingdon High School. I currently reside in Knoxville with my wife, Frances Harlan. We have two boys, Noah (22) and Colton (16), and we raised my sister Brittney (25) after my father passed away.

**Robertson:** I mainly grew up in the Wataga-Oneida-Altona area. I graduated from ROWVA High

School and currently live in the Lake Bracken area south of Galesburg.

*Q: What is your law-enforcement background?*

**Harlan:** I have been with the Knox County Sheriff's Department as a full-time deputy since 2016. In addition to completing specialized training, I have been a field training officer, K9 Trainer and handler, lead homicide detective and a member of a specialized task force.

I have also served as the chief of police in East Galesburg, and as a patrol officer in Knoxville and Williamsfield.

Currently I am No. 1 on the sergeants' promotion list at the Knox County Sheriff's Department.

**Robertson:** I joined the sheriff's auxiliary in 1997. In 1998, I worked as a police officer with the Village of East Galesburg and became a correctional deputy in the jail with the Knox County Sheriff's department. During that time, I would fill in on patrol when there was a need. In 2011, I transferred to patrol on a permanent basis. During my tenure as a patrol deputy, I served as a field training officer, as union president for the patrol union and as a second-shift patrol supervisor for a short period before leaving the department in 2020.

In September 2014, I was appointed chief of police in Williamsfield and still serve in that position today. Since December of 2020, I have also worked for the Galva police department as a sergeant.

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## ELECTION: Bailey, Pritzker differ on abortion

He also opposed the Climate and Equitable Jobs Act that increases investment in renewable energy and aims to force fossil fuel producers offline in Illinois over the next two decades, citing the bill's upward pressures on downstate energy prices as his reason for opposing it. Pritzker's refrain in recent debates has been that Bailey "has no plan" for Illinois, and he has painted the Republican as a conservative "extremist." Bailey, meanwhile, has focused his attention on crime, especially in Chicago, as well as taxes and state spending. Bailey said he believes there's \$10 billion to \$15 billion of waste within the state budget, al-

though he hasn't said what he would cut. He frequently mentions his plan for a "zero-based budget," which, he said, means "accounting for every dollar that's spent." He put the responsibility for identifying the waste on the shoulders of yet-to-be-named agency heads. Bailey has also been a staunch opponent to every measure that expanded abortion rights in Illinois in recent years, a point Pritzker has frequently reiterated on the campaign trail. Bailey has recently said he wouldn't try to repeal state abortion laws, because he wouldn't have the backing in the Democratic-controlled General Assembly to do so. He would, however, look

to repeal a criminal justice reform known as the SAFE-T Act, which passed in 2021 on slim Democratic majorities. Pritzker said he will look to pass an amendment to that bill. **Comptroller**  
In Illinois, the position of chief fiscal officer is that of comptroller. Democrat Susana Mendoza has been elected to that post twice, for a partial term in 2016 before gaining reelection in 2018. She touts the reduction of a \$16 billion bill backlog to a standard 30-day billing cycle, the state's largest-ever \$1 billion balance in its rainy-day fund and a pension payment that went \$500 million beyond statutory levels as some of her greatest accomplishments. Her opponent, Shannon Teresi, is a newcomer to state politics and is the McHenry County auditor. It's an experience, she said, that will help her root out "waste, fraud and abuse." **Treasurer**  
The race for treasurer – the state's chief investment officer – pits two-term incumbent Michael Frerichs against Republican Tom Demmer, a deputy minority leader in the General Assembly and House GOP point person on the budget. Frerichs touts more than \$1 billion in investment gains as his greatest achievement while emphasizing his administrative work on returning un-

claimed property, a state college savings plan and other programs overseen by the office. Demmer has focused on being a check on Democratic power when it comes to taxes and budgets. **Secretary of State**  
Incumbent Jesse White is stepping down at the end of his term, creating a vacancy in this office for the first time in 24 years. The race to succeed him features Democrat Alexi Giannoulias, a former state treasurer from Chicago, and Republican State Rep. Dan Brady of Bloomington. Each has plans to modernize the office. While Giannoulias has White's endorsement, the outgoing secretary has also spoken highly of Brady. And Brady has the endorsement of Republican former Gov. and Secretary of State Jim Edgar. **Attorney General**  
Democratic Attorney General Kwame Raoul and Republican private practice attorney Thomas DeVore differ on several issues, with the AG's response to COVID-19 executive orders atop that list. DeVore was a frequent challenger of Pritzker's executive order authority during the pandemic, while Raoul defended that authority in court. They also differ on the SAFE-T Act, which DeVore believes is unconstitutional.

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# Princeville school ups revolving checking account

PRINCEVILLE – The Princeville school district equivalent of a petty-cash fund now has a higher limit.

During its meeting Oct. 20, the Princeville School Board approved raising the district imprest-account maximum to \$7,000. The previous limit was \$5,000.

The district uses the revolving checking account for ongoing, smaller disbursements, according to District Superintendent Shannon Duling. Probably its biggest function is to pay for the cost of athletic officials. The account also funds participation fees for some athletic competitions.

“With all of the games our kids are involved in, we were running out of funds each month,” Duling stated in an email. “When there wasn’t enough in the balance, then we had to either write checks from the Unit Office account or from the activity fund, which makes it an auditing nightmare.”

In other business, the board approved paying N. Zobrist Construction Inc. of Morton no more than \$7,048 to replace a door in the weight room of the junior-senior high school. Ac-

ording to Duling, the door and frame were damaged from constant foot traffic, in part because of a faulty design.

The door was highlighted for replacement during an annual inspection by the Peoria County Regional Office of Education.

Illinois Association of School Administrators representative Tom Leahy up-

dated the board regarding the search for a new school superintendent. The proposed application deadline is Dec. 13. The board is to interview candidates in January and February. A new hire is anticipated by the end of February.

Duling is to depart Princeville following the current academic year. The 12th-year superintendent

and the board did not reach agreement on a new contract.

The board also approved Ashley Reed as seventh-grade girls basketball coach. High school junior varsity baseball coach Doyle Hutton resigned.

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## Peoria-area home sales slowing

PEORIA – While housing sales are down compared to last year, the Peoria Area Association of Realtors still posted the third-highest number of home sales in a third quarter, topped only by record sales over the pre-

vious two years.

PAAR reported that 1,811 homes were sold in the Peoria area in the third quarter of 2022, compared to 2,135 area homes sold between July and September last year, a decline of 15.2 percent.

“We are still seeing strong sales. The quarter was the third highest in PAAR history,” said PAAR President Robin Simpson, noting that the average price for homes sold in the third period was \$172,711, up 6.9 percent over last year, when the average sale price was \$161,584.

Over the first three quarters of 2022, sales are down 14.1 percent compared to the same period last year.

“Higher mortgage rates have had the effect of buyers having to adjust the homes that they’re able to buy – more than slowing sales down,” said Simpson.

The number of homes on the market remains a problem, she said. PAAR records show the inventory of homes in the Peoria area was 11 percent less than in the third quarter of 2021.

As a result, buyers are acting quickly. The average number of days that homes remained on the market for the quarter was 22 compared to 31 days in the third quarter last year.

The average rate for a 30-year mortgage is now 6.92 percent, up from 3.05 percent last year while the rate for a 15-year mortgage is 6.09 percent, up from 2.30 percent last year.

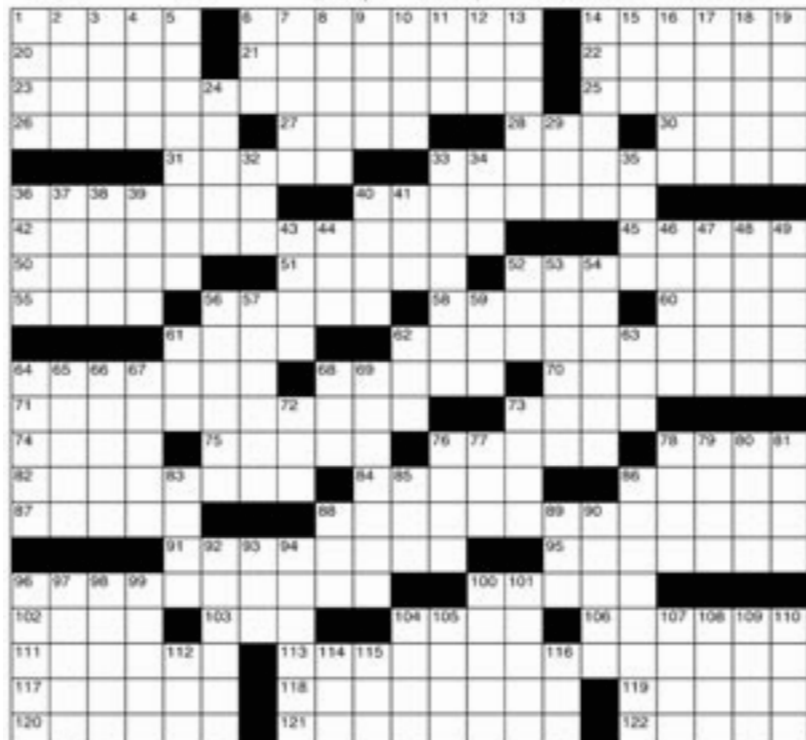

Added Symonds, "If we continue to be strong as a team and trust each other like we have recently and stick together, I think we'll run great."

Also pleased with the sectional result was E-B Coach Gregg Meyers, who had entered the race saying his young boys team had a chance to place second if they ran well. But while the Trojans ran well to finish with 97 points, so did Eureka (74) and El Paso-Gridley (87), who placed second and third respectively behind Normal U-High (41), the top-ranked Class 1A team in Illinois.

"So I wasn't upset at all with the fourth-place finish. We ran well and we set ourselves up to maybe get one more good race in next

week," Meyers said.

One E-B runner who came close to his best was junior Isaiah Hill, who placed fourth in 15:41.92.

"He had another really smart race today. He got himself out at the mile in

good position and then he moved throughout the race," Meyers said. "I think he was 14th at the mile and moved all the way up to fourth. That's about a perfect race there."

Other scoring runners for E-B were freshman Aiden Faulkner (22nd, 16:26), sophomore Mika Nelson (26th, 16:31.88), senior Brendan Williams (27th, 16:32.04) and junior L.J. Higgs (36th, 16:43.02), the last three of whom ran well as a pack at the sectional.

"If we can keep that together (at state), I think we have a chance to finish in the top 10 or hopefully even better," Meyers said. "That's the nice part about (state). We have still have our best race in us, if we can find it."

Two Princeville runners will also compete Saturday at Detweiller Park after finishing among the top 10

runners not on an advancing team. Boys qualifiers were junior Joey Bosch (18th, 16:19.22) and sophomore Tucker Sennett (28th, 16:32.14), while sophomore Alyvia Cowser (22nd, 19:35.29) missed by one place.

Bosch and Sennett are the first Princeville boys to qualify for the state meet.

"Both boys got off to great, fast, but relaxed starts. Joey had a real good idea of where he needed to be and who he needed to be with or ahead of," Princes Coach Jeremy Melick said. "Tucker looked determined to hang with Joey as long as he could. As the race progressed, the boys held their spots and when they crossed the finish line, they had both run lifetime PRs and beat enough people to get to run another week."

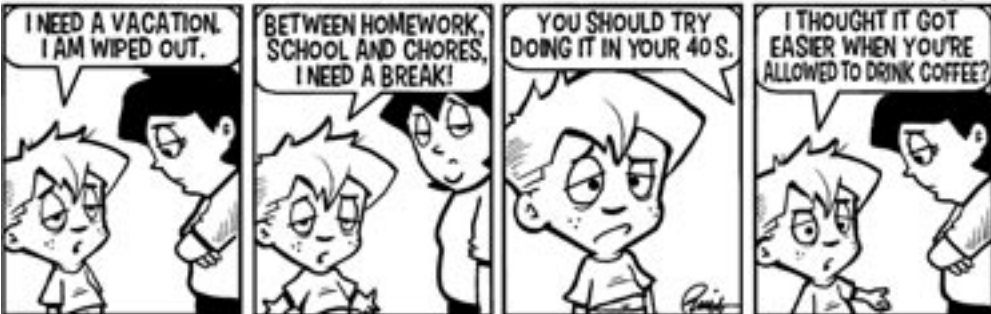

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# E-B plays its best at the end in narrow 16-8 3A playoff loss

GENOA – Make no mistake, Todd Hollis would rather be coaching football this weekend than looking forward to next season.

But if this Elmwood-Brimfield season was to end in the opening round of the state playoffs, at least it ended with the Trojans playing in top form.

E-B (6-4) gave host Genoa-Kingston a big scare Oct. 29 but lost a Class 3A postseason game, 16-8. G-K (7-2) plays a second-round game this weekend at Princeton.

Although the hosts were seeded eighth and the visitors ninth in the northern half of the 32-team 3A bracket, it wouldn't have been a stretch to consider this game a bit of a mismatch.

G-K plays in the Big Northern

Conference, which features teams with state-title histories. The Cogs were ranked in Class 4A during the regular season and were seventh in the final 3A ratings. Unranked E-B plays in a league heavy with 1A and 2A competition.

But following a mid-season lull, the Trojans routed Havana by 46 points in the regular-season finale. That showed Hollis they were ready for the playoffs.

"You just look at our team and you say, 'Man, we made this leap,'" Hollis said. "We played our best football at the end of the year and (against) a team that on paper should have wiped us off the face of the earth."

"We would have liked another quarter of football, let me tell you, and I'm sure they were pretty happy when the horn sounded."

The inadvertent sound of an official's whistle didn't help E-B in this one. G-K led by eight points when it attempted a field goal in the final seconds of the first half, but E-B sophomore Bo Windish blocked it. Classmate Hunter Garretts recovered the ball and was headed almost unimpeded to the opposite end zone when the whistle halted play, according to Hollis.

"The (official) came over to me and said, 'We screwed that up and we can't apologize enough,'" Hollis said. "I said, 'Man, we make our mistakes, too.' The kids were beside themselves, because they see this getting ripped away from them. But you've got to move on with that."

"You drive home and you think about it and think, 'We score that one, we're going to get the two-point (conversion). How does

that change the game? How does that change the momentum?'"

E-B had a couple of second-half drives that reached G-K territory but couldn't be converted into points. However, a lengthy opening drive of the game ended in success.

On fourth down midway through the first quarter, Oliver Heinz passed 17 yards to Jimmy Babcock for a touchdown that helped E-B lead 8-0.

"We were grinding and we were moving, and you get that first score and you're like, 'All right, let's see what the defense does,'" Hollis said. "Each team has the ball for about exactly half of the quarter, and it wasn't like they dashed us. You start to wonder. You're like, 'We're as good as these people.'"

The Cogs capped their ensuing long drive with a tying touch-

down, a 2-yard run by Max Lavender. Following a second-quarter E-B fumble, Brody Engel ran in from 1 yard at 5:19 for the game-winning score.

Engel finished with a team-high 65 rushing yards. Slone Windish ran for 85 to lead E-B.

"To be honest, and Coach Hollis kind of alluded to it, this was the best game they played all season," G-K coach Cam Davekos told the Daily Chronicle of DeKalb. "This was not our best game."

Hollis believes his team had something to do with that.

"It was just an honor to coach our kids, the way they played," he said. "You get to the playoffs with the goal of being at your zenith, at your absolute strongest and highest level of performance. And then we went out and played that way."

me.' It was a huge play in the game. If you've had told me we were gonna win the special-teams battle, I'd have said you were nuts. But we did."

The much-heralded Duley – who is heading to the U of I as a punter – also missed field goals of 47 and 38 yards and an extra point, though he did force a touchback on every kick-off and made a 28-yard field goal.

Still, EP-G needed its big foot to be on against a Farmington team that racked up 500 total yards. In the first half, the Farmers relied mainly on the run to rally after yielding first-quarter scores on a 72-yard run and a 44-yard pass.

"You get down two scores and it can go one of two ways," Vallas said. "I'm just glad we chose this path."

Behind the hard running of senior Rese Shymansky (85 yards), Farmington finally got on the board after Shymansky pounded in a 1-yard run

late in the first. Not long after, another drive of nine runs and three passes led to a Logan Utt 4-yard scoring run to knot the game.

Then, after one of two interceptions on the day by Colin Terrell, Farmington ran on 9 of 11 plays before facing a fourth-and-10 at the EP-G 11-yard line. Speedy senior Logan Morse ran a slick delay route across the middle to take advantage of EP-G's run-stopping linebackers and took a short pass into the end zone with 23 seconds left to give Farmington a lead it would not yield.

The second half offered more of the same, as EP-G tried to stop the run and got burned. First, though, came "the pitch." After getting bottled up on a run, Shymansky made an unscripted lateral to Renken, who promptly took it 41 yards to paydirt for a 27-14 lead.

"We've never practiced that. It was kind of in the heat of the moment and

we made a play," Renken said.

"I love Rese, but he better never do it again," Vallas said.

While EP-G rallied for three more scores, the visitors were unable to stop the Farmington pass game thereafter. After EP-G got within 26-23, Renken hooked up with Morse on a diving 24-yard pass play. Then came Haggard's big block and the final Renken to Morse score.

"Once you keep running and running, they are going to focus more on the run and that opened up the passing game a lot more," Renken said.

"They were in a position where they had to stop the run and they had to sell out a little bit and we caught them a couple times," Vallas said.

"Gage is an incredible person and an incredible player. I wouldn't trade Gage for 100 D-1 guys."

win a playoff game.”

That group proved its 34-13 victory in a Lincoln Trail Conference game Sept. 30 at Stark County (5-5) wasn't a fluke.

Bryan Bertlshofer ran for a game-high 144 yards last week, including 5 for a touchdown that gave R-W a 14-0 lead with 8:45 to play in the first half. Then on first down, 55 seconds before intermission, R-W quarterback Riley Danner lofted a 29-yard pass that found a covered Sharp in the end-zone left corner.

The 21-0 Cougars lead helped change a potential Rebels comeback from doable to daunting. “We like to run the ball, but we want to take shots every once in a while,” Gullstrand said. “We kind of looked at that (as) a good opportunity to take one. We had a good one-on-one matchup.”

As it did in the previous matchup against Stark County, R-W started well. Adam Kohl returned the opening kickoff to the Rebels' 44. R-W didn't score but then held Stark County running

back Matthew Henry to no gain twice in a four-and-out drive that stalled at midfield.

Kohl returned the ensuing punt to the Stark County 35. Five plays later, Jack Godsil ran 7 yards into the end zone for the game's first touchdown.

“I was trying to help out as much as I can and the blockers did their jobs, so I just ran to where the open space was and ran hard,” Kohl said. “To be on the other side of the field is a lot easier than to be in enemy territory, so we just try to get the best field position we can.”

Stark County Coach Jade Noard suggested the first few series might have been the worst possible start for his team.

“Those special-teams plays were just killers, I thought – field position and just momentum altogether,” Noard said. “That first drive, we made the stop, but our backs were kind of against the wall. Then you punt it to them and then it's right back there. That's tough to overcome, and we didn't.”

Stark County found a groove in the second half. Nolan Orwig ran for 31 yards in a 14-play drive that opened the third quarter, but the Rebels couldn't score on three attempts within the Cougars' 10. R-W followed with a 16-play drive that ended with Nolan Coverdill's 1-yard TD run and a 28-0 lead.

Junior quarterback Luke Reverts passed for two fourth-quarter Stark County scores.

“Maybe we should have thrown the ball a little bit more early,” Noard said. “We had a little success there at the end. But just too many mistakes to win a playoff game, and to their credit, they didn't make those mistakes.”

The game was delayed about 20 minutes when Stark County junior Connor Wagenbach sustained a dislocated right kneecap on a pass reception with 4:31 remaining in the fourth quarter. The same kneecap also dislocated last year, according to Noard.

An ambulance transported Wa-

Junior Addie Symonds

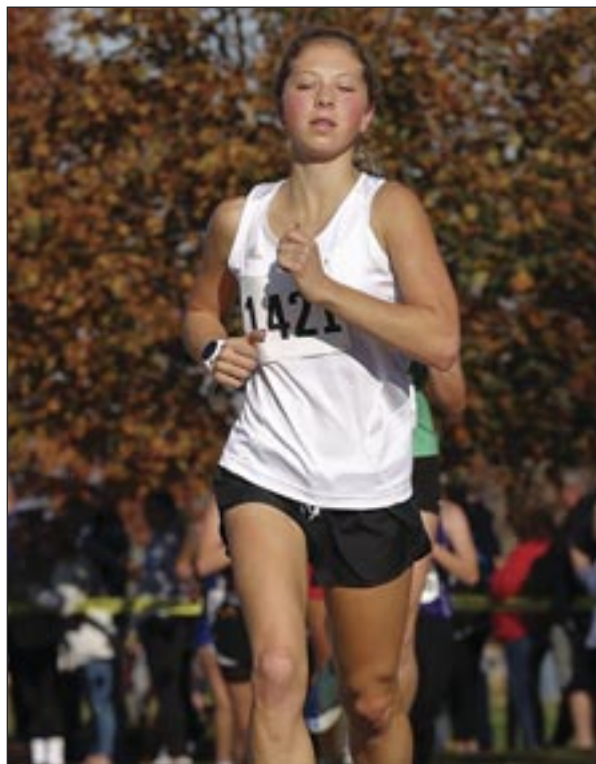
led the E-B effort, placing sixth with a personal-best time of 18:35.42.
