## Brimfield expected to hire Jones as school superintendent

BRIMFIELD – Chad Jones is returning to Brimfield, although part of him never left.

During its meeting Wednesday night, convened after The Weekly Post deadline, the Brimfield School Board was expected to authorize Jones' hiring as the district's new superintendent. Board President Steve Updyke said he foresaw no obstacles to approval.

Jones, 46, has spent the past eight years as an administrator

at Hollis Grade School, located south of Bartonville. For the past five years, he has been superintendent and principal at Hollis, a kindergarten-through-eighth-grade district that has about 135 students.

But Jones resides in Brimfield and was a second-grade teacher there for 16 years before he departed for Hollis.

"I love the community, love

the people, love the kids, love the families that are here," Jones said earlier this week about Brimfield. "There are still teachers in the district that I was hired with. Several teachers I had kind of a peer relationship with. Now I'm going to be their boss.

"It's an interesting dynamic, for sure, but I'm excited about it and looking forward to it."

Jones is to begin his new job July 1. He agreed to a four-year contract, according to Updyke. Jones' initial annual salary is to

be \$132,000, with automatic 4 percent raises each year.

The Brimfield board considered four finalists from among 15 applicants to replace Tony Shinall, who is to begin work July 1 as the superintendent at Princeville.

Updyke suggested the Brimfield background helped Jones but didn't necessarily make his hiring automatic.

"He knows the culture of Brimfield," Updyke said. "When we interviewed him, he was able to answer the questions in depth. He was very confident in the interview, which was great.

"We all went in looking for the best candidate. Even without that (Brimfield) experience, he interviewed the best. He

## SCHOOL BOARD DRAMA

### Controversy at Billtown meeting

WILLIAMSFIELD – The first meeting of the reconstituted Williamsfield School Board became contentious almost immediately.

Within minutes after three new members took oaths of office Monday, an incumbent suggested one of the newbies wasn't fit to become board president. That didn't prevent Chad Goff from being elected by his peers, although not without dissent.

After Goff and Lisa Hanson were nominated for president, Gina Strom distributed to board members and to The Weekly Post a letter from the Galva Police Department. Goff once worked there but now works for the Illinois Department of Transporta-

tion.

The letter Galva Police Chief Kraig Townsend addressed to Goff – dated Dec. 11, 2019 – stated he was being demoted from sergeant to patrol officer because of unacceptable conduct. Tardiness and a redacted "self-assigned police action" were cited.

No other details were available.

"I feel that I can no longer rely on you to responsibly and independently perform your supervisory functions and believe that your demotion is warranted," Townsend wrote.

Strom said the letter was ob-

## Elmwood may charge aldermen for absences

ELMWOOD – The Elmwood City Council probably will have a new member soon.

Meanwhile, current and future members have been put on notice regarding their attendance – or lack of it – at meetings.

During a council meeting May 4, Mayor JD Hulslander said Alderwoman Dara Wagner intends to resign, effective June 1. The Ward 3 representative is moving to Chillicothe at least temporarily to care for a relative, according to the mayor.

Hulslander said he plans to appoint Kenny Blum as Wagner's replacement. Wagner's term is to expire in 2025. Blum might join the council for its meeting June 6.

A delay of about a half-hour in the start of a meeting last

month prompted some council members to address excused and unexcused absences. The required number of members was not present when the meeting April 18 was scheduled to begin, at 7 p.m.

"We're sitting here waiting 35 minutes for a quorum, and sometimes you don't even know if it's going to happen," Alderman Nathan Brunnelson said during the meeting last week.

The council has six members. A quorum requires four to be present. That can consist of four council members, or of the mayor and three members.

Alderman Bob Paige advocated enforcing a city ordinance that fines council members \$25 per unattended meeting, absent a good and sufficient excuse. He and col-

*Continued from Page 1* checked all the boxes we wanted when it came to culture and how he presents himself in public.”

Although he’s been working elsewhere, Jones has kept abreast of what’s been happening in Brimfield. His wife, Alison Jones, teaches at Brimfield Grade School. Their daughters, 15-year-old Jillian and 12-year-old Reese, are Brimfield students.

Chad Jones suggested his family was a primary reason for his interest in the Brimfield job.

“You miss a lot of stuff

when you’re an administrator,” he said. “Schedules would never line up – concerts, all that stuff. You’ve got to pick and choose sometimes as to what’s best. Now I’ll have that opportunity to be around my own daughters and my wife more.”

Jones also will have an opportunity to help mend the Brimfield community, as he sees it.

Board meetings in recent years have been contentious at times. State masking requirements during the COVID pandemic and curriculum

age-appropriateness have been among hot-button issues. The recent school-board election included 10 candidates for four seats, with only one incumbent.

“I feel the community has lost trust in the board and the administrators there,” Jones said. “I don’t know why that happened. It was always a great district to be in, and I wouldn’t say anything bad about anybody who’s been in charge. I just know there’s been some upset people about certain things.

“That first six months are me just getting to know people, taking notes and seeing how I can make things better.”

Updyke suggested Jones

has that ability.

“We feel he’s going to be the perfect post-COVID leader, to kind of bring the district back together,” Updyke said. “He just knows what Brimfield was. He’s a likeable person, very engaging, not confrontational.

“There’s an overall feeling that he will be good for the district going forward.”

Jones is a 1994 graduate of Limestone Community High School in Bartonville. He has a bachelor’s degree from Eastern Illinois University, a master’s degree from Olivet Nazarene University and administration certification from Western Illinois University.

## Of a wonder weed, holy tappers & nasty rashes

Rambling through central Illinois, wishing I had been alive for the hey-day of horse racing.

Sometimes it amazes and comforts me how small life in a small town can be. At lunch last Friday, five of us thirsty souls gathered for a Cinco de Mayo fest at Elmwood's Mi Ran-chito. During a lull in conversation, I mentioned that a weed had poked through newly poured asphalt in the subdivision my youngest once called "the sub-urbs of Elmwood." Two

odds. I like that. And I like being in a small town where a weed fighting through burial and bulldozing is a subject for conversation.

The first time converting to Catholicism entered my mind was years ago in the gymnasium of a large parish in Buffalo, N.Y. I was there with a red-headed girl and, upon entering the gym, was stunned to see beer taps jutting out of one wall. Beer tappers in a church? Sign me up. Over the years, my relationship with Catholicism has deepened, and the small pivot from being raised Lutheran has been a good one, for the most part. But the dated idea that priests can't marry has always bothered me for various reasons - some really troubling, some simple. Let's stick with the simple one today: There are not enough priests! As a result, the Catholic Church faces painful decisions. So far, the answer has been not to allow priests to marry, but rather to consolidate small parishes. The latest exam-ple of this will soon hit close to home. According to our latest bulletin at St. Patrick Church, a new "Growing Disciples" plan unveiled on April 30 in the Peoria Diocese offers various options for mergers, likely including parishes in Elmwood, Brimfield, Kickapoo, Farmington, Princeville

will close. More Catholics will opt for something else on Sundays. And I'll be left pondering the lost potential of those tappers. ... Then again, perhaps making it easier to become a priest won't solve the problem, since many Protestant denominations are facing the same issues as the Catholic Church. But how is it better to have a priest "married to the church" if it means the church has to close?

Parting shot: Reminders arrive regularly of what a clever and helpful group of readers you are. And apparently, the concept of nude gardening - mentioned in last week's column - brings out the best of both traits. **Brad Crisco** of Elmwood saw a benefit to working the ground au naturel. **Unhappy with taxes? Check assessment, exemptions**

To the Editor:

Property tax bills have been arriving. People were looking forward to outdoor activities, graduations and, no, not taxes. The assessment on a property should be a reasonable estimate of what a property would sell for.

You can check peoria-county.gov to check on your assessment and exemptions. Navigate to the "Services" tab and then look on the left side for "Property & Taxes."

If the assessment is in the range of an asking price and a selling price, then it is in the fair-market range. End of discussion.

Do you have the exemptions you should have? On peoria-county.gov, go to the Supervisor of Assessment page and review exemptions. Application forms are also available.

Increased sale prices of homes has driven the equalization rate higher. This is true of all property except farmland, which has



its own rules. Farmhouses are assessed the same as residential property in villages and cities.

If your property assessment is not in the fair-market range, you should appeal. Those forms are also on the Supervisor of Assessments' website.

Good evidence on which to base an appeal, if a property was purchased for a price below assessment, is an appraisal on the property indicating the assessment is above expected sale price. Sales and appraisals should be current.

Property tax funds schools, local government, fire districts, libraries, park districts, etc. These are things that impact our daily lives. When Gov. Jim Edgar was in office, a major shift to unburden

property tax and move to an income-based tax system was proposed. Edgar supported the bill and the Democratic House passed the bill, but the Republican-controlled Senate did not pass the bill. The reform effort died.

Property tax is a regressive tax based on what a sale price would be, even though the owner is not selling their property every year. As the Elmwood Township assessor, I can advise and help with errors. I cannot do anything about your taxes. Instead, call or write your state legislators.

I would note that mega-wealthy political players have funded campaigns against reform. We have a system barely able to pay a teacher what it takes to raise a family in their own

house. This is the reality of our inability to compromise and change a tax system. It is far easier to complain and do nothing.

If your complaint is that your property tax bill is too high, don't call the assessment officials. If there is an error, assessment officials are glad to correct it. These are questions to answer: Is the assessment a reasonable estimate? Are my exemptions correct? Did I use peoria-county.gov to make an informed complaint? Did I write legislators to ask for reform?

# Princeville may hold meetings on pool

PRINCEVILLE – Village officials are preparing for a deeper dive into a possible reopening of the Princeville Aquatic Center.

At least one public meeting might be held this spring or summer to gauge whether area residents support creating a Princeville park district. Such a district could assume control of the aquatic center, which village officials voted in March to shutter. Mounting financial deficits were the primary reason.

Village President Jeff Troutman suggested one or two meetings might be held in June. He mentioned Village Hall and Lillie M. Evans Library as possible meeting sites. An information booth might be established at Princeville Heritage Days, June 22-24.

“These people that want to keep the pool open, it would be their time to come,” Troutman said. “We’ll try to get people to stop by and explain what’s going to need to happen.”

The first step would be a petition that has at least 100 signatures in support of a new park district. That would be enough to trigger a public referendum, Troutman said. He suggested at least 150 to 200 signatures probably would be needed, to withstand potential legal challenges.

Other steps include forming a public committee and finding five people willing to serve on the board of the proposed park district. Geographic boundaries also would need to be determined. Troutman has suggested they could

match the boundaries of the Princeville School District, approximately.

Property-tax funding for a park district also would have to be addressed.

A public survey showed strong support for retaining the aquatic center. Troutman appears interested in seeing if the survey results spur respondents and others to action.

“This would be the time to step up,” he said. “If they don’t step up, we’re just going to have to write it off and go on.”

During a Village Board meeting May 1, Troutman

updated trustees about the potential park-district steps. Among the trustees was Steve Potter, whom Troutman appointed and the board approved earlier in the meeting. Potter filled a vacancy left after Nathan Wineinger resigned in March.

Among action items, the board:

- Approved donating \$3,000 to the Princeville Civic Association to help fund Heritage Days. Last year, the village donated \$2,500, Troutman said.

- Gave High Voltage Ta-phouse permission to es-

tablish an outdoor grill in a public-parking space in front of the business, at 129 E. Main St. The grill is to operate during lunch hours Wednesdays through Saturdays this spring and summer.

- Authorized granting Princeville Pharmacy, 206 E. Main St., up to \$7,500 in tax-increment-financing reimbursement for indoor remodeling.

league Walt Avery said it's been at least 20 years since a council member was assessed such a fine.

"It seems like we're always fighting to get a quorum, (or) to try to get seven people here," Paige said. "The city can't do anything if you don't have a quorum. That's part of the job, to come to the meeting."

Council members' annual pay equals \$150 per meeting, Paige said.

Avery was absent from five of the nine regular meetings conducted so far this year, according to council minutes. Adam Duvall and Wagner have missed four meetings each. Hulslander has been absent for two. Andrew Almasi and Brunnelson have missed one meeting each.

Neither Almasi nor Wagner attended the meeting last week. According to city officials, Almasi was out of town and Wagner was attending a school function. Hulslander said he'll be unable to attend an upcoming meeting because of a business trip to Brazil.

Unless they become habitual, absences because of illness or job commitments and with proper notice are understandable, according to Paige. "But people just don't show up," he said.

Paige and Hulslander suggested members inform City Clerk Bethany Lovingood in advance if they're to miss a meeting and why. Otherwise, they can be subject to the fine.

Avery suggested raising the fine to \$75 per unexcused missed meeting, but no action was taken. Paige didn't appear to rule out a possible increase.

"Twenty-five dollars doesn't seem to bother people," he said. "If you threaten to fine them 25 bucks, they say, 'Big deal, I'm still going to my daughter's thing,' and

(they) still make 125 bucks."

Prior to the punctuality discussion, Brunnelson and Paige were inaugurated for new four-year terms. They and Almasi ran unopposed in the election April 4. Almasi's inauguration is to be determined.

Regarding the probable new council member, Blum retired last year from Ameren Illinois, where he worked in community and public relations.

"He's got a real good, forward-facing personality," Hulslander said.

tained through an Illinois Freedom of Information Act request. She did not say if she made the request. “My conscience won’t let me not share (it),” Strom said of the letter. “I would like everybody to read this and really strongly consider who is the best person for president of our school board.

“I think (this) kind of shows when it comes to police and procedure, this is not someone I would trust to lead this school in the right direction.”

Strom nominated Hanson. New member Brittany Byrd nominated Goff.

They and Jennifer Smith won election last month to the board. The new members replaced incumbents Lora Kutkat, Teresa Stewart and Jolene Tucker, none of whom ran for reelection. Stewart was the previous board president.

Byrd said the Galva letter didn’t change her support for Goff, which Strom said didn’t surprise her. But Board Member Wes Wrage, who said he hadn’t known about the letter, questioned Goff about Townsend’s statements.

“I worked in a small town that knew I was leaving for IDOT, and he was upset about it,” Goff said

about Townsend. “I had already informed him I was leaving.”

Goff also said the state performed a background check before he was hired at IDOT.

Ultimately, Goff was elected 4-2, with Wrage abstaining. Goff voted for himself. Byrd, Smith and April Bouchez voted for him. Strom voted for Hanson, who voted for herself.

Bouchez was retained as vice president. Hanson was elected secretary, to replace Tucker. All officers’ terms are for two years.

The rest of the meeting wasn’t as eventful. Goff and Superintendent Tim Farquer spent about 30 minutes going over monthly bills. Most of the discussion entailed Farquer explaining to Goff the nature of some expenses.

Farquer also indicated the district’s new fleet of eight electric buses might not be available for the start of the 2023-24 academic year.

Delivery is scheduled for Aug. 1, but Farquer said he hasn’t received an update recently.

“The moral of the story is we can’t get rid of our diesel buses until we know when we’re going to get our electric buses,” Farquer said. “Because we can’t not have buses.”

Even after the electric buses are delivered, the district plans to retain one diesel bus. Farquer suggested that bus will be used for longer road trips, including those to athletic events.

“Until we see them run, I don’t have confidence taking an electric bus to Midland in January when it’s zero degrees out,” Farquer said about a 55-mile trip to Varna. “That 50-mile mark starts to make me nervous when it’s cold. Or when it’s hot.”

Following a closed session, the board approved hiring Jeff Hannam and Courtney Newell as full-time certified staff.



# Farmington adds new school board member

FARMINGTON – The Farmington School Board added one new member Monday and said goodbye to another.

Stu Cunningham was sworn in to replace Kay Faralli, who stepped down after eight years on the board and earned thanks from fellow members.

Before Cunningham's swearing-in, Faralli and the "old board" had a busy agenda that included recognizing 23 students of the month, awarding the Helen Haggerty Farmer Award to 2nd-grade teacher Jeni Fauser and honoring numerous successful extracurricular groups and two retirees, 30-year custodian Jeff Ossman and 29-year teacher Ann Ricconi.

The old board also had business to act on, including renewing its insurance policy with Property Casualty Insurance. Cost of the district's insurance for 2023-24 will increase from \$157,836 to \$213,907. Of that increase, \$46,423 is for added workers-compensation costs incurred by taking over the transportation department and hiring bus drivers and staff.

Incidentally, Director of Student Services Toby Valas said all bus drivers have

been hired. "We seem to be in good shape," he said of the conversion.

The board rejected a lone bid for parking lot resealing from Tazewell County Asphalt. The bid of \$135,481 was nearly 30 percent higher than an engineer's estimate. Farmington will rebid the job and hopes to be able to get work done

this summer.

The board also approved: a tentative amended budget for FY 2023; a foreign exchange program for 2023-24 with International Student Exchange; two memorandums of understanding with teachers, one on notification of seniority status, the other on adding a unified PE sponsor and another assistant football coach; and no change in student fees for next year.

In personnel, the board approved hiring Katelyn Fischback as a high school science teacher and Sara Hanlin as interim high school cheer coach.

Also accepted were resignations by music teachers Aaron Ganschow and Allison Smith, science teacher Andy Bach, cook

Tammy Tomson and Amy Eddy.

When the new board reorganized, Alex Slack was reelected to a two-year term as president, with Travis Mahr voted in as vice-president, Dustin Blunier secretary and Cunningham assistant secretary.



BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE BRIMFIELD SANITARY DISTRICT, PEORIA COUNTY, ILLINOIS:

SECTION ONE: That Section 4, Article I, Chapter 3 of Ordinance No. 1976-1 be deleted and a new Section 4 be substituted therefor as follows:

Sec. 4 Basic user rate: There shall be and there is hereby established a minimum charge and a basic user rate for the use of and for service supplied by the Wastewater Facilities of the District. These charges shall begin with bills mailed to users after July 1, 2023.

SECTION TWO: That if any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the invalidity or unenforceability of such section, paragraph, clause or provision shall not affect any of the remaining provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION THREE: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.
