## Search for Brimfield man intensifies after possible sightings

The search for a local man gone missing has intensified after several possible sightings of him in the Edwards area.

Logan Dunne, 32, of Brimfield has been missing since he walked out of Carle Health Methodist Hospital on June 2. He was last seen in the 200 block of NE Glen Oak Ave. in Peoria wearing blue jeans and a blue shirt and clutching a green bag.

But several people in the area of Southport Road and Kicka-

poo-Edwards Road say they saw a man on foot Sunday and Monday who may be Dunne, according to the Peoria County Sheriff's Office.

That has given some hope to Dunne's parents, Brian and

Heather Dunne. The parents started Tuesday morning as they have much of the past week: searching for their missing son.

"Right now I'm kind of at a loss to tell people where to go," Brian Dunne said Tuesday, speaking to a group of nearly 30 volunteers gathered outside his rural Brimfield home. "We are just using the gut feeling that he would travel home, in any state of mind."

Logan Dunne's condition is a growing concern for his family and friends. A Type 1 diabetic since age 4, Logan relies on an insulin pump, which he is believed to have left behind.

"Unless he managed to find a bottle of insulin, he would be running on an empty tank at this point," his father said. "Or worse."

"He could be in a diabetic coma at this point," his mother added.

Even so, nobody has given up hope. More than 100 people turned out Monday to search for Logan, a white male, approx-

# Busy first year for Weaver

WILLIAMSFIELD — Travis

Weaver's first year in the Illinois House of Representatives was OK, by his admission. He also might admit things could have been worse.

Weaver was a Republican rookie legislator in a group where Democrats outnumber his party almost 2 to 1. Still, Weaver was a primary sponsor of three pieces of legislation that passed the House and Senate and were sent to Democratic Gov. JB Pritzker's desk.

During a visit last week to Williamsfield, the 93rd District representative attributed his ability to work with Democrats. And to play with Democrats, perhaps.

"I have as many Democratic friends as Republican friends in Springfield," said Weaver, who on Sunday turns 31. "I go to Black Caucus karaoke night. I go to Latino Caucus poker night. I play in the Tuesday-night basketball league. There's just not a lot of Republicans who do that."

Weaver said he did that by emphasizing the personal as well as the professional. That included

introducing himself to every House Democrat, all 78 of them in a 118-seat chamber.

"Everybody had their first day in Springfield, where they didn't know anybody," Weaver said. "So when somebody comes to you and says 'Hi, I'm new here,' I had a lot of people say, 'What are your priorities? What are some things we can partner on?'

## **Dual credit OK'd**

#### Billtown board to continue funding program

WILLIAMSFIELD – In the past four years, nearly 10 Williamsfield students have graduated with a high school

ated with a high school diploma and an associate degree at the same time.

That's thanks to hard work

on the student's part and to a dual-credit agreement with Carl Sandburg College that until recently was partly funded by the federal Pell Grant program.

Monday evening, the Williamsfield School Board voted to continue funding the dual-credit option even though the pilot Pell program has ended.

Superintendent Tim Farquer estimated the additional cost for the school district will be \$15,000 to \$20,000, bringing the total expense for dual-credit opportunities to \$55,000 to \$60,000 per year.

"It lets students take classes they wouldn't be able to take

otherwise," said Farquer, who noted he has heard no criticism of the program.

New school board member Jennifer Smith agreed with Farquer, saying she also has only heard positive comments from the community.

Farquer said teachers also support the program.

"The fear in the bigger schools is this could downsize their English or math department" as a result of dual-credit classes, Farquer said. "We can't do that. We're already kind of at our critical mass (for teachers)."

Farquer said this spring, 40 of 88 Williamsfield students were taking 89 different dual-credit courses through Carl Sandburg. He noted that unless a student gets at least a "C" in a class, they must reimburse the school district the cost of college tuition.

"My thought is, as long as *Continued on Page 13*

Continued from Page 1 And I think that paid a lot of dividends."

One of Weaver's bills is designed to allow bachelor's-degree holders to become speech-language pathology assistants more easily. Another helps facilitate liability insurance for high school and community-college students who participate in apprenticeships. A third exempts drainage districts from needing a permit to control beavers, muskrats and similar nuisance animals.

Weaver sees those bills as helping constituents in his district, which includes Brimfield, Elmwood, Toulon, Williamsfield, Wyoming and Yates City. His visit to Billtown was part of a program where he and his aides talk with local leaders.

"We kind of fit right into that wheelhouse for him, as far as his interests go for

the state," Williamsfield Village President Robert Johnson said.

According to Weaver, his top four House priorities are agriculture, education, economic development and infrastructure. He believes Republicans can affect those issues in a Democratic-dominated government.

"Those are things that are important to me, that I feel strong on, and I don't know how anybody can really argue with," Weaver said. "Those are kind of motherhood, apple-pie things, where I can walk across the aisle and say, 'Hey, let's do something good for farmers. It's good for all of our districts.'

"I would love to pass tax cuts. I would love to work on things that are going to (bring) new jobs to Illinois. I would love to work on things that support my prolife beliefs. But I know

those are, frankly, things that are not going to get a lot of luck to pass."

Weaver defeated incumbent Rep. Mark Luft last June in the GOP primary in the newly reconfigured 93rd. Weaver, whose father is former state Sen. Chuck Weaver, faced no Democratic opposition in the election last November.

According to the younger Weaver, the national election next November could set a tone for the General Assembly between now and then.

Things might hinge on whether Pritzker decides to challenge President Joe Biden for the Democratic nomination. Pritzker has said he won't, but national reports cited his wealth, his political operation and his


left-wing record as reasons for a potential run.

"If he does decide to run for president, I think we're going to see a very progressive agenda try to get pushed, to bolster his report card," Weaver said about Pritzker.


"If he doesn't, I think we're going to have another year like this year, which I would sav was OK. There's a lot of things the Democrats could have done that they decided not to do."

## Of a St. Jude record, pack cats & false saviors

Rambling through central Illinois, running out of fingers to keep track of all the road-killed raccoons.

Even Jody McKinty didn't see this coming.

"When gas gets over \$3 it usually hurts us. I was absolutely floored we were at that amount," McKinty said

after a profit total was tallied following the 20th annual My Place St. Jude benefit.

In one day, McKinty and her army of volunteers raised a record

\$151,388.40 for St. Jude. That's

\$239.54 for every person in Yates City, though of course the event attracts folks from well outside the borders of this Knox County hamlet.

The My Place side-by-side ride alone brought more than 300 people to the event, many of those riders thirsty, hungry and ready to bid at the auction – at which \$125 pies are not uncommon. This year's sale went particularly well.

"Honestly, it was the earliest our auction has ever ended," McKinty said. "It was also, I think, our best auction."

Overall, the benefit has now raised an astounding \$1,549,906.14 for St. Jude in 20 years. Some credit for that goes to deep-pocketed bidders and kindly donors. But the lion's share of kudos goes to the 100-150 volunteers who step up every year to pull off

what could otherwise be a logistical nightmare. One saving grace is that many volunteers have been doing the same jobs for decades.

"Everybody knows their part," McKinty said.

And they had better not plan on quitting any time soon.

"We plan to do it again next year," McKinty said.

Beyond that? "We all hope to get to 30 (years) and out," she said.

That's music to the ears of St. Jude and the children it serves.



## Farmington reports multiple vehicle burglaries

FARMINGTON – A single-day spree in Farmington resulted in multiple stolen and burglarized vehicles.

The incidents took place June 3, according to Farmington police reports. At least three vehicles were reported stolen and later recovered, and at least four others were burglarized.

Shortly before 8 a.m., officers received a report about two parked vehicles damaged in a hit-and-run collision in the 400 block of S. Apple St. The suspect vehicle, a 2008 Dodge Nitro with Missouri license plates, was located in the parking lot of Dollar General, 816 E. Fort St.

When police attempted to stop the vehicle, the driver crashed it into a fence, a police report stated. The driver then abandoned the vehicle and fled on foot into a trailer park. A subsequent police pursuit came

up empty

The Nitro was reported stolen from the thoroughfare where the hit-and-run wrecks took place. A gray 2016 Chevrolet Malibu sustained a crushed rear end, according to the report. A black 2013 Dodge Journey was sideswiped.

No suspect information was available, but police believe that incident relates to others that happened that day in Farmington.

A blue 2009 Chevrolet Tahoe was reported stolen between about 3 and 5 a.m. from a residence in the 400 block of Idlewhile Drive.

The vehicle was recovered June 4 in the 2400 block of W. Millman St. in Peoria. It had a flat tire and damage to both driver's-side doors, according to a police report.

Reported stolen from the 200 block of N. East St. was a red 2015 Toyota Corolla. It was found with a flat tire about 8:30 a.m. June 3 at Vernon and Poplar streets.

Among burglarized vehicles were

two parked at the same location, in the 300 block of N. Main St.

The owner of a blue 2016 Chevy Equinox said someone broke into her garage, then into the vehicle and stole about \$15 in change from the center console.

Another victim said a wallet inside his black 2005 Dodge Magnum was stolen. The wallet was recovered, but a debit card inside it was missing.

Another burglarized Chevy Equinox, a gray one parked in the 400 block of E. Vernon St., was missing a bottle of perfume valued at \$10. One block to the east, the owners of a white 2015 Jeep Cherokee reported about \$20 in cash was missing.

Investigations were in progress as of last week, according to police.

## Elmwood may add school resource officer

For The Weekly Post ELMWOOD – A uniformed school resource officer in Elmwood appears closer to reality. But that officer probably will conduct extracurricular activities, too.

Next month, the Elmwood City Council probably will consider whether to hire an additional police officer, according to Mayor JD Hulslander. That officer is to spend the academic year primarily at the service of the Elmwood School District.

But at other times, including the summer, the officer would join Chief Aaron Bean and Officer Mike Darrah on full-time city patrol. According to Bean, that would help a department that's spread thin. He said he worked a 20-hour shift recently.

"It's getting to the point now where we're pretty much going to have to bite the bullet and do that kind of stuff," Bean said following a City Council meeting June 6. "If they do hire (someone) full time, then we'll be able to really step stuff up."

The new full-timer also would be free for city work during school holidays, according to Bean. His force includes a part-time officer.

Stu Ingersoll of Elmwood is the primary candidate being considered for the new job, according to Hulslander. Currently, Ingersoll splits school-district duties as a resource officer and custodian. He is a retired Peoria cop.

"We're looking for someone to hit the ground right away," School Superintendent Chad Wagner told the council.

How and how much the eventual hire is to be paid is to be determined. Wagner has proposed his district pay the officer's salary for nine months each year. Alderman Andrew Almasi suggested the city's share won't strain the budget.

The officer is to be on duty 7:30 a.m. until 3:30 p.m. at school when it's in session, Wagner said.

"Chief Bean and Mike Darrah do an amazing job for us already, but it would give them some more help during the summer," he said. "Just having a uniformed, licensed police presence in our building ... unfortunately, that's kind of where we are as a society."

Citing recent headlines about classroom shootings, Wagner presented his plan to the Elmwood School Board during its meeting last month.

Among councilors who heard Wagner's plea last week was Kenny Blum. Earlier in the evening, council members authorized Blum to replace Dara Wagner as a Ward 3 representative. Wagner resigned because she is moving out of town.

Blum retired last year from Ameren Illinois, where he worked in community and public relations.

"I learned that the importance of good communication is listening," Blum stated. "Listening is what I will do as I hear from the citizens of Elmwood to keep our community a wonderful place to live."

Blum and his colleagues voted to authorize pay raises, effective July 1, for four public-works employees.

Superintendent Dan Bybee's pay is to rise from \$34.50 per hour to \$36.25. Bethany Lovingood's pay is to increase from \$17.60 to \$20. Pay for John Traver is to rise from \$18.15 to \$20, and Jordan Wagner's pay is to increase from \$21.75 to \$22.85.

Raises are in line with what the police department received last month, with some adjustments, Alderman Nathan Brunnelson said.

The council also:

• Approved creation of a mutual-aid agreement with the Illinois Professional Emergency Management Association, a new statewide disaster-relief organization.

• Presented Elmwood

resident Mick Crouch with a certificate from the Illinois House of Representatives that acknowledges his prolific sheep-shearing career. The former national champion once sheared 23,000 sheep in one year, according to Almasi.

"To be able to stand out in your hometown really means something to you," Crouch said.


"Anything is possible at this point," Brian said. "Anything is hopeful."



Williamsfield had eight students participate in a program with the Galesburg Area Vocational Center this spring. They took a variety of classes ranging from nursing to auto mechanics.

The board also approved a revised bid for \$151,747 from Oberlander Electric for work on the district's bus-charging station.

On May 1, Oberlander presented a bid of \$285,762 that was rejected. Oberlander came back on May 19 with what Farquer called a "bare bones" offer that the board accepted.

Work on the charging stations is to be done by Aug. 1, which is when the district is scheduled to receive seven buses powered by electricity.

the board.

His report showed an ending balance of \$4,735,732 for the district and a surplus of \$2,730,458, which includes grant money that will be spent in FY 2024 for new buses. Farquer also said Williamsfield has the lowest actual tax rate among local schools of \$4.37. And he anticipates that rate may dip as low as \$3.88 for the 2024 levy after bonds are paid off.

In personnel matters, the board voted to approve extra-duty assignments for all sports involved in the ROWVA-Williamsfield coop. That list includes boys basketball coach Bob Anderson, who will return for a 45th season. The board tabled a decision on extracurricular assignments that are specific to Williamsfield.

In other personnel matters, the board accepted the resignation of long-time teacher Kathy Wight. Wight has accepted a position with the Regional Office of Education, where she will be overseeing career and technical education for Knox, Henderson, Mercer and Warren counties.

The board also approved the hiring of Terri Lynn Fisher-Stigall as a full-time staff member.

## Princeville board seeks more patrol hours

PRINCEVILLE - The Princeville Village Board would like clarification on a few things before it approves partial funding of a school resource officer.

More precisely, perhaps, the board would like a few more patrol hours.

During its meeting June 5, the board tabled approving an agreement with the Princeville School District regarding the officer, who is a Peoria County Sheriff's Office deputy. Since 2019, Deputy Crystal Strauss has been based in Princeville schools during the academic year.

Ideally, Strauss or whoever might be the resource officer will patrol Princeville streets for an hour or two each day school is in session, according to Village President Jeff Troutman. He said he is working with Sheriff Chris Watkins and Princeville School Board President Darwin Stahl on such a plan.

Reconsideration of the agreement is expected during the Village Board meeting Tuesday night.

Troutman said Strauss had been doing some daytime patrolling before the 2022-23 school year ended.

"She is out and about," Troutman told the board. "She has prevented a few things up here. It does value the village somewhat, because she does gain a lot of information at the school. She said the kids trust her enough."

The village and the school district are under contract to split evenly the annual cost of the officer. That agreement runs through the 2028-29 school year.

Last month, the school board authorized a three-year deal with the sheriff's office in which the cost is to increase by almost 25 percent initially. The rate is to be \$103,171 in 2023-24, \$106,169 in 2024-25 and \$109,352 in 2025-26.

Rates are standard for all school resource officers in Peoria County. Princeville Superintendent Shannon Duling said charges increased not long after the school district and the sheriff's office agreed on an initial four-year contract.

Strauss isn't expected to return to duty in Princeville until a few days before classes are to begin, Troutman said. The 2023-24 term is to start Aug. 16.

Under a separate contract with the village, the sheriff's office patrols Princeville for eight hours most nights.

Late last year, the Village Board

approved a deal that reduced coverage from seven nights a week. The new coverage was projected to save the village almost \$40,000 this year, compared to what the sheriff's office proposed for daily patrols.

The sheriff's office still responds to calls in Princeville when a deputy is not in town.

In other action, the board authorized the village budget for the 2024 fiscal year. Total revenue is projected to be \$3,052,190. Total expenses are projected to be \$3,141,143.

The board also approved a oneyear renewable contract with Pennsylvania-based Muni-Link to provide water-customer billing services, including software. The onetime installation fee is \$11,000 and annual support is \$5,700, per Village Treasurer Julie Delbridge.

Remaining with the current provider, Nebraska-based gWorks, would have resulted in about \$17,500 in total initial expense, according to figures Delbridge provided. Annual fees might have approached \$10,000.

Village building permits were issued for a 20-by-24-foot garden shed at 627 N. Town Ave. and a semi-attached garage at 731 W. Spring St.
