Stark County, Williamsfield schools get grant for microgrid

Stark County and Williamsfield schools will receive federal grant money to help the districts create their own electric microgrids.

The microgrids will allow both school districts to tap into energy being produced on campus in solar arrays.

Williamsfield Superintendent Tim Farquer learned on June 29 that a grant application he wrote along with 19 other Illinois schools had been selected to receive nearly \$15 million in federal funding through the Renew

America's Schools Program.

Williamsfield and its partners were among 24 recipients selected from a nationwide pool of 236 applicants.

"I didn't expect to get it, just because I knew it was going to be so competitive," Farquer said.

Farquer's bid was to install solar-powered microgrids on the campus of 20 public school districts, including Williamsfield, Stark County, Monmouth United, Wethersfield, Peoria and others.

Williamsfield will likely receive about \$500,000 from the grant total, because Farquer said the school district already has most components for its own microgrid already in place, thanks to \$6.75 million in previous grants.

"We're ready to rock and roll. We've already got the engineering in place at our location," Farquer said. "My goal is still a full active microgrid here by the end of 2023."

Williamsfield is further ahead in planning than most of the other 19 schools in the grant application, Farquer said.

Farquer was uncertain how much grant money Stark County

would receive. But he said Stark County is ahead of many others because it already has a solar array in place next to the elementary school.

Earlier this year, Superintendent Brett Elliott reported that the solar panels saved the district 8 percent on electric costs in the first year of use. A microgrid could provide additional sources of savings and even possible earnings, according to Farquer.

"We plan to use our specs and lessons learned for the other 19," Farquer said. "As we developed plans and specs for electrifying

our bus barn, we had the engineers put together the plan for a microgrid. And we were just going to plug in the components as we went along.

"What we lack funding for is stationary battery storage and a micogrid controller."

Those two components will complete Williamsfield's microgrid and will provide the school district added flexibility during power outages, as well as a chance to possibly generate revenue down the road.

Illinois **AgrAbility** program offers aid

URBANA – Farmers have always been the backbone of America. The state of Illinois includes 72,650 farms that cumulatively harvest over 27 million acres and are operated by 118,000 producers. The work involved is not only the farmer's livelihood but rather their way of life.

Illinois AgrAbility is a program geared towards farmers, veterans in farming, and farmworkers who have experienced an age or in-

jury-related disability or experience a chronic illness that precludes them from continuing their work in production agriculture. The program offers education and assistance to eliminate barriers, accommodate limita tions, and help these individuals continue farm-

"For many farmers, the presence of a disability, injury, or chronic health condition can jeopardize their livelihood and way of life," said Josie Rudolphi, director of Illinois AgrAbility and University of Illinois Extension specialist. "Yet, with some assistance, agricultural producers and workers with disabilities can safely and effectively continue to earn their livelihoods in production agriculture and participate fully in rural

Chase suspect identified

River Grove man reportedly threatened woman, deputies

WYOMING - Jason Bachler of River Grove, Ill., was the driver who led law enforcement officers on a high-speed chase though Stark County on June 18.

The Prairie News received ad-

ditional information about the chase on Sharkey Highway and into the City of Wyoming through a Freedom Of Information Act request from the Stark

County Sheriff's Office. Bachler wound up being arrested at 1-11 Tacos restaurant, in Wyoming.

According to the sheriff's incident report, Bachler was threatening to kidnap and attack Emma Jonland and was on his way to Jonland's Sharkey Highway location when the chase ensued.

Stark County Deputy William Dorn said in his report that Bachler was making verbal threats against Jonland and law enforcement per-

Bachler is accused of saying, "I will shoot you in the head, I will shoot you all in the head all of the officers too." The deputy said he was unable to make out what else Bachler said, as he was screaming. The Stark County dispatcher reportedly heard this exchange.

According to reports, Bachler said he was Jesus and that law enforcement had no jurisdiction over him. Subsequently, Bachler drove from Sharkey Highway to the Wyoming before being stopped at 1-11 Tacos by Stark County Sheriff's deputy Adam Henson. Bachler claimed he had a gun, but that proved untrue when he was arrested by deputies.

Bachler was transported to St. Luke Hospital, in Kewanee, for a mental evaluation and was released from custody after the evaluation. Bachler has not yet been charged with any crime according to court records.

Continued from Page 1 only use power from its solar array when the overall power grid is operating. By having its own microgrid and stationary power storage, the school can use its solar energy to keep the lights on even when an outage shuts down power elsewere in town.

Eventually, Farquer hopes the school's stationary power storage can be sold to generate revenue

during summer months when buses are not running.

"The rules have to be changed for that to occur," Farquer said.

Even without that, Farquer estimates Williamsfield will save \$90,000 per year based on typical spending of \$100,000 on electricity and diesel fuel for buses.

Of course, that requires the new electric-powered

school buses to actually be delivered. An anticipated Aug. 1 delivery of seven buses to Williamsfield has "turned into sometime between September and December," according to Farquer.

The other 19 schools that are part of the grant are in varying stages of electrification on their campuses.

"The goal is for everyone to have at least one electric bus," Farquer said.






