# Stark Co. principal takes Cambridge superintendent job

For The Prairie News WYOMING- The Stark County School Board heard at its Feb. 20 meeting that Elementary School Principal Jenna Bibb has accepted the Cambridge School District superintendent's position for the 2024-25 school year.

Bibb has been Stark's elementary school principal since 2015. Previously, she was an elementary school teacher at Wilder-Waite Grade School in the Dunlap School District. She

earned a bachelor of science degree from Bradley University, a master of science in educational

administration from Western Illinois University and an educational specialist in instructional lead-

ership degree from the Uni-Bibb versity of Ala-

bama.

Bibb and husband Bruce have

a son, Silas, and they currently reside in Wyoming. They plan to move to the Cambridge area in the next couple of years. Bruce is self-employed and will make decisions later on in his future.

In other business at the meeting, Architect Dan Steider from the Farnsworth Group presented an update on the new gymnasium project set for construction at the Toulon school campus. He said Feb. 28 will be a pre-bid meeting for all subcontractors and bids will be opened on

March 12 for awarding of the contract.

In his report, Superintendent Brett Elliott said "the track project is well underway with 95 percent of the concrete work completed. Grading and fencing as well as the grandstand bleachers are to be done by the end of Feb. Once the asphalt plant opens in the spring, we will move forward with the laying of the track."

In other business, the board approved the second reading of the

school 2024-25 calendar with the first day of school set for Aug. 15. Thanksgiving break will be Nov. 27-29, winter break is Dec. 20 to Jan. 3, 2025, spring break will be April 14-21, 2025, and graduation will tentatively be May 11, 2025. Eighth-grade promotion is May 14, 2025. Graduation and promotion dates are to be approved later.

Approval was given of the transportation bids for 2024-25 that were opened Feb. 15, 2024, with

## **Bzzzzy year** for cicadas Two broods due for 1st time since 1803

University of Illinois Extension JACKSONVILLE - Can you hear them? Probably not yet, but soon, Illinois will be awash in the songs of periodical cicadas.

This year is a big year for periodical cicadas in Illinois, where Broods XIII and XIV will be emerging throughout much of the state at the same time for the first time since 1803. Despite some talk of an

same places. Brood XIII will be emerging in the northern half of the state. Brood XIV will be emerging in the southpected to overlap to any great extent.

Periodical cicadas are among the longest-lived insects on the planet, living for 13 or 17 years. They spend the vast majority of that time living underground, feeding on tree roots. Once the soil warms enough in the spring, they will begin to Continued on Page 2

# Garbage costs rising

Wyoming council OKs \$3 garbage increase

For The Prairie News WYOMING – The Wyoming City Council passed five resoultions at its meeting on Feb. 20.

Among those resolutions was one to increase by \$3 the current charge for garbage removal per household. The increase by Murphy's Container Service is due to increased landfill rates and fuel charges. The increase is from \$9 to \$12 per month. The recycling rate remains the same.

The council also approved a \$16,893 purchase from Bonnell Industries, Inc. of a wing curb shoe for the city's snowplow.

"This addition will make snow removal and road clearance easier and more efficient," according to the resolution. In addition, a resolution was approved that states "the owners of the buildings downtown are responsible for removing snow and ice from the sidewalks in front of their buildings."

The snow removal zones are: Illinois Route 91 between Thomas and Elm Streets; Route 91 to 110 W. Williams Street; and East Williams Street between Route 91 and Galena Avenue.

Failure to comply could result in a fine of not more than \$750 per instance.

The council approved a Motor Fuel Tax fund resolution for \$203,426 (not to exceed \$224,000) to maintain Wyoming city streets between Jan. 1 and Dec. 31. Streets will be designated to be seal coated.

Finally, a resolution was approved to pay Leander Construction \$428,335 and Farnsworth Group Engineering \$6,904 for work performed on the wastewater treatment system project.

## **CICADAS:** Egg-laying can damage small trees, shrubs

Continued from Page 1 emerge, usually around late May or early June.

Periodical cicadas have black bodies with orange wing veins and red eyes. Male cicadas will start singing four or five days after they emerge. They gather in trees and sing together to attract females. Each species of cicada has a distinctive song.

After mating, female periodical cicadas will lay their eggs in woody plants. They prefer branches that are about the width of a pencil or a little larger. They will use their saw-like ovipositor to cut into branches and lay their eggs. After about a month,

the adult cicadas will begin to die. Large piles of cicadas can accumulate under trees and can smell rather unpleasant. However, their decaying bodies serve as fertilizer for plants.

Twigs and branches that have had eggs laid in them may sometimes break, which will cause everything past this damaged area to die. Fortunately, this will not kill healthy, mature trees. The same can't be said for small trees and shrubs, though.

Newly planted small trees and shrubs may have trunk diameters small enough for female cicadas to lay their eggs in; if this happens, the trees can be killed. These smaller plants also have fewer branches on

them, and egg-laying can cause significant damage. There are several things you can do to prevent cicada damage to trees and shrubs:

1. Avoid planting trees and shrubs the year before a periodical cicada emergence or in the spring.

2. Place netting around small trees and shrubs, making sure it is secured around the base of the plant to prevent cicadas from crawling up the plant from the ground.

3. Insecticides are not recommended.

This year provides a once-in-amulti-generation opportunity. Take some time to track down some cicadas and enjoy nature's symphony.

#### Fire departments called to Route 17 shed fire

WYOMING – Several local fire departments responded to a Feb. 17 call of a machine shed on fire at 13210 Illinois Route 17.

Wyoming Community Fire Protection District had five firefighters on the scene at 5:40 p.m. Bradford and Toulon fire departments also responded, as did Stark County Ambulance and the Stark County Sheriff's Office, which shut down Route 17 for a period of time.

Firefighters rescued three goats from the barn. Other animals were already outside the structure.

By 5:56 p.m. the fire was declared under control and all crews were able to leave the scene by 7:11 p.m.

Cause of the fire is unknown, but according to a Wyoming CFPD press release, may have been started from heat lamps that caught straw on fire.

The fire in the shed, owned by Tyler Joos, was contained to the center of the back wall. There was some damage to the wall and beams,

# Galva wins regional opener

For the first time in a long time, Galva won a boys basketball postseason game.

Blake Stahl had 17 points and seven rebounds to lead host Galva to a 57-50 victory Monday night over Peru St. Bede in a Class 1A Wethersfield Regional quarterfinal.

The victory advanced the Wildcats (10-20), seeded ninth in a Hanover sub-sectional, to a regional semifinal played Wednesday night in Kewanee against second-seeded Annawan.

Galva Coach Jake McClintic wasn't sure the last time his school won in the state tournament. It might have been as long as seven years ago. A postseason victory might have seemed like a longshot a year ago, when Galva was ending a 2-30 season.

But the boys team quintupled its victory total in part through contributions from multiple players, something evident against 10th-seeded St. Bede (11-21). Braxton Rylander had 11 points, six rebounds and six steals. Cyrus Lilly scored 11 and had four assists. Freshman M.J. Louck had nine points.

"We had a good plan going in on how to stop what they did well, and we executed well," McClintic stated. "Our shot selection on the night was great. We played good team basketball."

Galva also won its final regular-season game, 59-53 on Feb. 15 over Wethersfield. Louck had a team-high 19 points. Lilly had 11 points, 15 rebounds and three steals. Rylander also had 11 points and three steals, as well as five assists.

"We moved the ball well and played good defense," McClintic stated. "We had a rough time shooting in the first half and started to hit the shots in the second half." Galva finished 2-9 in the Lincoln Trail Conference.

Stark County Boys – Matthew Bowser had 20 points Monday night to lead host Stark County to a 56-39 Williamsfield Regional victory over Monmouth United. Luke Rewerts scored 11 for the Rebels (19-12), who are seeded fifth in their Abingdon sub-sectional. United (15-15)
