# Wyoming council OKs pump purchases for wastewater plant

WYOMING – The Wyoming City Council at its Tuesday meeting passed three resolutions to purchase at least five pumps for the wastewater treatment plant for \$59,292.

Councilman Jim Mercer described what each pump's purpose was for and why the new pumps were required.

The pumps from the Armature Motor and Pump Company of

East Peoria are to replace two sludge pumps, two main pump station pumps and a self-priming pump, according to the resolutions passed.

In his written report and his verbal presentation to the council, Mercer said, "We took out 150,000 gallons of water from the plant. The landfill shut us off after six (semi) loads of waste were sent there because they said it was too wet."

He also said the "drying beds

are working better than they ever have and the digesters are working great."

Mercer talked with Leander Construction, Inc. and the Farnsworth Group Engineering about an oxidation ditch program that is not correctly functioning. After explaining the problem, Mercer told Leander and Farnsworth that they would not be paid any more money "until this is fixed."

In conjunction with this state-

ment, a resolution to pay Leander and Farnsworth \$101,467 was tabled.

Leander was to receive \$92,634 and Farnsworth Group Engineering was to receive \$8,832 for the total \$101,467 disbursement from the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency loan that the City of Wyoming was given for work at the city wastewater treatment plant.

Mercer also said that the roof

over the digester building requires repair because of multiple leaks. A new chlorine line is needed from the main building to the "Ras/Pump well." He added that a new building is required around the new panel at the oxidation ditch.

Finally, Mercer informed the council that 19-year-old co-op student from the high school was hired to work at the treatment plant doing painting and

# Testimony heard on farm act

Jeff Brooks, Whiteside County Farm Bureau member, faced an unprecedented challenge when he lost his father in 2023 – the weight of the Illinois estate tax.

"This burden is putting pressure on the current operations of our family farm," Brooks testified April 12 before members of the Illinois House Revenue and Finance Committee. "In March of 2023, still coping with my father's passing, we learned the amount of a significant payment that was still due on our farming operation."

The committee heard testimony on HB 4600, the Family Farm Preservation Act, sponsored by State Rep. Sharon

Chung, D-Bloomington.

"Illinois' No. 1 industry is in farming with 96% of Illinois farms being family-owned," Chung said. "HB 4600 addresses the discrepancy between escalating farm estate evaluations and annual farm income."

The Family Farm Preservation Act, if adopted, would create a \$6 million true exemption to the estate tax for family farms, tied to inflation. Additionally, the bill would allow a surviving spouse to utilize their own estate tax exemption and any unused exemption from the deceased spouse.

"The death of a loved one should not force families to have to sell the farm," IFB President Brian Duncan said. "This current Illinois estate tax hits normal, everyday Illinois family farmers who do not make millions of dollars."

# Free lunches?

#### Stark County schools expect grant

WYOMING – While Stark County schools expect a grant to pay for student meals, the School Board on Monday approved raising by 10 cents the fees for breakfast and lunch.

The district anticipates receiving a four-year Community Eligibility Provision grant to pay for meals for 2024-28.

Superintendent Brett Elliott told the board the district continues to work with the Farnsworth Group on its electric bus grant. In addition, he said temporary fencing has been installed for the new gym project at the Toulon campus and the new track should be paved soon now that asphalt companies are resuming business.

Elliott provided a list of upcoming events:

- April 20 Prom.
- May 8 Seniors' last day.
- May 12 Graduation.
- May 15 Eighth grade promotion.

• May 24 - Last day of school. The board approved spending \$7,814 for a track shed upgrade to prepare for the new equipment associated with the new all-weather track. Skip Turnbull will remove and replace a door that is currently unsafe for use and rehab the front of the shed.

Also approved was a 2024-25 IESA membership renewal of \$1,440 and a \$1,495 expenditure for a one-year pilot Mystery Science curriculum for elementary students.

The board approved maternity leave coverage for Principal Megan McGann during the fall of 2024. Approval is for the superintendent to find a retired administrator who can manage day-to-day operations.

After executive session, the board approved hiring for 2024-25 Alexa Beharelle as junior high social studies teacher and Joe Charvat as assistant high school football coach.

# Galva School Board keeps officers, committees

# Three cases heard in Stark Co. circuit court

TOULON – Three cases came before Stark County Circuit Judge Paul E. Bauer last Friday.

Leslie D. Troutwine, 62, of Toulon, made his first court appearance on two misdemeanor charges filed for Class B criminal trespass to a building and Class A theft under \$500. Troutwine was assigned Stark County Public De-

fender Robert M. McBride and scheduled for another appearance on May 3.

Troutwine is accused of entering the Toulon Global Methodist Church after he was previously ordered not to trespass on church property. Surveillance camera footage allegedly show Troutwine entering the church and removing items without authority.

Matthew R. Shipp, 20, of Toulon, appeared with his

attorney Douglas Johnson, of Bloomington, for a status hearing. Also present was Shantikumer Kulkarni, assistant attorney general-high tech crime bureau prosecutor. Johnson provided Kulkarni with documents involving a pretrial evaluation and risk assessment. Kulkarni told Bauer the two sides are

continuing negotiations.

Shipp was arrested Nov. 15, 2023, and charged with 10 Class X felony counts of child pornography distribution with victims under 13-years-of-age. His next court appearance is June 21. He remains incarcerated in Henry County Jail. without bail after Kulkarni asked that Shipp not be released under the Illinois SAFE-T Act.

Justin C. Potter, 34, of

Wyoming, appeared briefly with Stark County Public Defender Robert M.
McBride. Potter was scheduled for a bench trial that did not occur.

Potter was charged with a Class 4 felony domestic battery count on July 19, 2023. Court documentation alleges that Potter struck Daniele Parks while at Wyoming Park Apartments. Bond was initially set at \$10,000.


Stark County State's Attorney Austin King said the state was dismissing the charge, "because we couldn't find the victim." Court documentation shows that the case could be refiled.

Potter was previously sentenced to three years in prison for a domestic battery conviction in 2016 in Henry County.

For the boys, Nolan Orwig won the 300 hurdles (43.46) and Matthew Bowser was first in triple jump (39-


the Paul Parker Coed Invite in Port Byron and the girls were fifth.
