Galva ordinance still a hot topic

Crowd seeks allowance for more items parked on a property

GALVA – A large crowd attended Monday's City Council meeting to discuss a controversial parking ordinance passed in March.

The council approved changing the term for dealing with inoperable and abandoned motor vehicles from seven days to 14 days, but tabled any more changes to the ordinance until the May meeting.

A hot topic Monday was how many items will be allowed on a property. The ordinance allows two items such as a lawn mower, trailer etc. Several present Monday said that should be changed to six items. Public view of the items was also discussed. Some present said they do not have a garage and can not afford a fence to store items in or behind.

A grant was written for \$300,000 of new playground equipment for Galva's Wiley Park. If the city receives the grant it will be responsible for half of the cost. A company is coming to repair the tornado slide that was damaged by a fire.

Pricey pipeline

Water line to Edelstein could cost \$6 million

PRINCEVILLE – A proposed water pipeline between Princeville and
Edelstein doesn't appear to be getting any cheaper.

The 7-mile pipeline might cost about \$6 million, Princeville Municipal Code Officer Dan Sullivan told the Village Board when it met April 16. Initial estimates were closer to \$4 million. Sullivan said the village is pursuing federal and state money to help pay for the possible project.

One grant, through the office of U.S. Rep. Darin LaHood, doesn't have a timetable yet. The other, through the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, is structured like a forgivable loan, according to Sullivan. The eventual cap is \$2 million annually and is not necessarily re-

newable.

"It's just a gamble that you take," Sullivan said. "You might get \$2 million this year and nothing next year."

About 60 Edelstein Water Works Co-Operative customers receive a product that doesn't comply with Illinois EPA radium standards. The Edelstein well also is deficient structurally. Edelstein customers require a water softener to receive potable water.

Connection to the Princeville water supply has been proposed as a solution. Such a project might take a couple of years to complete, according to Chad Gardner, the Princeville superintendent of public works.

"It's a sad shame. Those people in that town cannot drink their water," Prince-Continued on Page 2

Potawatomi Nation regains land in Illinois

Nearly 200 years after Native Americans were forced out of Illinois, the Prairie Band Potawatomi Nation has become the first federally recognized tribal nation in the state after a decision from the U.S. Department of the Interior last week.

The move represents the first victory in the tribe's larger effort to regain 1,280 acres of ancestral land in Illinois via legislation in both the General Assembly and Congress.

But the tribe first had to spend \$10 million over the last 20 years to repurchase 130 acres of the Shab-eh-nay Reservation, located in what is now DeKalb County, that the federal government illegally sold out from under Chief Shab-eh-nay around 1850.

Nearly two centuries later, Prairie Band Chairman Joseph "Zeke" Rupnick – a fourth-great-grandson of Chief Shab-eh-nay – signed paperwork on April 19 allowing the Department of the Interior to place those 130 acres into a trust, which gives the tribe sovereignty over the land.

Rupnick said he'd heard the story of his ancestral land in Illinois "ever since I was a child" from his grandparents, and said his mother started the push to reclaim the land.

Prairie Band leaders initiated the process with the federal government 30 years ago, Rupnick said, even before the tribe bought the 130 acres of private land signed over on Friday.

CITY OF WYOMING "CLEAN UP DAYS"

Monday, May 6th & Tuesday, May 7th

Everything to be picked up must be out by Monday, May 6th. The garbage truck will start in the North end of Wyoming and move South. They will not revisit an area they have already picked up.

It will be free to all residential households in the corporate limits of the City of Wyoming. Per state laws they cannot pick up any electrical items. Large nonelectrical appliances and large pieces of furniture as couches, large chairs, mattress, and box springs will require a tag at a cost of \$10.00 each. Tags can be purchased at City Hall. City Hall's hours are Monday - Friday, 7:30 to noon and 12:30 to 4:00 p.m. Anything placed out should be easily picked up by one man and placed into the back of the garbage truck. Bundle items when necssary so they may be picked up quickly.

The following will not be picked up:

- 1) Electrical items
- 2) Landscape waste
- 3) Hazardous material as in kerosene, fuel oil, paint thinners, batteries and tires

 No bricks, building materials and long poles as these items damage the garbage truck

Murphy's has the right to refuse to pick up any piles of garbage that are larger than a 4 ft. by 4 ft. pile or contain items mixed in that are not allowed.

Any large items set out without the required bulk tags will be in violation of City's Ordinance and subject to possible fines

Sullivan said he has talked with Peoria County Board Chairman Jimmy Dillon regarding additional support. Other grant opportunities might be pursued, but Sullivan was adamant the village not borrow money to pay for the project. Gardner appeared to agree.

"I'm not heartless here, but it's not our responsibility. We're just trying to help," he said. "It's Peoria County's responsibility. I don't think the village residents want to spend

any of their tax dollars on a community that doesn't benefit us. Somebody bigger than us probably has to push."

In other business, the board approved a request from High Voltage Taphouse to close the 100 block of E. Main St. between 8 a.m. and 8 p.m. Saturday. The bar is host to a benefit for Chad Himlin, a local resident who has been diagnosed with cancer.

Galva residents Josh Smith and John Wirth said they would volunteer to help with clean-up days, which have not been set

per residence for people who are unable to get items to the dumpster.

A bill pending in the Illinois House would also give the Prairie Band tribe the title to 1,500 acres that make up Shabbona Lake State Park, located about 20 miles southwest of

DeKalb. Shabbona Lake State Park is named for Chief Shab-eh-nay.

Other parts of the Prairie Band's ancestral lands are occupied by private homes. The Prairie Band tribe has proposed federal legislation allowing occupants to keep those properties, and even to pass them on to their descendants. But if homeowners sell, federal legislation would give the tribe a right of first refusal.



Toulon council approves baseball diamond rails






