

Bishop Hill Colony Church 'endangered'

For The Prairie News BISHOP HILL – Peeling paint is among the first things you notice when visiting the Colony Church, a landmark that dates back to 1848 and is a centerpiece of this historic site.

The exterior detracts from a fascinating interior that tells much of the story of Bishop Hill, one of the earliest settlements of Swedish immigrants in the U.S. and a utopian religious community founded by Eric Janson and his followers in 1846. No wonder then that Landmarks Illinois has listed the Colony Church as one of its 2024 most endangered historic places in Illinois. Illinois Landmarks is a nonprofit historic preservation organization that, since 1995, has annually asked preservationists, community leaders and citizens of Illinois to provide input for a list of 10 culturally and architecturally significant sites across the state that are in need of preservation. Once a property is included on the

Stark Co. court hears several cases Friday

For The Prairie News TOULON – Circuit Court Judge Paul E. Bauser heard several Stark County cases last Friday, with charges ranging from a traffic violation to a felony aggravated assault.


Shawn L. Hall, 51, of Toulon, is charged with a Class 4 felony aggravated assault for an incident on Dec. 16, 2023. It is alleged that Hall "attempted to kick Toulon police officer Ashley Karpel when she was performing her law enforcement duties."

Hall, through his legal counsel Maureen Williams, of Peoria, has filed a speedy trial request. Bauer set Hall's trial for Aug. 5 and expects completion in two days. Hall's next court appearance is July 12 for a scheduling conference. Charles D. Slightom Jr., 41, of Toulon, had two cases set for review and a first appearance on a third 2024 case. Slightom was arrested on July 15, 2020, on 450E at 700N for driving on a suspended license.

He is also charged with a criminal misdemeanor domestic violence count on Nov. 1, 2023, for domestic battery. Court documents say Slightom "made physical contact of an insulting or provoking nature with Mariliel Slightom (his wife), a family member or household member of the defendant, in that he struck her while at 220 E. Com-

Slightom Jr. has also been charged in the March 1 Knox County fatal crash, that killed his wife, Mariliel. Slightom was cited at *Continued on Page 2*

COURT: More court appearances scheduled

2013. Most recently, on Oct. 4, 2023, he was arrested in Stark County for operating an uninsured motor vehicle and disregarding a stop sign.

In another case heard last Friday, Andrew W. Szparkowski, 33, of Toulon, had three criminal misdemeanor cases continued. Those cases involved two for criminal trespass at the Toulon Public Library on Jan. 5 and at the Toulon Dollar General store on Feb. 10. He was previously warned not to enter either establishment. In addition, Szparkowski is charged with a criminal misdemeanor drug paraphernalia possession count, on Jan. 26.

Leslie D. Troutwine, 62, of Toulon, was in court with his legal counselor, Stark County Public Defender Robert M. McBride. McBride said he is working with Stark County State's Attorney Austin King on a plea agreement. Troutwine is charged with two counts of criminal misdemeanors. He allegedly entered and trespassed at the Toulon Methodist Global Church when he was previously warned not to enter the building. Plus, Troutwine is charged with theft for allegedly stealing a container of coffee, valued at less than \$500. He is scheduled for a June 14 court appearance.

Illinois Landmarks says previous Illinois leadership did not allocate enough money to address ongoing maintenance needs. As a result, deferred maintenance has created needed repairs, some of which are urgent.

According to Illinois Landmarks, all of the buildings in the state historic site need attention, but the Colony Church is in the most dire need.

Repairs needed at the church include a new roof, siding replacement, paint

stripping and new paint, foundation work, replacement of rotting wood, new gutters and plaster repair.

The Illinois Landmarks designation follows on the heels of a March 6 press conference during which State Rep. Travis Weaver and State Sen. Neil Anderson urged the General Assembly and Gov. JB Pritzker to set aside funds for repairs at Bishop Hill.

"Governor (JB) Pritzker should be embarrassed by his agency's ability to care for historic buildings," Weaver said. "Several decades ago, the state decided to take ownership of the Bishop Hill historic properties in order to preserve them; however, since then, they have allowed these buildings to nearly fall into total disrepair."
