

Fair repairs

\$58 million addressing deferred maintenance

Construction crews and Illinois State Fair staff are working hard to finish up renovations to the grounds as the countdown to the 2024 fair continues.

The Illinois State Fair hosts a plethora of construction projects, including a second phase of renovations to the Illinois State Fair Coliseum and restoration to the Multi-Purpose Arena.

"Spring means construction here on the Illinois State Fairgrounds. And we're still in the middle of a \$58 million economic investment in the fairgrounds to address years of deferred maintenance," said Rebecca Clark, Illinois State Fair manager.



After completing the Coliseum roof overhaul in 2019, the crew is now tackling a \$16.8 million transformation.

Phase two renovations focus on new electrical, heating and cooling, plumbing and sound systems. The project also addresses new seating and adds an elevator, increasing the building's accessibility.

"We started our renovations to the Coliseum around fall of '22 but had to stop the summer of '23 for the fair and all of the horse shows," said Rick Newbold of Egizii Electric. "We're in full swing now and are hoping for no more delays so we can be done come fair time."

According to Clark, crews

Blight properties notified

Toulon council OK's water upgrades

TOULON - Formal complaints have been filed against two nuisance properties in Toulon.

Property owners at 213 E. Greenwood St. and 311 N. Fuller St. have 30 days to respond after they receive Stark County Circuit Court summonses, according to Toulon City Attorney Kate Carter. Demolition could occur following that period.

Carter notified the Toulon City Council during its meeting May 13. Mayor Larry Hollis reappointed Carter to her post. Hollis also announced the appoint-

Stark salaries pass

Sheriff's office hires second K-9 unit

TOULON - Stark County Circuit Clerk Julie Kenney is receiving a 3% raise, but how much that equates to dollars-wise in each of the next four years appears to be in question.

During its meeting Tuesday night, the Stark County Board approved the circuit clerk's salary through the end of 2028. Kenney's current annual pay is \$56,896.

Board Member Joe Orwig didn't appear to want Kenney's pay discussed in open session.

"I have a problem. Could we not discuss personnel and wages when we were in executive (closed) session?" Orwig said.

Without a total salary amount discussed, The Prairie News asked what it was for each year. "Get your calculator out," Board Chairwoman Kari Bush said.

Kenney's salary is to be \$58,603 in the first year but could be \$60,310 or \$60,361 in the second year, \$62,017 or \$62,172 in the third year and \$63,724 or \$64,037 in the fourth year. The circuit clerk also receives from the state an annual stipend of \$6,500.

State's Attorney Austin King's salary from Dec. 1 of this year through November

Continued from Page 1 have a water and sewer superintendent.

In other business, the council approved the purchase of a police vehicle, a GMC truck, for about \$60,806, with the cost not to exceed \$61,000.

The reverse-osmosis water system's electronics upgrade was approved. Aldermen Michael Schott and Brandon Simpson voted against purchasing a new electronics system for \$41,200. This upgrade will allow the water-well

system and the reverse-osmosis system to communicate with one another.

An expenditure of \$3,500 was approved to treat Willow Street for dust control. That street is located in the subdivision south of Stark County High School. Also passed was a \$3,000 deal with Hulsey Welding to manufacture two sewer-screen buckets. These are to help move collected sewage debris from the sewer plant to be placed in a specialized dumpster.

No action was taken following a discussion concerning the city's high-service water pumps. The city is considering a backup pump to ensure the water tower is not emptied if the primary pump fails. Recently, this occurred and the tower was almost emptied.

The city also is to pay \$5,000 to the North Central Illinois Council of Governments to write and submit a grant, for upgrades to the municipal

Pastor Art Nutzhorn donated the Faith Baptist Church building to the city for \$1. Nutzhorn, who also is a council member, has moved out of state. Hollis is to appoint a replacement within 60 days.

The council asked for more options about purchasing or leasing a skid steer for maintenance personnel to use. The current skid-steer lease expires at the end of May.

Continued from Page 1 2028 was set at \$152,913. The state furnishes two-thirds of the total compensation, or \$101,942, which leaves the county to pay \$50,971.

The board approved reappointments for four fire-department trustees: Timothy Ringger in Bradford, Pam Wulf in La Fayette, Stan Foglesong in Toulon and Kevin Scholl in Wyoming. The annual

Chuck Demetreon told the board. Henson is to begin work next week for the Creve Coeur Police Department. Demetreon said he'll take over from Henson in handling county K-9 officer Hunter.



The outrage over 'White Rural Rage'

Early in my first year at the Big U, a new friend from Chicago's South Side asked me what he thought was an innocent question. "You're from southern Illinois," began Vince, "so why don't you talk like a hillbilly?"

Like a what? I asked.

"You know," he explained, "why don't you talk with a drawl and say 'ain't' a lot?"

When I told him no one I knew in southern Illinois spoke like that, Vince, a budding engineer, was unable to square his circle. For years thereafter he introduced me as "a farm boy from south-

ern Illinois but not a hillbilly!"

Vince's unchanging understanding served his unchanging ignorance. Hillbilly, to him, was anything or anyone – including me somehow connected to the word "southern."

He wasn't alone. Canadian rocker Neil Young made a similar leap in his 1970 anthem "Southern Man." In his 2012 autobiography, "Waging Heavy Peace," however, Young apologized for the mistake.

Others have made the jump and remain comfortable in their view of "southern" and "rural." J.D. Vance, a one-time venture capitalist and now U.S. senator from Ohio, won instant acclaim with his 2016 memoir, "Hillbilly Elegy," set in Appalachia. The New York Times called it "one of the six best books to understand Donald Trump's win" later that year.

Others - me included - read it and thought it was more Vince-like than Vance-like: hollow, shallow, and more commercial than cerebral.

Vance's fellow Appalachian, economist William Easterly, called the book a "sloppy analysis of collections of people – coastal elites, flyover America, Muslims, immigrants, people without college degrees."

I wouldn't have been so kind.

Now comes another presidential election year, another election featuring Trump and another book to explain why me and my extended, white rural family are so enraged at our position in life that we are not just "a" but "the" biggest threat to our nation's survival.

Like most books about rural white folk these days, "White Rural Rage: The Threat to American Democracy," is also a New York Times bestseller. But dozens of critics, many whose research book co-authors, Paul Waldman and Thomas S. Schaller cite, are less thrilled. Several, like Nicholas F. Jacobs in his April 4 takedown for Politico, have made clear that the book's use of their scholarly work has been "misinterpreted and misunderstood."

Jacobs, a political scientist at Maine's Colby College, continues: "What the authors get wrong about rural America is exactly what many Democrats have been getting wrong for decades ... (T)hat rural political identity has morphed into resentment – a collective grievance against experts, bureaucrats, intellectuals, and the party that seeks to empower them, Democrats."

But resentment, Jacobs rightly points out, is not rage. "Resentment is rational, a reaction based on some

sort of negative experience. ..." Rage, however, "implies irrationality, anger that is unjustified and out of proportion."

That's true for most rural voters that I know: They are rational, resentful and Republican because they see the institutions at the center of their lives – churches, schools, families and communities - rapidly changing, with only one political party, the GOP, consistently acknowledging the changes.

To them, it's about politics, not policy; practicality, not philosophy; empathy, not antipathy.

And sure, many GOP politicians have made an art of telling rural Americans exactly what they want to hear. Unlike so many Democratic politicians, however, at least they show up to ask.

Former Speaker of the House Thomas P. "Tip" O'Neill often told the story of how after his initial election to Congress in 1952, he asked his mother if she had voted for him. Yes, she replied, but it was close.

Close? asked the wounded son. Why? "Because," she said, "you never asked me."

"I learned that night," O'Neill explained, "that all politics are local."

Any rural American can tell you the same thing. Just come by and ask.



"We also just finished putting the finishing touches on the Multi-Purpose Arena," she said.

The arena received an \$8.6 million facelift. Projects focused on repairing sidewalks, walls, steps and electrical systems, as well as readjusting the tension structure, installing a new canopy, and rebuilding the retaining walls around the facility.

Clark said this year the Multi-Purpose Arena will have plenty of events, including a rodeo. Clark said the fair is utilizing a new company this year that will host nine rodeo even

"It's a jam-packed show, great for those junior exhibitors who are going to be visiting with us during the State Fair," she said.

More than 10,000 visitors can be seated at the Multi-Purpose Arena and tickets will go on sale as more events are announced.

"I'm really excited about all of the things that are happening here," Clark told FarmWeek. "I think our fair family is going to really see that excitement when the fair rolls around this August."

The Illinois State Fair will be Aug. 8-18 this year.





The foundation has worked to support the dreams of Stark County graduates by offering tens of thousands of dollars in scholarships made possible by the generous donations of community members and organizations.



Lady Rebels send 7 to 1A state meet

field team.

Stotler and teammate Lauren Orwig have traded the school record in shot put several times this season, with Stotler maintaining control on May 9 at the Class 1A Wethersfield Sectional.

The junior won the sectional with a personal-record throw of 38 feet, 11.25 inches that broke her own school record (38-8.25) set a week earlier at the Lincoln Conference Trail meet.

"The last two meets have been absolutely insane," Stotler said. "I PR'd by almost a meter at conference and then beat that (at sectional). So I'm very excited about state and excited to see that happen."

Stotler is seeded behind only freshman Makayla

Gajewski of Nashville (39-2.25) heading into the IHSA Class 1A state meet, which started Thursday with preliminaries at Eastern Illinois University. The meet concludes Saturday.

Joining Stotler at state will be Orwig, also a junior, who placed second at the sectional with a throw of 35-11.75. Though well off her PR of 38-0.25 from earlier this year – the former school record – the sectional throw has Orwig seeded No. 15 heading into state.

Stotler expects a strong showing from her teammate.

"I have full confidence (the school record) is going to be traded around again," Stotler said.

The sweep in the shot put was one highlight of a strong showing by Stark County despite on-and-off rain, winds and cooler temperatures at Wethersfield.

Overall, the Lady Rebels will be taking seven ath-

Gibson a champion

Stark County 8th grader wins AA 400

first state championship on

state track meet.

Gibson posted a personal record time of 54.64 seconds in the 400-meter race to top runner-up Ethan Holden of Potomac.

Actually, it was a weekend of PRs for Gibson, who had a career-best time of 24.57 to place third in the 200 and ran a personal best 12.29 in the 100 to just miss a medal and finish ninth.
