# **Bradford Library turns** 100 this year

BRADFORD - In October 1900, a group of 15 Bradford women met to form a social club and to broaden their reading experience.

The ladies each bought a book from Plummer's Drug Store. After they had exchanged and read all the books, they each bought another book. Once they had accumulated 45 books, they decided to start a library so they could lend books to the public.

From that humble start, the Bradford Public Library was born and later survived a devastating fire before moving into a brick building at 111 S. Peoria St. in July 1924. That same solid structure still provides patrons a chance to expand their reading opportunities, but has also evolved to offer events, computers and more.



The brick building that houses the Bradford Public Library opened in July 1924 after a fire destroyed the previous library, which was housed in a room over the old Fairbanks Harness Shop.

In 1992, voters of the Bradford School District voted to become a district library with services free to all residents of the district.

In the mid-1990s, a children's department was created.

In 2021, the library stopped charged fines for late books.

And in 2023, the library added a lift, a handicapped-accessible restroom, an outdoor ramp, hand railings and wider stairs

The library has several special events to celebrate 100 years of providing free access to books and resources. The annual Summer Reading program was centered around the centennial. A trivia night will be held at the library on July 18 at 6 p.m. and a special anniversary party open house will be held July 30 from 4-7 p.m.

# **Search continues**

Stark Co. board will look elsewhere for a location to build a new highway building

TOULON – A new Stark County highway building will not be built on a deadend residential street.

That decision of the Stark County Board of Supervisors Tuesday night brought smiles to the faces of residents of Toulon's South Union Street, a group of whom had spoken out against using a vacant field at the end of their quiet street for a highway building.

"No action will be taken in pursuing the land at the end of Union Street," Board Chairman Kari Bush said following a 27-minute closed session. "We will not be pursuing the purchase of that land."

That means the board and County Engineer Judd Giffin will continue their search for a suitable site to house the

county's heavy equipment and rock supplies.

Progress was made on another road-related front. Giffin reported he had a productive meeting with the Illinois Department of Transportation regarding Motor Fuel Tax funds, his salary and other matters.

The board unanimously approved several IDOT-related resolutions, including:

• Appropriating \$135,000 of MFT funds for general road maintenance, salt, signs, equipment rental, spray-patching and other

# Toulon serving notice on fire-damaged house

TOULON – Infrastructure and the future of a house damaged by a recent fire were main topics of Toulon's City Council meeting on July 8.

The city will send a notice to the homeowner of 315 W. Jefferson St. to correct problems on the property resulting from a fire. Following 15 days with no improvement or no response, a complaint will be filed in the courtroom to begin demolition proceedings. The city would cover the cost of the demolition, put a lien on the property and would then end up owning the

property.

Peerless Pump was to pull out a highservice pump to replace seals to see if that solves a problem that has the pump shut down. Peerless is also looking into a replacement pump that would have to be customized to fit into the current structure. Currently, one pump is running and cannot be shut off as the other is out of order.

Midco Diving and Marine sent divers into the city's clear-water tank and identified a foot valve that needs to be replaced. They also cleaned the tank and did an inspection. The council expects to receive a repair quote from

Midco soon.

The city is getting information on a Safe Routes to School grant that could cover some costs of sidewalk repair on South Miller Street. The application is due by January 2025 and the city hopes to get the school involved to write letters to encourage its approval. Quotes for the sidewalk project will be attained in the near future.

An ordinance on sewer service laterals will be edited and resubmitted with new language. According to Mayor Larry Hollis, Yates City has a "fairly decent compromise" regarding

Transportation funds. The county will also pay \$5,000 for Giffin's expenses in that timeframe.

• Appropriation of \$293,025.84 in MFT funds for the replacement of the Colgan Bridge on North Valley Road over Camp Run Creek. That bridge project has already been completed. And as part of an amended resolution, due to higher bid prices, the county's local match for the project was increased to \$279,252.60

 Appropriating \$315,000 in MFT funds for repairs to Castleton Road. One mile will receive double chip and sealcoat, according to Giffin, while the rest of the road will receive a single

Giffin said he expects to

open bids in one month for the aggregate and sealcoat for the project. He said work should start in September, though sealcoating could be delayed until next year depending on the timing and conditions.

Board members also discussed a recent open house held by Apex Clean Energy, which is exploring the feasibility of a windenergy project in Stark and Peoria counties. Board members Joe Orwig and Robin Nowlan attended the meeting.

The Goldrush Apple Wind project could include up to 60-65 wind towers with two-thirds of those in southern Stark County, according to Orwig. He said the project will feature 600-foot towers.

According to the Goldrush Apple website, landowners who participate in the project receive annual payments for 30 years.

In its latest newsletter, Apex said it has surpassed 50,000 acres signed up for the project. Peoria County will be the first phase and is expected to be operational in 2028. Stark County is the second phase and is projected to be operational by 2029.

The Stark County Zoning Board of Appeals was to hear requests for special use permits on July 8, but that meeting was cancelled due to the lack of a quorum. The permits, which pertain to erecting meteorological towers to gauge wind speeds, will be rescheduled for August.

Bids for Motor Fuel Tax road work were opened, and Potter and Sons Blacktopping was the lone bidder, coming in \$10,000 less than the city's estimate of \$54,951.

The council approved \$2,470.64 to purchase a 3inch trash pump and a semi-trash pump. Last week, when two water mains broke, the fire department had to supply a 2inch pump that could not keep up with the flow from a 6-inch water main.

A discussion was held about raising water, sewer and garbage rates. Though the council seeks to break

even on the cost of garbage removal, that does not happen. And an ongoing project on city water mains is not completely covered by the grant obtained for that project.

The council plans to discuss possible rate increases at its next meeting.

Council members also heard that park bathrooms are being repaired at a cost of \$691 due to frozen pipes, a sinkhole is being repaired and quotes are being sought for the repaving of an alley and the East Jefferson Street culvert as well as for spraypatching in the Winslow shed area.

The council also ap-

proved the \$38,060 purchase of skid-steer equip-

Christine Winscott will replace Barb Cantwell as city clerk starting next week, assuming she accepts the position with amended terms the council made after her initial interview. 



# The Fourth of July that saved the nation

As an end-of-the-road farm boy growing up deep in southern Illinois, the Fourth of July was more of a shadetree holiday from the alfalfa field than a noisy celebration of national independence. Besides, we were more partial to a local hero, Abraham Lincoln, than any frilly "Founding Father."

That leaning was confirmed a halfcentury later

when, on July 4, 2021, I came across an essay by historian Ted Widmer that examined Lincoln's 1861 Fourth of July, his first as president. In the essay, Widmer explained how one of Lin-

coln's first acts as president, a 6,200word letter to Congress calling it to Washington, D.C., for a special session, set the stage for his future greatness.

The bold act, just four months after his March 4 swearing in, Widmer thinks, was Lincoln using "democracy to save democracy ... by asking that the session ... meet on July 4" so it might link every American "to the Declaration of Independence, and the memory of a country that began in a most idealistic way."

Lincoln needed to act boldly; six southern states had left the Union and four more were on the way. Also, Jefferson Davis, the "provisional" president of the fast-forming Confederacy, had already been in office a month longer than Lincoln.

More to the point, Lincoln knew he was no Davis; his single, two-year term in Congress was no match for Davis's sterling career: West Point graduate, an officer in the Mexican-American War, a former U.S. senator, past secretary of war and former son-in-law of President Zachary Taylor.

But, explains Widmer, Lincoln possessed something Davis didn't – an "expansive understanding" of the Declaration of Independence. Lincoln believed that America's "freedoms belonged to all Americans, including immigrants" and, "in the fullness of time, he expected those freedoms to grow stronger, and reach other peoples, living in what he called 'the vast future."

In other words, all Americans then and now or, as the historian simply notes, "us."

All that served as a backdrop to the letter itself, a masterpiece in "the way a Fourth of July oration should" be. Equally important, its principled arguments and classic Lincoln lyricism hinted at the greatness yet to come in both his time in the White House and his historical timelessness.

Lincoln, says Widmer, "argued that the war was 'essentially a people's contest,' and reminded Americans that democracy required a fundamental trust in others to work."

And in language as relevant for today's red-and-blue politics as that of a nation about to tip into a blue-and-gray Civil War, "If 'discontented individuals' attacked the government every time they lost an election, with

false 'sophisms'" – misleading arguments – "and other ways of 'drugging the public mind,' it would put an end to democracy everywhere."

To ensure that all Americans north and south got his meaning, Lincoln added a punchline, "When ballots have been 'fairly and constitutionally decided,' there can be no appeal 'back to bullets.""

The letter was a triumph. "As members of Congress listened," writes Widmer, "they often broke into applause, stunned that their new president had found a language so compelling."

Later that same day, after reviewing Union troops on Pennsylvania Avenue, Lincoln "hoisted a flag himself, to the top of a tall flagpole." Afterwards, soldiers did the same and "the papers reported that the Declaration was read over and over again, throughout the soldier camps."

One Army regiment's leader, however, asked the new president to speak. Lincoln deferred, writes Widmer, "...By saying that the dignity of his position required that he say nothing at all for fear of misspeaking."

But, reminds the historian, "He had already spoken volumes through his message to Congress, and his unwavering belief in the Declaration. The real fighting had not started yet, but by winning the day, Lincoln began to win the war."



# Illinois switching to ACT exam for 2024-25

SPRINGFIELD – When Illinois high school students sit down to take their annual state assessments next year, they will take a different exam than in recent years. The Illinois State Board of Education has announced that starting next spring, it will use the ACT exam rather than

Both are standardized tests that measure students' proficiency in core subjects such as English language arts and math. Both are also commonly used for college admissions although many colleges and universities have stopped requiring them – as well as scholarship applications.

Illinois, however, also uses them as part of the battery of tests schools administer each year to meet federal mandates under the Every Student Succeeds Act. Results of those tests are reported each year on the Illinois Report Card and are used to hold schools and districts accountable for meeting basic academic standards.

Illinois started using the SAT with Essay as the state assessment for 11th-grade students in spring 2017. Two years later, it began using the PSAT 8/9 exam for 9th-grade students and the PSAT 10 for high school sophomores.

At the time, according to ISBE, incorporating a college entrance exam into the state's annual assessment

program was considered a bonus because it gave nearly all graduating high schoolers a reportable score, paid for by the state, which could be used for college applications. In recent years, though, many colleges and universities stopped requiring either the SAT or ACT as part of their admission processes.


A six-year, \$53 million contract with ACT was finalized in May.

The ISBEsays one advantage of switching exams is the ACT includes a science component, whereas the SAT only covered the core subjects of reading, writing and math. That means 11th-grade students will no longer have to take a separate Illinois Science Assessment.









# Stark Co. board passes bridge plan

TOULON – The Stark County Board of Supervisors passed an agreement to check for scour damage on local bridges at a special meeting on June 26.

The board contracted with Hutchinson Engineering Inc. of Jacksonville for \$50,000. The agreement must be approved by the regional engineer of the Illinois Department of Transportation.

If approved by IDOT, then according to Thomas J. Winkelman, project manager for Hutchinson, nine bridges in Stark County will be inspected initially for scouring.

"Scouring is where there's evidence that dirt has been moved away from a bridge's structure and pilings," Winkelman said.

As part of a scour plan, a consulting firm - in this case, Hutchinson - inspects a bridge and compares it later to see if scouring has occurred.

"If scouring occurs, then we (Hutchinson) will recommend Stark County hire at additional costs contractors to repair the damage to the bridges and provide a remedy to prevent further scouring," Winkelman said.

The nine bridges slated for the scouring survey are: Township Road 99 over Indian Creek, Township Road 130 over East Fork Spoon River, Township Road 62 over Jack Creek, Township Road 135 and 151 over Camp Run, Township Road 128 over Mud Run and Township Road 10 over Walnut Creek at two locations.
