Highway department a topic at meeting

TOULON – The Stark County highway department was the focus of discussion three different times during the Stark County Board of Supervisors' Aug. 13 meeting.

The first came during public comment, when Phil St. John said a land survey by Bruner, Cooper, & Zuck, whom he hired, shows that the highway building is 1.4 feet on his farm property. It was generally agreed that it has been that way for approximately three to four years.

County Engineer Judd Giffin said the county will move the building, but only after hiring its own survey contractor to verify the claim.

The second moment came when Giffin presented a brief oral report. The highway department has received approval from the Illinois Department of Transportation for its *Continued on Page 7*

Toulon passes new sewer ordinance

TOULON – The City of Toulon has established a process to reimburse property owners for repairs to existing lateral sewer lines.

The Toulon City Council approved an ordinance established a reimbursement polict at its Aug. 12 meeting.

"It reimburses property owners 50 percent of the cost of replacing their sewer lines if the lateral is more than 40 feet from their property line," City Attorney Kate Carter said. "Reimbursement will be up to \$5,000 per project with \$20,000 available per year. It's a first-come, first-serve basis."

A property owner has to submit an estimated cost to Toulon Mayor Larry Hollis prior to work being performed. The mayor and property owner both have to sign an agreement. The property owner will be paid after the work is completed and approved.

This is for existing properties and not for new properties being constructed. Restoration of sidewalks and streets or roads will be completed by the city and not the property owners.

Council member Brandon Simpson raised a concern about speed-limit violators on Main Street.

"We should inquire about an Illinois Department of Transportation traffic study," Simpson said. "Are there a lot of people driving faster than 25 mph? Yes, I'm even guilty of that."

City employee Matt Forstrom has called trucking companies about speeding drivers.

Stark Co. FFA qualifies 4 for national finals

CAMBRIDGE – Chelsey Stotler, Adam West, and Toby Williams of the Stark County FFA chapter in Toulon have been named national finalists this year in the National FFA Agriscience Fair competition.

Senior Cole Kinsella of the Stark County FFA chapter in Toulon received a bronze, placing in the Animal Systems category for Division 5 (grades 11-12). Kinsella, son of Jim and Joni Kinsella of Wyoming, had previously won the Illinois Agriscience Fair Division 5 Animal Systems state title and was recognized onstage in June during the Illinois FFA Convention.

Kinsella's project, "Evaluating the Viability of Freeze-Dried Bovine sp. Sperm in Tris-EDTA," evaluated the effects of freeze-drying bovine sperm cells and their effectiveness once rehydrated and studied. Kinsella finished in the top 35 in the nation.

Stotler, daughter of Jim and Jodi Stotler of Bradford, qualified in the Food Products and Processing Systems Division 5 category. Her project, "Storage Method Effects on Escherichia coli Contaminated Ground Beef' focused on the variables affecting meat contaminated with E. coli.

West, son of Bruce and Crystal West of West Jersey, qualified in the Social Systems Division 5 category. In his project titled "Perceptions of Agricultural Educator Characteristics by Secondary Educator Peers," West studied how ag teachers are viewed by their coteachers and what characteristics ag teachers exhibit. He was able to survey

Gary Bent suggested placing speed-indicator signs on Main Street, but warned it would be expensive to obtain the signs.

The council discussed options to curb speeding, including police presence with radar guns and issuing citations. Hollis said he will contact IDOT about a traffic

The council discussed the water operator's contract in regards to replacing the retiring Don McCauley. Hollis interviewed two candidates, Chad McCleary of Iowa's ION Solutions and Kurt Downie of Utica. Downie received the council's support because he is also Wyoming's water operator and lives closer to Toulon. Hollis wanted the council's input and said he will offer the position to Downie.

Bent explained the new police truck purchase and a new police department hire. The city is purchasing a 2025 GMC pickup truck to serve as the police department's police vehicle. Bent said he has hired Toulon's Valerie Wagher to help part time with administrative paperwork.

A water, sewer and garbage committee meeting will be scheduled to discuss increases to those rates to be charged for those three service.

"We lose money every year," Hollis said. "We have fairly low rates but we need to be charging a little more."

The council approved a \$1,000 donation to the Stark County Continuous Improvement organization. Also approved was the \$21,000 purchase of a new high-service pump to feed water into the water tower.

A bid of \$7,250 by T&J was approved to replace sidewalks on Jefferson Street in front of the Baptist Church and one on Miller Street. Also approved was AAA Excavating's proposal for \$4,000 to remove brush and weeds that surround the banks of Toulon's sewer system lagoons. A preventative layer of material will be installed on the banks to keep brush and weeds from growing back.

The council approved, by a split vote, paying Potter & Sons \$16,566 for street pavinga on West Jefferson Street and paving at Miller Street and Turner Avenue. Hollis cast the deciding "yes" vote.

Finally, \$9,934 was approved to Potter & Sons to refurbish the alley from South Franklin Street east 97 feet.

The council will ban large garbage trucks from using the alley after the repairs. Apartment residents will have to take garbage cans to South Franklin Street.



Tariffs are never a good idea

Milton Friedman, the patron saint of free markets and a founder of the Nobel-adorned Chicago school of economics, took a very dim view of all tariffs - ours, theirs and anyone's.

Writing in "Capitalism and Freedom," his surprising 1962 best seller, Friedman explained that if

"unilateral free trade" is the goal, "reciprocal negotiations of tariff reductions ... seems wrong." First, it's too slow; "He moves fastest who moves alone," he admonished.

"In the second place," he continued, "(i)t makes it appear as if tariffs help the country imposing them but hurt the other countries. In truth, the situation is quite different. Our tariffs hurt us as well as other countries."

That's Friedman's entire tariff seminar: "Our tariffs hurt us as well as other countries."

And don't worry about other nations' tariffs, Friedman adds. "We would be benefited by dispensing with our tariffs even if other countries did not."

That's not a political statement; it's a key tenet of free trade from one of the most influential Nobel laureates in history. Many deeply conservative politicians worldwide - among them Barry Goldwater, Ronald Reagan, and Margaret Thatcher – however, did adopt Friedman's advocacy of the free

market as their own.

So what's changed in world markets since that Kennedy era pronouncement to now encourage former president Donald Trump to make import tariffs the centerpiece of his campaign's economic policy?

Absolutely nothing. Tariffs – ours, theirs and anyone's - remain terrible economics; they still "hurt us as well as other countries."

Confirmation of this straightforward reality comes courtesy of the last Trump tariff fight in 2018 and 2019 on, chiefly, U.S. imports of Chinese steel and aluminum and U.S. exports of ag commodities. Neither tariff delivered what was promised: more American jobs, better economic growth, and increased U.S. sales.

In fact, reported the New York Times on Aug. 27, 2019, "Lucrative contracts that farmers long relied on ... have evaporated, with Chinese buyers looking to other nations like Brazil and Canada to get the commodities they need."

The story then quotes an American Farm Bureau estimate that "total American agricultural exports to China were \$24 billion in 2014 and fell to \$9.1 billion last year," the first year of the Trump tariffs on U.S. commodity exports to China.

The Times wasn't the only one to notice Trump's southbound tariff policy. In January 2020, Forbes reported that the "Trump administration gave more taxpayer dollars to farmers harmed by (its) trade policies than the federal government spends each year building ships for the Navy or maintaining America's nuclear arsenal."

Despite the clear evidence, the Trump campaign insists its current push for import tariffs – from 10% on all U.S. imports to 60% or more on U.S. imports from China – will ensure the American economy grows faster than competitors.

Nonsense, says the Peterson Institute for International Economics, a nonpartisan economic research firm in Washington, D.C. "Unlike (today's) Biden tariffs," the Institute posted in January, "the Trump plan is for increased tariffs on all products from all countries."

That's "not just America First," the analysis continues parroting the Trump campaign's economic theme, "it is America alone." Tariffs "are in fact added taxes on us, and having them will have real costs."

American farmers are very familiar with those "real costs." Within weeks of imposing 25% import tariffs on Chinese products in 2018, "Beijing accused the United States of 'launching the largest trade war in economic history," reported the Los Angeles Times July 2018.

Then it "fired back with dollarfor-dollar tariffs mainly on American farm products and other food." It also quickly pivoted to "buying more from Brazil and Argentina."

Which is the exact outcome Milton Friedman predicted in 1962: "Our tariffs hurt us as well as other countries."



Third, the final agenda item was on finding a location for a new county building. The board went into closed session for 45 minutes, then quickly adjourned after going back into open session.

Board Chair Kari Bush would not say whether the new highway building will be on next month's agenda.

During committee reports, it was asked if police committee members Bill Loane and Jamie Shaffer had any recent correspondence with Stark County Sheriff Steven Sloan.

Loane said that it was "a good question and needs to be addressed" because he said the police committee has not heard from Sloan in a while.

All departments presented their budgets during a finance committee meeting held prior to the regular meeting with the exception of the Sheriff's office and the highway department. Betsy Colclasure said the Sheriff's budget would be presented next month. Giffin said the highway department budget would be presented "later."

The new county auditors, Phillips, Salmi & Associates, of Washington, said that the county's audit was "very clean."

In other business, the board:

• Approved a \$1,000 donation to the Stark County Continuous Improvement organization

- Passed a resolution to keep closed session minutes closed.
- Passed a groundwater ordinance for the FMC property at 11522 Twp. Rd. 700N in Wyoming.
- Passed six special use permits for meteorological evaluation towers to be installed in Stark County by APEX Clean Energy to collect wind data. Towers would be constructed after harvest, according to

APEX representative Shelley Schwab, of Lake Elmo, Minn. The towers would be 200 feet tall and not permanent. Permits cost \$25 per foot. APEX has an office in Princeville.

Finally, several people who said they were from Winnebago County representing the United Sovereign Citizens Association asked the board to pass a resolution that the 2022 Illinois election was fraudulent




