Solar panels paying off

Stark County school has saved \$15,068

WYOMING – The Stark County School District saved \$15,068 from April 2023 to April 2024 at its elementary school thanks to a bank of solar panels installed there.

Superintendent Brett Elliott gave a brief presentation to the School Board during its Oct. 21 meeting, noting that the cost of energy without the solar panels would have been \$31,381 as opposed to the actual cost of \$16,313. The district is also beginning to receive rebates from the energy companies.

The panels were installed several years ago at the elementary school, in Wyoming, at no cost to the district through federal funding via Future Green.

"The initial resistance by local neighbors was (that) the view from their homes was now of solar panels," Elliott wrote. "We worked with our neighbors and added screening and landscaping."

"Once we complete our solar bus barn/electric bus project, we will look to expand our solar (panels) to the high school campus for an additional savings of \$20,000 to \$25,000 annually."

The school district will be changing the library network it utilizes because the current provider, Reaching Across Illinois Library Systems, is increasing its cost for library resources from an estimated \$2,200 annually to \$7,700.

The new network, Follett, will charge an upfront cost of \$10,076 for uploading the entire

Toulon tackles blight

House to be demolished, others to follow

TOULON – An eyesore property will be a step closer to being cleared when bids are received and one is accepted by the Toulon city council during next month's council meeting.

The house at 311 N. Fuller St. has cleared the legal steps in order for the city to demolish the structure. In addition to this property, houses at 315 W. Jefferson St. and 213 E. Greenwood St. are awaiting court decisions to receive a demolition order on each, according to Toulon City Attorney Kate Carter.

During its Oct. 16 meeting, the council heard from Committee Chair Donna Lefler about proposed rate increases for water, sewer and garbage/recycling services. The proposal has to be part of a new city ordinance.

The proposal calls for a \$7.50 increase in the water base rate from \$16.97 to \$24.47 for the usage rate of 100 gallons of water.

The sewer base rate will be raised \$1 from \$18.13 to \$19.13 with the usage rate of 42 cents to 45 cents per 100 gallons.

The garbage/recycle rate of \$21.59 increases to \$23.59 to offset the cost for these services.

Normally, 3% rate increases are made in May of the fiscal year but since this new special-rate increase is effective next month, the council will not charge rate increases in May of 2025. This increase is in anticipation of costs associated with constructing the new water tower.

Mayor Larry Hollis said Halloween hours will be from 5-7 p.m. on Oct. 31 this year.

Police Chair Ryan Kelly presented the Toulon police department September re-

Galva school to vote on new three-year bond

GALVA – The Galva School Board decided at its Oct. 21 meeting to act on the option of issuing a working cash bond when it meets again in November.

The district's current working cash bond of \$1.2 million will expire in 2025.

The new bond will also be for \$1.2 million, but will have a shorter term of just three years. There will be a bond hearing prior to the next meeting at 6:55 p.m.

The board also discussed the daily pay rate for substitute teachers. According to Superintendent Joe Becker, the district's current \$100 per day rate for subs is lowest in the area.

Becker said that makes it harder to get substitutes to work in Galva when Wethersfield is paying \$145 per day and Stark County pays \$135 per day. He said that the average for the area is \$125 per day.

The board will take action on that pay rate in November.

The board chose Board President Andrew Larson as Galva's delegate for the Illinois School Board Convention, held in Chicago in November.

The board also approved the following employment items:

- The resignation of Sarah Townsend as eighth grade volleyball coach.
- The resignation of Chance Jones as JV girls basketball coach.
- Hiring Brad Jackson as girls varsity head basketball coach for 2024-25.
- Hiring Becky Wigant as JV basketball coach for 2024-25.
- Adding Heather Anderson as a junior high volleyball volunteer for 2024-25.

port. There were 10 traffic stops, two citations, one civil call, one assist to Wyoming, assists to the Stark County Sheriff’s Office, four ordinance violations, one domestic call and one bar fight.

The council also heard that fire hydrants will continue to be flushed. Additionally, the city will advertise in The Prairie News in the search to hire a city hall secretary.

Landscaping at city hall is to be removed and replaced. The city plans to put this project out for bids. Also, trees removed at city properties 112 S. Olive St. and 106 W. Commercial St. cost the city \$5,200, minus the \$1,000 a homeowner contributed toward this expense.

A tractor was approved to be purchased at a cost of \$33,000 from John Forstrom. The city’s current 1990s era tractor has reached the end of its service life and the clutch doesn’t work.

In a split vote, the council agreed to pay \$20,000 to Hometown Consulting for a two-year contract to provide Toulon with economic development services. Voting “no” were

Mitch Hulsey, Connie Jacobson and Ryan Kelly while “yes” votes were from Brandon Simpson, Michael Schott and Donna Lefler. Hollis cast the deciding “yes” vote.

High-efficiency pumps purchased at \$21,000 to improve the city’s water system will be installed at night to lessen the effect on residents. These pumps are compatible with the new tower to be built.

A lengthy discussion concerning the trailer court at East Jefferson Street resulted in Eric Guy, of Abingdon, asking the city to give his business time to “cleanup the trailers and remedy the present ordinance violations.”

City attorney Kate Carter will talk with Guy about the ordinances and could possibly reach an agreement with those ordinance violations.

library collection into the system, training, etc. and \$3,300 annually over a three-year contract, according to School District Librarian Mary Beth Kelly.

During his report, Elliott informed the board that the track project is done and that new gymnasium construction continues with flooring being installed over the next few weeks.

“Paint, windows, doors, drywall, plumbing, electrical, scoreboards and more have been completed,” Elliott said. “The original stain for the exterior high school needed a second coat. We were not happy with the results, so we had our construction manager use the same paint, not stain, as used on the new gym. Since the stain was under warranty, it is at no cost to the district.”

The board approved renewing two intergovernmental agreements with the Bradford School District.

One allows Bradford students to participate in athletics at Stark County schools.

The second agreement gives graduat-

ing Bradford eighth graders an option to choose between Bureau Valley High School or Stark County High School.


Drug testing of athletes was suspended during COVID, but will resume for winter athletics. Students will be sent to Toulon’s First Choice Stark County Health Department’s facility.

The Annual Fiscal Year 2024 audit was presented by a representative from Gorrenz and Associates. Stark County school district was told that they did a decent job budgeting and were in the top range.

The school board gave permission for Elliott to begin the 2024 tax levy process to be presented at next month’s meeting. Elliott stated that Equalized Assessed Value is going up in Stark County but he isn’t certain what that rate is going to become. The board will have to decide if it will have a truth in taxation hearing if it opts for an increase of more than 5% in taxes.


Finally, the board accepted Russell Schierer’s resignation as a bus driver, effective Sept. 24.





Of religion, politics, Mel Brooks & prairie seeds

Want a headache? Discuss politics with someone these days. Or religion.

Last week we printed a letter by **Arlene Heinz** of Elmwood in our other paper, The Weekly Post that encompassed both topics. In it, she wrote about keeping the Ten Commandments. What Arlene wrote in her letter was “especially the Fifth, ‘Thou shall not kill.’”

Big Mac bites Big Meat over beef prices

If you buy nearly two billion pounds of beef a year – an on-the-hoof equivalent of seven million cattle – you’d think you’d get the best deal ever from your suppliers. You are, after all, the world’s largest red meat buyer.

Think again, says McDonald’s.

On Oct. 4, it sued the big four meatpackers – JBS, Tyson Foods, Cargill and National Beef Packing – “for allegedly conspiring for years to limit beef supplies, boosting their profits while causing the fast food giant to pay artificially higher prices,” reported Reuters.

So Big Mac wants a bite out of Big Meat who, the suit claims, collectively reduced their output to drive up industry prices since 2015.

They were able to do so, the juicy, 100-page filing alleges, because the four packers “Collectively ... controlled approximately 81-85% of the domestic market-ready fed cattle processed (or slaughtered) during the conspiracy period. The next largest non-Defendant meatpacker had only a 2-3% market share.”

Welcome to the jungle, Ronald McDonald, where thousands of U.S. cattlemen, bold enough to risk their livelihoods, have been complaining about meatpacker market power for decades.

Their woes, however, have been on the cattle-selling side of the market. Dominant packers, the cowboys al-

lege, have managed slaughter numbers to move live cattle prices – often lower – more than market conditions justify. But proof remains elusive.

Still, in 2004, an Alabama jury awarded cattlemen \$1.28 billion in a class-action lawsuit (known as Pickett) brought against then-beef packer IBP for using its market clout to undermine live cattle prices.

The decision was thrown out after Tyson Foods, which bought IBP in 2001, asked the court for a “judgment as a matter of law” to challenge the jury’s implication that the meatpacker had acted illegally. The judge agreed with Tyson.

In the 20 years since, Tyson, like many of its competitors, has spent millions defending its business practices in civil court and in settlements of federal charges for alleged price fixing.

According to Accountable.US, a nonpartisan special-interest watchdog in Washington, D.C., two of the packer giants, Tyson and JBS, “were involved with at least \$384 million in fines and settlements over alleged price-fixing ... during the (COVID-19) pandemic.”

McDonald’s lawsuit builds on the same theme, alleging “that the world’s largest meat processors have been conspiring since at least 2015 to limit beef supplies,” reported The Washington Post, “leading to elevated prices for the meat they sold McDonalds and others.”

Specifically, the Post continued, McDonald’s alleged that beef prices “had stayed within \$20 to \$40 of the

average price per hundred pound of wholesale beef.”

Then, around 2015, the correlation changed and by “2021, the difference had ballooned to \$156.50.” That cost Big Mac, and its customers, big bucks.

“The goal of their conspiracy,” McDonald’s alleged in its lawsuit, sounds eerily similar to what cattlemen have been saying for decades from the opposite side of the cattle market: “... to fix, raise, stabilize and/or maintain the price of beef sold to Plaintiff and others at supra-competitive levels – that is, prices artificially higher than beef prices would have been in the absence of their conspiracy.”

Congress, too, noted the change. In 2021, recalls the Post, nearly 30 of its members sent the Justice Department a letter pointing out the “price of live cattle in the U.S. market has plummeted while ... the major packing companies realized significant profits.”

After decades of complaining by cowboys, the courts and Congress, maybe a corporate mascot in oversized red shoes and a plastic grin can finally get justice in the costly clown show known as U.S. meatpacking.

Over-watered plants can actually die of thirst

You would think that after 35 years in the greenhouse business, I would know how to water a plant.

My wife considered watering to be the most important job in the greenhouse because the quality of the plants, their very lives actually, depended on it. Most days she would do it all herself rather than delegate it to other employees, myself included.

Often I would wake up at 4 a.m. and see the lights on in the greenhouses. She was already out there making sure everything was properly watered and groomed before the business opened at 9.

She and I knew that folks purchase garden annuals and perennials the

same way they buy fresh fruits and vegetables at the supermarket. Just as they reject any produce item showing the least little blemish or dark spot, they will refuse any plant showing a single dried-up leaf.

Experience taught us that one shriveled plant in a flat of 48 made the whole flat look bad, a lesson the big-box stores have yet to learn.

Usually she could tell by looking at the soil surface of the pots and flats whether they needed water. But as she watered, she would often lift a pot or flat to feel its weight to determine if the soil was wet or dry. She was very careful not to over-water. Water-logged soil can cause plants to die of thirst, believe it or not.

You see, when you over-

water a plant, the soil stays saturated, depriving the root system of oxygen. The roots begin to die and can no longer supply the plant with water and nutrients. The leaves begin to wither and turn yellow for lack of water and food.

I must admit that I interpreted the yellowing leaves to mean the plant was thirsty, not water-logged. That's a big mistake but a common one that most gardeners will encounter at one time or another.

And that's how I personally murdered a lovely white-flowered dipladenia. Without checking the soil, I regularly gave it a good shot of water every time I watered the other pots around this place. But apparently the pot of this poor dipladenia didn't have adequate drainage and it simply drowned.

So when it comes to watering your container gardens, more is not always better. Take that index finger of yours and check the soil moisture before watering. Whether you're a neophyte or an old hand at gardening, sooner or later you'll find yourself inadvertently over-watering. Just take heed of the symptoms and you will minimize the damage.

When you see yellowing leaves, first suspect over-watering to be the culprit. Feel the soil to see if it's saturated. Check the drainage holes for obstructions.

And it might sound crazy but another sign of over-watering is wilting. If a plant is drooping and the soil is wet, it's a no-brainer.

While we kept the con-

tainers watered, Mother Nature herself did a rather respectable job of watering the gardens from spring up until the end of August. We didn't need to water any of our gardens all spring and summer. Even the pulmonarias in the sunnier parts of the gardens looked great all season, never wilting as they're prone to do on hot sunny days.

But now she's dropped the ball and we're in a drought, though we did get much-needed rain in parts of central Illinois on Tuesday. Not enough, but better than more days of dry weather.

According to the National Weather Service, our current soil conditions are "abnormally dry." That's an understatement. Since the end of August (prior to Tuesday), our rain gauge had collected less than an inch.

To compensate for Mother Nature's lack of competence, I've been watering those plants crying for a drink such as red and yellow twig dogwoods, various hydrangeas, pulmonarias, astilbes, Canadian ginger and the tri-colored beech I planted a couple years ago.

All in all I'd say we've had one of the best garden seasons we've had in a long time. And from what I've been hearing, even our fellow large-scale gardeners, aka corn and soybean farmers, are admitting the yields are pretty good, thanks to the excellent growing season.

In early September, the USDA projected net farm income for 2024 to be the eighth-best year of the last 50, in spite of the current low commodity prices. Pretty good indeed.

Peak season: Watch for deer on roads

SPRINGFIELD – The Illinois Department of Transportation and Illinois Department of Natural Resources are reminding the public to be alert for deer, which are entering their peak mating season, especially at dawn and dusk now through December.

“While your instinct is to veer when you hit a deer, don’t do it because you might lose control and injure yourself or others. Try to glance your vehicle off the deer and avoid swerving into the opposite lanes of traffic or off the road,” Illinois Transportation Secretary Omer Osman said.

In 2023, there were 14,862 crashes involving deer in Illinois. Of those, 14,192 resulted in damage



to property or vehicles while 663 caused injuries. Seven of the crashes resulted in fatalities.

Although a collision with a deer can happen any time, Illinois is approaching the peak of the season. Last year, 41% of crashes involving deer in Illinois occurred in October, November and December, with November being highest-risk month. Rural areas were the site of 69%

of crashes involving deer, with 72% occurring at twilight or nighttime.

Driving tips for deer-mating season include:

- Be aware of your surroundings.
- Scan the sides of the road for eye shine – the reflection of headlights in their eyes.
- Slow down if you see a deer and anticipate that others could be following.
- Prepare for the unex-

pected. Deer may stop in the middle of the road.

- If a collision is inevitable, don’t veer. Try to glance your vehicle off the deer and avoid swerving into the opposite lanes of traffic or off the road.

The top 10 Illinois counties for deer crashes in 2023 were Cook 598, Madison 396, Kane 384, Will 381, McHenry 344, Lake 341, LaSalle 340, Sangamon 338, Fulton 300 and Peoria 286.

If you hit a deer, pull off to the shoulder, turn on your hazard lights and call 911. To claim a deer involved in a crash, fill out a road-kill deer claim form, available online at dnr.illinois.gov.

Equipment sector prepared for downturn

Ag machinery sales are taking a hit as farmers’ balance sheets tighten, but the equipment industry has been preparing for the downturn. “Over the course of history, the price of corn and the sale of tractors over 40 horsepower tend to track one to one,” Association of Equipment Manufacturers Senior Vice President Curt Blades told FarmWeek. “And we know corn prices are down right now, so it is to be expected.”

AEM’s August equipment sales report showed total sales of ag tractors in the U.S. dropped 19.4% and combine sales fell 19.6% from a year ago.

Blades said the industry learned some hard lessons from the most recent economic downturn and is better prepared for this next phase in the cycle.

“Manufacturers have been working closely with the dealers to understand what the supply chain needs are and what the market demand is,” he said. “The last thing you want is too much inventory at the dealer lot because that has a negative impact on the dealer, used prices and the rural economy.”

A report by Moody’s Ratings suggests the three largest agricultural equipment manufacturers (AGCO Corp., CNH Industrial and Deere & Company) are better positioned to deal with weakening demand com-

pared to the 2014-16 downturn. “We expect that, even in the face of significant declines in revenue, EBITA (earnings before interest, taxes and amortization) margins in 2024 will remain in the 9-20% range for all three companies, thanks in part to key operational changes, good cost management and more flexible manufacturing processes,” the report said.

The report showed the top three manufacturers are cutting back sharply on production in 2024 to decrease inventory levels in preparation for 2025.

Blades said the manufacturing industry is also focusing on options that farmers want and the variety of advantages they look at when considering equipment.

For example, Blades said this generation of machines is 20% more fuel efficient than the previous generation, allowing farmers to reduce diesel costs.

Seth Crawford is the general manager of PTx, a business unit of AGCO. He told FarmWeek that investing in companies like Precision Planting and Trimble has helped them remain innovative and focus on farmers’ needs.

Crawford said the Precision Planting division allows the company to bring technologies to market that help farmers enhance their existing fleet of equipment.

17th District looms large in battle for House

SPRINGFIELD — With less than two weeks remaining before voting ends in the 2024 election, polls have been showing Vice President Kamala Harris and former President Donald Trump in a tight race, especially in “battleground” states like Michigan, Wisconsin and Pennsylvania.

Meanwhile, an equally close battle is being waged for control of the U.S. House, where Republicans currently hold a slim seven-seat majority.

Like the presidential contest, the race for control of the House will likely be decided in a small handful of swing districts. That’s because of the 435 seats in the House, the vast majority are considered safe for one party or the other, either because there is no meaningful opposition in the race or because the district boundaries are drawn in a way that strongly favors one party over the other.

Two leading political handicapping websites, the Cook Political Report and Sabato’s Crystal Ball, rate 366 House districts, or 84% of the total, as “safe” for either Republicans or Democrats and only 69 seats as “competitive.”

In Illinois, only one of the 17 congressional districts falls into the “competitive” category — the 17th District, which covers most of Knox County, part of Henry County and stretches south from Elm-

wood into Fulton County. Cook Political Report rates the district as “likely Democrat” while Sabato’s Crystal Ball scores it

“leans Democrat.” The seat is currently held by

first-term Democrat Eric Sorensen, of Moline, a former TV weatherman for a local station in Rockford. First elected in 2022, he serves on the House Agriculture Committee and the Science, Space and Technology Committee.

He faces Republican Joe McGraw, of Rockford, a retired judge in the 17th Judicial Circuit. A graduate of the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign and the Northern Illinois University College of Law, he spent nearly 20 years as presiding judge in the criminal division of the circuit court.

Sorensen describes himself as the only meteorologist currently serving in Congress.

Speaking to his fellow Illinois Democrats at a breakfast meeting during the party’s national convention in Chicago in August, Sorensen also

described himself as “the first out LGBTQ member of Congress in Illinois’ history.” He says he supports reproductive rights and codifying Roe v. Wade, the recently overturned 1973 Supreme Court ruling that legalized abortion nationwide.

McGraw has campaigned on a law-and-order platform, touting his experience as a prosecutor, private attorney and judge. His campaign website states “soft-on-crime policies only create more victims and empower criminals.”

In September, the National Republican Congressional Committee released a digital ad attacking Sorensen, alleging he supports “exposing minors to life-altering sex-changes” and that he “hosted drag events that exposed children to adult sexual content.”

But speaking to reporters at a Tazewell County farm last week, where he accepted the endorsement of the Illinois Farm Bureau, Sorensen brushed aside such attacks.

In 2022, Sorensen won the 17th District with just under 52% of the vote over Republican Esther Joy King.

Better ball possession boosts SC

WYOMING – Clarity in the LincolnLand Conference small-division football race lasted for one week.

Headed into the final regular-season games tonight (Oct. 25), there is a three-way tie for first place. That tie includes Stark County, which on Oct. 18 beat South Fulton 48-14. Previous conference frontrunner Princeville lost 34-21 that night at Rushville-Industry.

Various tiebreakers come into play if teams finish with identical records. The head-to-head result breaks the conference-championship tie if it's between two teams, but it's unclear what happens in a three-way deadlock.
