

THREATENED MONARCHS?

Butterfly protections?

USFWS proposes listing monarchs as threatened

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service is proposing federal protections for the monarch butterfly. On Dec. 12, the service proposed listing the monarch as a threatened species and designating critical habitat

under the Endangered Species Act. According to a notice in the Federal Register, USFWS determined the monarch butterfly meets the definition of a threatened species due to ongoing impacts from loss and degradation of habitat, exposure to insecticides and the effects of climate change.

"To improve future conditions so that the monarch migratory populations stabilize and grow, we need to (1) achieve a significant increase in the availability of milkweed and nectar plants in monarch

breeding and migratory areas; (2) protect and enhance overwintering habitat; (3) avoid and minimize impacts to monarchs and their habitat from insecticides and herbicides; and (4) maintain public support for the conservation of monarch butterflies," it is written in the notice.

The listing proposal is accompanied by a proposed rule that offers species-specific protections and

flexibilities to encourage conservation and a proposed "critical habitat" designation for the species at its overwintering grounds in 4,395 acres in coastal California.

Comments can be submitted to the Federal Register through March 12.

On Dec. 2, the board met and reduced the levy increase to 7.99% after the county's estimated assessed value of properties in the district was lowered to an increase of 7%. During the regular meeting, the adjusted tax levy was approved.

Elliott said Stark County school district is losing teachers to bordering school districts as part of the ongoing teacher shortage. He said that for \$3,000 to \$4,000 more in salary teachers are going to bordering districts. He said those districts are increasing teacher salaries by up to 36% with a combination of factors.

Two residents spoke "against any tax increase and voiced concern regarding a declining population in Stark County and the potential long-term financial impact." One resident told the

Galva schools levy increases by \$756,411

For The Prairie News GALVA - The Galva School Board on Monday approved a tax levy ordinance in the amount of \$5,466,367, up \$756,441 from last year.

Equalized assessed value of property in the district increased from \$103,920,607 to \$120,377,584 due to the expiration of one of Galva's TIF districts.

The tax rate will be \$4.54 per \$100 of assessed valuation.

The board also approved to sell \$1.2 million in general obligation school bonds. Community State Bank of Galva offered the lowest interest rate at 4.05-4.25%. Kendall King of the King Financial company said the bank gave a good rate to the district. The bonds will be for four years. King said that

next year, another one of the city TIFs will expire.

Math teachers Trish Klein and Jeremy Painter gave some facts about a new math curriculum for Algebra I. They both said they wished they had more he has a trip planned for first and second semester for students who only miss two or less days of school per semester. The Junior-Senior High School is also working hard on improving attendance.

Board members gave a brief report on seminars they attended at the recent state school board conference held in Chicago. All of the Galva school board



Presidents exercise power, move on

Pardons. Just say the term and people will give you an opinion. The offender got out of his sentence unjustly. The offender was unjustly convicted and a wrong has been righted.

The offender has redeemed himself and is worthy of grace. The opinions are there and they certainly are not exclusive of each other.

Recently, the country has been somewhat animated about President Biden's

pardon of his son, Hunter Biden, on gun and tax evasion charges. Both Democrats and Republicans have taken to the airwaves to voice their disapproval, especially as President Biden had explicitly told the public that he would not pardon his son. My read on the issue may annoy or anger

some and it may amuse others. The power to pardon is given exclusively to the President by the Constitution for federal crimes. Most state constitutions also give a similar power to governors for state crimes.

There is no appeal from the president's choice to pardon. It is his power absolutely. Most people that I have spoken to are upset Biden issued the pardon for his son. President Trump incurred a lot of anger when he granted a pardon to former Gov. Rod Blagojevich who was convicted of corruption charges. President Clinton also incurred public displeasure when he pardoned his half-brother on drug charges.

Presidential pardons tend to be given at the end of the president's term because there may be political difficulties for the president should he be facing election. And that is the key. The only recourse the public has for a pardon the public views as wrong is to impeach the president or to vote him out of office.

The ballot means nothing if the president is not running for office.

Impeachment has a similar limitation and Congress is simply not inclined to take up an impeachment over a pardon. Neither course of action will take the pardon away. The individual's pardon is irrevocable.

Biden, Trump and Clinton all made decisions to pardon, as have other presidents. Those decisions are beyond the public's purview. The only person with the authority and power to pardon is the president, and there is no appeal. Trump will regain the presidency in January and his pardon of Blagojevich received minimal, commentary, if that, during the campaign. There are simply some things that happen in government that are above the pay grade of us regular folks.

Biden exercised his power and authority. It is simply time to move on. *Richard Koritz is an Illinois native and former DeWitt County State's Attorney.*

WYOMING – Wyoming's city council on Tuesday heard Ben Leezer of the Leezer Insurance Agency in Toulon present a third insurance carrier's proposed premium for coverage.

That company is Bliss-McKnight, which offered the highest proposal compared to Tokio-Marine and Illinois Counties Risk Management Trust.

Leezer recommended Tokio-Marine, the city's current carrier, for a total policy renewal of \$58,056. The council passed a resolution later during the meeting approving that cost for Tokio-Marine's premium.

In another presentation, Melinda Edwards represented The Stark County Elementary Parents' Club and requested a donation from the city for the club's annual auction fundraiser. This year's auction fundraiser will be held March 15 at the 4H/Junior Fairgrounds in Wyoming.

City Superintendent Joe Kinsella reported that all has been going well. He said he intends to line some sewer lines next spring.


Water/sewer manager Jim Mercer stated, "The sewer plant is running well. Repainting of the water building's interior has started."






