A spring to savor

Stark County senior Stotler wins title in shot put

BRADFORD – Bradford’s long-storied past of sports champions added a new member last week.

Stark County High School senior Chelsey Stotler, who turns 17 next month, won the IHSA Class 1A shot put championship by tossing an eight-pound metal ball 42 feet, 4¼ inches.

Her journey to becoming a state champion has not come without pain and sacrifice. Stotler has had surgery on both shoulders and both elbows. And after surgery on her right shoulder last August, Stotler decided to change her throwing style to rotational instead of

New Bradford president, trustees take office; OK buying generator

BRADFORD – Newly elected Bradford Village President Sharon Cauthon and trustees John Cler and Angie Courtway on May 21 were sworn into office during a village board meeting.

They join Kodi Cade, Pat Berlin and Angela Stange on Bradford’s board of trustees. There is still one vacancy on the board to be filled by appointment in the near future.

In the business portion of the monthly meeting, Village Engineer Justin Reease, of Giffin-Reeise Engineering, Inc., Henry, told the board that a \$114,000, 400-megawatt generator has been ordered from Altorfer CAT. The generator is be installed at Bradford’s water plant.

“You can double that cost for installation to around \$250,000,” Reease said.

Under new business, the board heard that opening day for the Bradford pool was to be Wednesday, May 28. The board also discussed wages for pool employees. Manager Bobbi Jo Chadwick receives \$17.85 per hour, new lifeguards over age 18 earn \$15 per hour, returning lifeguards are paid \$15.50 per hour and lifeguards under age 18 receive \$14.50 per hour, whether new or returning.

Pool admission is free for people living within the Bradford school district and \$4 for those living outside the school district. Pool parties are \$200 for two hours and \$375 for three hours.

The board also approved paperwork concerning an OSLAD grant for parks; a resolution for the designation of code enforcement officer; and hiring Douglas W. Irwin and Co., Ltd. of Kewanee as certified public accountants for \$7,300 per year.

Also, the board approved pay-

using the glide technique that she employed last spring while placing fourth in the Class 1A shot put with her throw of 38-8.75 as a junior.

It's an understatement to say the change worked out very well. Stotler, the daughter of Jim and Jodi Stotler of Bradford, has rewritten the Stark County record book several times this spring en route to her first-place medal.

Her personal-best throw of 43-4.25 came on May 5 during the inaugural meet at Stark County's new track-and-field facility.

"That ranks me second (in state) across all three classes," Chelsey Stotler said, noting it is also the best throw all season in Class 1A.

As to the state meet, Stotler said, "I knew coming in that it was going to be really tough, but I think that how well I was prepared between Mr. (Clint) Terwilliger coaching me, as well as Andrew McGhghy coaching me, I knew I could do it."

McGhghy coaches at Rochester High School and also runs a camp for shot put and discus throwers called the Sangamon Throws Club.

Even so, Stotler knew winning would take a strong effort.

"I knew it was not going to be easy. The other girls were going to make me battle for it," she said.

Stotler qualified for state by throwing 41-0.5 in Aledo to take first at the Mercer County Sectional. Stotler also throws the discus and just missed qualifying for that event at sectional.

Even so, she said her concentration was with the shot put.

At state she had to battle through a strong Class 1A field. Three flights of 12 competitors competed in prelims on May 22 and the top 12 advanced to finals last Saturday.

"The Class 1A girls qualified four out of the top 10 across all Classes. 1A was definitely the most competitive Class of the three," Stotler said.

Stotler accomplished her championship journey in just five years. She became interested in the shot put after joining Bradford's elementary school 5th grade track team.

The COVID pandemic put a halt

to track competition for Stotler during her 6th and 7th grade years. Stotler won her IESA sectional in 8th grade, but there was no state meet held that year.

She practiced at the old Toulon high school ring and at Galva High School facilities.

Stotler plans to attend college at the University of Illinois majoring in food science and minoring in microbiology. Stotler received several scholarships this spring, including the Stacey Fairfield Memorial Scholarship, the Compeer Financial Scholarship and a State Bank of Toulon community banking scholarship.

In addition to studying at the University of Illinois, Stotler said she plans to compete with a track and field club in Champaign and see how far it will take her outside of the university.

"I would like to thank Mr. T. and the rest of the Stark County track and field team for continually supporting me for the past four years," Stotler said. "I couldn't have done it without all of their support."

ing \$1,400 for Bart Shatto to perform a Labor Day show. The fee pays for his plane fare and car rental while in Bradford. Shatto

Rounding out an impressive visit to Eastern Illinois University were seventh-place finishes by Cheyenh Smith in the 800 and senior Lauren Orwig in discus. Cheyenh Smith’s time of 2:16.97 was a personal record, while Orwig’s throw of 123-8 was less than 3 feet from her school record of 126-7.25.

“Cheyenh has wanted this so bad,” Terwilliger said. “She was a little nervous on Thursday, but got herself to finals where she just let it go. One thing I

have learned is never to underestimate Cheyenh Smith.”

The same is true of Orwig, who Terwilliger credited with an impressive work ethic.

“She has worked extremely hard in the last four years. Countless hours in the weight room. More drill work than we could even count,” he said. “She wanted a state medal and that’s exactly what she got.”

In other events, Stark County got an 11th-place finish from Dusti Smith in
