Galva will make repairs on veteran cemetery markers

For The Prairie News GALVA - The City of Galva plans to make needed repairs to some markers near the graves of veterans buried in Galva Cemeterv.

Some markers were put in cement near the headstones for easier mowing, but the caulk on some needs to be replaced as they are not sturdy. To remedy that, silicone will be placed around the markers to secure

Third Ward Alderman Dougie Anderson reported that there are more than 1,000 veterans buried in Galva Cemetery, eight of whom served in the War of 1812. Anderson and First Ward Alder-

man Jeff Olson both reported that the cemetery looked excellent for Memorial Day. In other business, the council

announced that it will open bids at its July 7 meeting for a small lot located at 301 Market St.,

commonly known as the old Windish Mill property.

City Administrator David Dyer said the water department will need to replace two leaking fire hydrants after they were flushed.

Police Chief Kraig Townsend reported that burn days are only Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday from dawn to dusk. He said that the only things that can be burned are sticks and leaves, "Anything that comes off a tree." Townsend said residents are

burning furniture rather than putting a \$10 sticker on them to get picked up. Galva's waste hauler, Eagle Enterprises, picks up large items once a month but you must purchase a sticker and call them so they are aware of the large item on your terrace.

Supervisor Richard Plummer reported that clean-up days will be June 16-21. Anyone who is not able to get their items to the roll-off at the City Maintenance building must have them on the curb by 6 a.m. Monday morning and call City Hall to tell them they are there. Only one trip will be made per house. And city workers will not pick up items on private property, as it must be on the curb.

Deck on the lam

No-show for jail processing Monday

For The Prairie News TOULON - Caleb A. Deck, 48, was supposed to be in Bureau County Jail on Monday.

Instead, as of press time, authorities were still on the lookout for Deck, who on May 30 was sentenced to 120 days in jail for various traffic charges.

On Tuesday, Circuit Court Judge James A. Mack signed an arrest warrant for Deck, who was supposed to have shown up at the Stark County Jail on Monday at 9 a.m. for processing and transport to Bureau County. He faces a criminal dismeanor charge for the no-show.

Deck also faces a June 20 motion hearing for pending felony charges. He has been charged with aggravated assault of a police officer, two counts of a felon in possession of ammunition, burglary, theft of government property and criminal trespass to state land. Deck's jury trial is set for Aug. 4 at 9 a.m.

Deck formerly lived in an apartment above the Wyoming Drivers and Motor Vehicles facility at 107 E. Williams St. That office was closed on March 27 due to what State Rep. Travis Weaver called Deck's "ongoing criminal activity."

Deck had his traffic charges heard during a May 30 bench trial in front of Mack, at which Public Defender Robert M. McBride and Stark County State's Attorney Austin King presented arguments. Deck was found guilty on two of six traffic violations and Mack sentenced him to 120 days in jail, with dayfor-day credit. That means Deck was to serve 60 days Continued on Page 2

Mack found Deck guilty of driving on a revoked driver's license (a charge he has faced more than four times previously) and improper turn signal. Mack told Deck that he ignores the law and keeps driving.

Not-guilty counts were for fleeing/eluding police, defective windshield, disregarding a stop sign and seat-belt violation.

Stark County Deputy Sheriff William Dorn testified about an Oct. 21, 2023, incident in Wyoming that led to the traffic charges.

Dorn said he observed a white SUV on 3rd Street turning westbound toward what was then the Horse

Sale Barn. Dorn attempted to make a traffic stop, but the SUV continued into the sale barn parking lot.

DECK: Threat of K9 ends search in sale barn

Body-camera footage from Dorn was played in court for 30 minutes, detailing a search that started when Deck exited the vehicle and ran into the sale barn.

Dorn and Wyoming Police Chief Jim Tiller conducted the search for Deck after first being approached by Amanda Powell, who claimed she had been driving the SUV while returning from Dollar General. When finally arrested, Deck stated he was returning from Hunt Brother's Pizza.

Dorn disputed Powell's claim, saying he witnessed a balding man exit the SUV and run into the sale barn. Shortly thereafter, Powell was handcuffed and placed in Dorn's squad car while

Dorn and Tiller looked inside the barn for Deck, who finally turned himself in after being told a K9 unit was coming to assist.

Deck also said Powell was driving, a claim Dorn refuted.

Deck's possessions were placed on the police car and he was handcuffed. When Powell was freed from handcuffs. Dorn said she attempted to take Deck's possessions but was stopped.

Keys to the SUV were not located and it was towed to the Stark County Sheriff's impound lot.

After viewing body-camera footage, McBride sought to file a motion against the police activity on record. Mack denied the request and called for closing arguments.

McBride argued police went into the sale barn without a search warrant Deck and Powell. Mack ruled Mirandizing wasn't germane.

Mack also did not heed McBride's request for a sentence of community service.

Deck asked Mack if he could have one to two weeks to get his affairs in order but Mack told Deck to report June 2 to the Stark County Jail – a request Deck did not heed.

Correction
