Guard to Chicago?

Pritzker expects same strategy as in L.A.

Gov. JB Pritzker said he ex-

Gov. JB Pritzker said he expects Immigration and Customs Enforcement agents to employ the same aggressive strategies used in Los Angeles earlier this summer after President Donald Trump said he will deploy the National Guard to Chicago.

The information, Pritzker said, was not directly communicated to him, but gleaned from sources in the federal government, military and "well-sourced" news reports. He said he's been told members of the Texas National Guard are readying for deployment and many federal ICE and Homeland Security are being relocated to Chicago from L.A.

Pritzker said the Illinois State Police received a call from Customs and Border Protection Chief Gregory Bovino saying ICE will ramp up immigration enforcement in Chicago.

To what extent the effort will be aided by the National Guard is unclear. But Trump has removed any doubt that he'd like to deploy the National Guard – even as a federal judge ruled Tuesday that Guard deployment in Los Angeles was illegal.

"We're going in. I didn't say when we're going in," Trump said from the Oval Office.

Naval Station Great Lakes in North Chicago will be the staging grounds for ICE, the Sun-Times reported. Pritzker said staging began Monday.

The governor said the Trump administration planned to come to Chicago to target Mexican Independence Day celebrations, including a Sept. 14 parade.

Labor Day weekend was violent in Chicago. Fifty-eight people were shot and eight were killed in incidents, which included three mass shootings.

STEARMAN: Planes have the 'cool factor'

Continued from Page 1 port has been the Tuesday gathering spot for Stearmans, officially known as Boeing Model 75s.

"The No. 1 thing they are known for is pilot training in World War II," said Dave Shipley, owner of the Yates City Airport. "If you can fly a taildragger like that, you can fly just about anything."

Shipley explained that because Stearmans have a wheel in the back of the plane, landing in cross-

winds can be tricky.

"You have to keep your foot on that rudder, otherwise she's going to turn around on you," Shipley

Tuesday's relatively wind-free, sunny, 78-degree day was perfect weather for flying an open-cockpit plane, pilots agreed.

Among those on hand was Dick Sisson of Virden, a longtime Stearman admirer who acquired his rebuilt 1942 model three

years ago.

"Before we had our last child, we said when he graduates college, we're buying a Stearman," Sisson recalled.

When son Noah graduated from the University of Illinois-Springfield four years ago, the Sissons started looking for a relatively affordable Stearman.

"Everybody wants to ride in these. It's got the big motor, the biplane look," Sisson said. "It's definitely got the cool fac-

Stearmans are not a young man's hobby, though, with prices of \$80,000 to \$250,000, according to Shipley. He said one year, a pilot from the Netherlands took the wings off his plane and shipped it to the United States to attend the Galesburg fly-in.

More than 10,000 Stearmans were built in the 1930s and 1940s and were adapted from a design made by Lloyd Stearman.

After World War II, many Stearmans were used by crop dusters until the 1970s.

Stearmans can be flown from either of their two cockpits and reach speeds of up to 100 mph.

One of the youngest pilots at Yates City on Tuesday was Brien Sager, 39, of Tullahoma, Tenn. A first-timer at the Galesburg gathering, Sager said he has been involved in aviation since he was 6 and was flying his father's plane during this year's Fly-In.

"It's been a blast. Everybody is very friendly," he said. "It's cool landing in the grass with corn and beans all around you instead of on pavement. It's a different type of aviation here."

Other stops on the Stearman tour included Wednesday in Kewanee, Thursday in Geneseo and Friday at Wolford's Farm near Abingdon for the grand finale.

It was an important victory for an inexperienced team, according to Stark County Coach Jade Noard. The Rebels started seven sophomores, including two who played both offense and defense.

"The objective was to win Week 1, and we did," he said. "We've got to make some big strides from Week 1 to Week 2. Hopefully, we're not quite as hesitant early. They'll have that game under their belt, so they're going to know how it's going to feel."

Following a feeling-out period early in the game against South Fulton, Daum and the visitors took control.

Daum's 56-yard interception return in the final minute of the first half expanded the Stark County lead to 14-6. South Fulton scored with 9:28 left in the third quarter to cut its deficit to two, but Daum returned the ensuing kickoff 69 yards for a touchdown.

About six minutes later, he caught a 26-yard scoring pass from Ben Browning for a 28-12 lead and some breathing room. It all atoned for some sputtered early drives and an inter-
