Toulon council hears updates

Several bids received

TOULON – Upcoming city projects were the main topic of an Oct. 15 meeting of the Toulon City Council.

City Engineer Justin Reeise spoke for more than an hour about bids for a new water tower, a splash-pad bid, playground-equipment bids, a bid for a basketball court and Motor Fuel Tax bids.

Reeise said the city received one bid for a new 200,000-gallon elevated water storage tank from Maguire Iron, Inc., of Sioux Falls, S.D., for \$2.64 million. The council approved this bid. The city received \$1.5 million in grant funding for the project and anticipates using Tax Increment Funding to pay the remaining portion.

Reeise said the project came in over the estimated cost but appears consistent with the current bid environment. There were a number of factors adding to the cost including poor soil conditions, electric utilities challenges and *Continued on Page 2*

Stop-sign talk

Wyoming to vote on signs Nov. 18

WYOMING – The Wyoming City Council talked at length about stop signs during Tuesday's meeting but did not take action and will revisit the topic.

Wyoming Police Chief
Jim Tiller completed a traffic-flow study on Madison
Street, but studies for additional streets will be required before stop signs
are installed. The council
will vote during its Nov. 18
council meeting on what
streets are considered for
stop signs.

Luke Leesman from Midwestern Insurance, of Minier, discussed full-time employees' health insurance options for 2026. All employees are to meet with Leesman the second week of November about their preferences. The council will vote on insurance Nov. 18.

Mayor Jim Mercer wrote in his report, "We have received a lot of complaints about dogs running loose. So, we need to start enforcing that ordinance." The city pays \$300 a month for animal control to the Stark County Sheriff's Office. Citizens were asked to call the sheriff's office to file a complaint and have the Stark County animal-control officer catch animals that need to be placed in impound.

The council heard that M.E.R.C. Construction, Inc., of rural Wyoming, will replace areas of sidewalk Oct. 27-28 on Seventh St. in front of businesses A Few of My Favorite Things and 111 Tacos.

Galva has started work on school safety issues

GALVA – Superintendent Joe Becker reported at Monday's meeting of the Galva School Board that maintenance staff has started work on lifesafety issues the district was cited for during its recent 10-year inspection.

Other school improvements may also be coming. The School Board plans to research Ameren rebates for putting LED lights in the classrooms at Galva Junior-Senior High School. The board also discussed benefits of lowering ceilings in the school.

"This would change the look of the building completely," Becker said.

He described the building's accoustics as very poor due to the cement-block walls and steel roof.

Becker also reported 60 students attended a free dental clinic held in the district and 50 students received free shoes from the Kewanee United Way and the Galva Rotary.

Becker said a grant Galva received for free breakfast and lunches for every student is huge because students get at least two meals a day during the week. The district will also offer flu shots in the near future.

The board unanimously approved a transfer of \$400,000 from working cash to the transportation fund.

Board Member Kaleena Conrad asked why Galva Junior High did not start girls basketball at the same time as neighboring districts. She said other districts played 6-8 games before Galva and she has been getting questions from parents. Coaches told her they were following directions from the administration.

The board reviewed its strategic plan and concluded it has succeeded in being stewards of fiscal responsibility, efficiency and accountability. The board has balanced the school budget and posted financial reports online. Eight other goals are in progress with one left to begin.

Continued from Page 1 grant requirements.

Projects at Toulon City Park for a \$600,000 OSLAD grant are a splash pad, playground equipment and basketball courts. Great Southern Recreation of Murfreesboro, Tenn., made the lone bid of \$444,500. The bid was conditionally awarded, with Reeise and Mayor Larry Hollis to work on final details with Great Southern Recreation on change orders. Lowering

the flow rate of the splash pad would keep the water tower from being drained and would cost less.

Two bids came from contractors for playground equipment. There are five play-structure options for review with Team Reil, Inc., of Union, who was awarded the contract for \$108,120.

Plans for the park's basketball and multi-purpose courts calls for resurfacing, new hoops and a movable

pickleball net. Provantage Systems, of Saint Charles had the lone bid of \$57,695 and was approved.

No MFT bids arrived by the Oct. 14 deadline.

"The contractors indicated that their current workloads prevented them from bidding on this project," Reeise wrote in an email. He suggested rebidding this project in 2026 to have a late spring project after a review of timelines by the Illinois Department of Transportation.

In other business, Water Operator Kurt Downie said the city should try to secure

funding to meet an Illinois mandate to replace all lead water lines in the city by 2027.

The council also discussed the lease on its farm ground and passed paying \$1,200 for someone to attend a four-year rural water apprentice program.

The police copier contract for \$2,180 for 39 months of service was passed.

Finally, the council held a closed session to discuss hiring a new worker or rehiring Matt Forstrom. On Monday, Oct. 20, the city held a second closed session to talk with Forstrom.


now owned by Jed Nicholson. Also, the city received a \$5,000 grant from Apex Energy for a pickleball court at Thomas Park.

City Engineer Justin Reeise reported that bids have been let for water mains. City sidewalk repairs will resume in the spring. Reeise said the cost is unknown to install a water line north of Wyoming near FMC Corportation. The city must obtain a permit from the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency. FMC agreed to pay half of the cost, with a proposed one fourth payment from both the city and from resident Jason King.

The city received a \$2,000 grant to purchase new barricades. Councilman Dan Hardman said the city should raise sewer and garbage rates to help pay for the completed improve-

Galva needs 1 win for playoffs

Wildcats on verge of first postseason berth since 1994

By The Prairie News GALVA - No current Galva football player was

alive the last time a Wildcats team made the state playoffs. But this year's roster is very well aware of that 1994 season.

For the past two weeks, Galva players have been chanting "31 years" when they take breaks from practice in recognition of the years that have passed without a postseason berth.

That streak will end today if Galva (4-4) can win on the road at West Prairie/Southeastern (1-7) in an 8-Player regular season finale.

"It's a special group of boys and a special group of coaches I handpicked," said Zach Anderson, who is in his first year coaching Galva. "Seeing everything come to fruition ... it's a big deal in my opinion."

Galva remained in playoff contention last week with a wild 50-44 win at home against Ridgewood (3-5). The Wildcats took the lead for good with 1:15

remaining on a pass from running back Blake Stahl to quarterback MJ Louck.

"Blake got into some trouble and threw it up for MJ and he came back and got it and he's just so fast, nobody could catch him," Anderson said.

Louck also returned the first two kickoffs Galva received for touchdowns, ran for three scores and passed to JP Sloan for the seventh.

"He's an incredible ath-

lete, but you've got to give credit to (Stahl) who was the workhorse inside," Anderson said. "Two of the runs MJ sprung were thanks to blocking by Blake and the team."

Tommy Funke saved the win for Galva, forcing a West Prairie fumble at the Galva 23-yard line with 20 seconds to go. TJ Hudson recovered the loose ball.

Galva's 1994 team featured the Gale triplets and finished 10-2 before losing to Sterling Newman Central Catholic, 33-15, in the quarterfinals. Galva was also part of football co-ops that reached the playoffs in 2009, 2015 and 2018 as Mid-County.

In all, Galva has four previous football playoff appearances, including 1974, 1983 and 1993.
