# Local fire departments join forces

BRIMFIELD – Five local fire departments are joining to form a collaborative designed to reduce costs, improve training opportunities and increase safety of their officers and communities.

Joining the new Heartland Fire and Emergency Services group are volunteer fire departments from Brimfield, Elmwood, Farmington, Williamsfield and Yates City. Chiefs from each depart-



ment signed an agreement Oct. 21 at the Brimfield Fire Station.

Reaching agreement was not

difficult, according to Bob Tannock, the Elmwood fire chief and president of the Heartland group.

"We had so many of the same problems in common," Tannock

He expects Heartland will improve training for specialty situations such as grain-bin rescues and can help solve less-complicated situations such as talking on the radio.

# Tax increase?

Elmwood schools aim to raise levy to deal with \$800,000 FY27 deficit

For The Weekly Post ELMWOOD - After years of lowering its tax levy while federal COVID funds were still flowing, the Elmwood School District finds itself in a budget crunch.

Elmwood Superintendent Joel Schmieg said at Monday's school board meeting that he projects a likely \$800,000 deficit for Fiscal Year 2027 if the district maintains its present programs and class offerings.

As a result, Schmieg is seeking an increase of the FY 2026 tax levy from 5.22793% to 5.3988% for FY 2027. That would yield an additional \$500,000 for the district,

Schmieg estimates.

How much will that cost homeowners? Schmieg said the tax increase will equate to \$47 on a \$100,000 house, \$104 on a \$200,000 house and \$141 on a \$300,000 house.

"We don't want to overtax the community, but we do need a little extra," said Schmieg, who is also looking at cutting expenditures "to meet in the middle."

"We have been cutting. The problem is, for a school district 75% of expenditures are people and salaries. You can cut other things but it's a very small piece of the budget."

Salary increases for

staff and cost inflation for goods and services has also affected the bottom line for the district.

Another factor crunching the budget is that the district's equalized assessed value is estimated to increase by only 5.4% for FY27, compared to a 6.4% bump for FY26.

That's one reason Schmieg and board member Dustin Funk attended the latest Elmwood City Council meeting. (See Page 5)

Some tax assistance is on the horizon with the end of Elmwood's residential tax increment fi-

# 'Sense of security'

Convicted murderer Marcy Oglesby gets 50-year prison sentence

For The Weekly Post GALESBURG - According to Marcy Oglesby, the man she was convicted of murdering was Superman, someone upon whom people in his hometown of Maquon could rely. He could fix anything and would help anybody.

According to Oglesby, Richard Young also was a racist, a homophobe, sometimes a lousy friend and no father-of-the-year candidate. For all that apparent contradiction, this much seems certain regarding Oglesby, at least:

She probably will spend the rest of her life in state prison.

On Monday, Knox County Circuit Court Judge Andrew Doyle sentenced Oglesby to 50 years, minus about one year for time al-

ready served. During a four-day bench trial in June, Doyle found the 53year-old Maquon resident guilty of first-degree murder and other associated

Oglesby poisoned Young over time with eye drops, then hid his body in a Maquon storage unit for a year until it was discovered in October 2022. Prosecutors said Oglesby's motives were financial (Oglesby drained \$60,000 of Young's savings) and romantic (she had an online relationship with a man in Nigeria).

Doyle delivered the sentence after Oglesby deliv-

# OGLESBY: State's attorney asked for 58 years

Continued from Page 1 ered her statement of allocution, in which she was given a chance to offer remorse or an explanation regarding what happened.

Oglesby did none of that.

In a rambling address of more than 30 minutes, Oglesby said her conviction was a travesty of justice. She praised and damned Young, her boyfriend of more than 20 years. She also called Maquon a "crap little town" whose 220 or so residents took advantage of Young, the former village police chief.

"Instead of the crazed killer they wanted me to be, I am a soft-hearted, God-fearing woman who did not kill anyone," said Oglesby, who referred to Maquon townspeople as "deranged vultures."

"Go to his grave and apologize for every time you called him Barney Fife or Roscoe P. Coltrane and cussed him out for all the times he was not at your beck and call," she said.

Doyle said Oglesby's oratory was disturbing.

"She missed the point about what a statement of allocution should be used for," Doyle said. "I felt like you were using this as your platform to disparage Mr. Young and his family and the community of Maquon.

"Throughout this entire process, I think that you believed what you were saying, but I find it hard to believe anybody else does. You spun a web of lies and were so consistent in doing so you're having a hard time determining what is

The sentencing range for Oglesby was 20 to 60 years, to be served in full. Knox County State's Attorney Ashley Worby asked Doyle to render a 58-year sentence. One of Oglesby's attorneys, public defender Christopher Kanthak, requested the minimum.

reality and what is fantasy."

Kanthak cited Oglesby's volunteerism in the medical field and her service as a Maquon village trustee, firefighter and EMT.

"She has led a substantially law-abiding life up until this incident," Kanthak said.

Worby cited Oglesby's 2020 Knox County forgery conviction. The state's attorney also alleged financial-related deceptions after Young died but before his remains were found.

Oglesby claimed falsely she had cancer and attempted to raise money for nonexistent related expenses, according to Worby. She also said Oglesby swindled prospective brides regarding a wedding-accessory business she claimed to operate.

"This defendant has proven she will do anything, literally anything, for money," Worby said. "She will lie for it. She will kill for it, without conscience."

Worby also read aloud victim-impact statements from three Maquon residents, including Village President Mark Thomas.

"How could this happen to a man that spent decades protecting our community?" Thomas wrote. "Having this woman behind bars for the rest of her life will give Maquon a sense of safety and closure."


Shackled and clad in bright-orange jail garb, Oglesby cried at times during her comments but showed little emotion following her sentencing.

In a handwritten statement last week and verbally in court Monday,
Oglesby asked Doyle to
allow her new legal counsel. She suggested Kanthak
and Chief Public Defender
David Hansen were unresponsive and pleaded her
case inadequately.

Doyle denied Oglesby's request

Hansen and Kanthak did file a motion for a new trial, part of the appeals process. A hearing was scheduled for next week.

# FIRE: Others may join Heartland group

Continued from Page 1 had a standing bean fire," Tannock said. "On the scene we had departments from three counties and no good way to communicate. It's 2025. We've got to be able to communicate more efficiently."

Heartland should also be able to cut costs for departments by allowing them to buy in bulk and purchase EMT equipment from Graham Health System, which is also a Heartland member. Discounts could even extend to fire trucks, according to several chiefs at the meeting.

Another example Tannock gave was purchasing a drone that can be used to help locate hot spots in an ethanol fire.

"No department can afford a \$30,000 drone, but if we each chip in \$6,000, we're able to help the community," Tannock said.

And he stressed that departments have the option to opt in or out on any Heartland buying or training decisions.

The agreement is the brainchild of Elmwood Assistant Fire Chief Greg Devries, whose selling point was that departments need to cooperate outside of the mutual aid response system already in place.

"That's the emergency





# Of unbeaten Farmers, TIF priorities & big bucks


Rambling through central Illinois, tired of east winds.



While the council deserves praise for last year's decision to disperse 50% of its downtown TIF funds to the school and other taxing bodies, there should be thought of extending the residential TIF that has served its intended purpose. Part of the Elmwood council's rationale for the park purchase was to make Elmwood attractive to families. Hmmm, seems to me nothing makes a city more attractive than a school with a wide array of programs and plenty of reserves. ... # School board seeks synergy with council

For The Weekly Post ELMWOOD – The Elmwood School Board addressed the Elmwood City Council at its Oct. 21

Dustin Funk, vice president and finance committee chair of the school board, said the school district has not been able to keep up with neighboring schools as far as the proximity of tax revenue to the consumer-price index, which has caused financial hardship for the school. He suggested a closer relationship between the school and the city.

"Maybe there's some synergies between the city and the school that could result in some cost-saving for both of us," Funk said.

Amy Davis, economic development director for Elmwood, said when the city's tax-increment financing district expires in 2027, more money will be directed to the school in 2028. Additionally, Elmwood's second TIF fund expires in 2030.

"The school is the No. 1 employer here, and without a school we wouldn't be much of a town," Elmwood Mayor Andrew Almasi said. "Of course we want to be able to work

with you."

No specific areas were discussed, but Elmwood Superintendent Joel Schmieg asked the board to "keep us in mind for future projects that we could potentially partner on."

In other business, the council approved a TIF grant for Wags and Whiskers. Janelle McFarland, owner and veterinarian, is planning on tuckpointing bricks to keep moisture out, and some sign repair. Total cost of the repairs is \$4,625, and the city council approved \$2,312.50 in TIF reimbursement for the work.

#### have eye in the sky Princeville park will

For The Weekly Post PRINCEVILLE -Would-be vandals in Stevens Square Park will be caught on film – or its modern equivalent, more accurately.

Video security cameras are to be installed at the park gazebo soon, according to Chad Gardner, the village public-works superintendent. The intent is to curb vandalism, something that's been an ongoing problem in the park, according to Village President Jeff Troutman.

"We need to do it sooner or later, with the stuff that's been going on," Troutman said during a Village Board meeting Oct. 21.

Doing it sooner became more realistic after Mid **Century Communications** of Fairview agreed to install internet capability at the park and waive its monthly fee, according to

Gardner. "If we didn't go with them, it would be a recurring charge," Gardner

The village is to pay \$550 for four cameras and recorders, plus \$100 for installation labor.

Village Trustee Teresa Gilroy might be persuaded to approve an additional expense, however. Although one would have to be of a certain age to understand her reference.

"Can we put up some signs that say, 'Smile, you're on 'Candid Camera'?" Gilroy said jokingly.

Security cameras already are in place at Cutter's Grove Park and at Village Hall, according to Troutman.

Trustees and Troutman also discussed the upcoming decision regarding the 2025 village-tax levy. Troutman suggested a 4.9% increase, just under the 5% threshold for a state-mandated Truth in Taxation hearing.

"I don't see any reason to go over the amount we're able to do without a hearing," Troutman said.

The previous levy amount was \$154,050. A 4.9% hike would raise it to \$161,598.45, according to Trustee Spencer Wilson. Final approval is expected in November.

Also expected for final approval next month is a \$7,500 tax-increment-financing redevelopment

grant to Hand Craft'd, a freeze-dried candy company at 127 E. Main St. The vendor-based business is attempting to expand its retail-sales ability, which entails property modifications, according to Wilson.

The board gave the Hand Craft'd grant preliminary approval. The agreement stipulates Hand Craft'd needs to remain in business for at least five years.

No action was taken about possible TIF benefits regarding construction of a new facility for Greenfield Contractors, a Princeville-based firm that manufactures fabric-covered and steel-framed agricultural buildings.

Greenfield provided a site plan that village offi-

cials had requested, but it was missing some specifics, including dimensions for the new building. The new facility is to be constructed on 151/2 acres located at the north edge of the village.

"I would like to have more detail and also advisements in writing that they have gone through their checks and balances to make sure they can build on this property," Wilson said. "They're asking for taxpayers' money and I'm all for wanting to give it to them, but I want them to do it properly."

A Greenfield representative said additional details are to be forthcoming. No date for the beginning of construction has been announced.



Continued from Page 1 expected end of Elmwood's residential tax increment financing district in 2027. The school would not see funds from that until FY2028.

Elmwood's downtown TIF is schedule to expire in 2030.

Last year, the district transferred \$350,000 from working cash into the transportation fund to make the school budget balance. Schmieg said he doesn't want that to be the plan moving forward.

"We don't want to continue to use our reserves in that manner," he said, noting Elmwood's reserves are below the suggested minimum of six months of operations.

Because the total taxes taken in by the district would increase by more than 5%, the school must hold a Truth in Taxation hearing, scheduled for mid-to late-November.

In other business Monday, the board approved hiring Rachel Winter as an elementary aide, Robin Thrasher is high school basketball cheer coach, Karla Begner as juniorhigh assistant volleyball coach and Shannon Steffen as a volunteer JH

volleyball coach. The board also accepted the resignation of Emily Cash as 5th/6th grade girls basketball coach.

In public comment, Heidi Golden asked the board to add bus monitors stemming from what she called a concerning incident on a bus involving her two daughters and another student.

The board discussed the matter in closed session





Of course, Farmington knows plenty about throwing the ball. Freshman quarterback Carson Noy has completed 102 of 156 attempts for 1,904 yards, 26 touchdowns and 10 interceptions.

"I think he's improved a ton," Vallas said of Noy. "The other 10-12 guys on offense have been really consistent and that has helped him. If there had been inconsistency out of those other guys, I don't know if he would have improved like that."

Averaging 46.5 points per game, these Farmers have the second-highest scoring offense under Vallas, trailing only the 2016 team's 48 ppg.

Jack Gronewold is a big reason for that, as was evident vs. Bureau Valley. The senior had two of his 14 touchdown receptions in the win and leads Farmington with 42 catches and 912 yards. He also ran for one score vs. the Storm.

Landon Crawford (25 catches, 495 yards, four TDs) and Boston Smith (21 catches, 285 yards, five TDs) are also receiving threats. Bradyn Brewer ran for two scores vs. Bureau Valley and has 10 on the year along with 572 yards.

With a win Saturday, Farmington faces a likely second-round game against Aurora Christian (7-2), which placed third in the Chicagoland Christian after losses to 9-0 Kanka-

# Princeville rolls into playoffs with 47-8 rout

PRINCEVILLE – Jon Carruthers got what he wanted for his Princeville football team – a home game in the Class 1A state playoffs.

Now, Carruthers would like a little bit more.

The Princes play Heyworth in the first round, at 1 p.m. Saturday at Tom Bruna Field. Both teams are 7-2. Princeville is seeded eighth in the northern half of the 1A state bracket, one spot above Heyworth.

Seems like it might be a pretty even game, but home-field advantage is one Carruthers will take.

"I think it's great," the coach said. "It's always better to play at home. Playing Saturday, you're already out of your routine, so I think it means a lot. Our community has been great. It's fun for them."

For the most part, it's been fun for Princeville, too. That included a 47-8 victory Oct. 24 over Monmouth United in the regular-season finale.

Heyworth also won its final game, 59-10 over Moweaqua Central A&M. The Hornets joined Tuscola as postseason qualifiers from the five-team Heart of Central Illinois Conference small division. Located south of Bloomington, Heyworth outscored opponents by an average

of 30-8 and had three shutouts.

The only Heyworth losses were against Colfax Ridgeview-Lexington (in Week 2) and LeRoy (Week 7).

"They've got a quarterback (senior Parker Bell) who can run the ball well and throw the ball well," Carruthers said. "You can see they have speed. They've got athletic receivers. They'd be one of the upper teams in our conference, for sure."

Other key Heyworth backfield players are senior running back Brayden Brucker and junior receiver Braydon Laesch.

The winner Saturday plays next against top-seeded Stockton, probably. Stockton, which eliminated host Princeville 60-30 in the first round last postseason, faces 16th-seeded Galena.

Princeville finished 6-2 in the LincolnLand small division, good for third place. As has been the case recently, the Princeville defense subdued United (1-8, 1-7), according to Carruthers. Princeville allowed only one touchdown in three of its last four games.




