Temporary taste for Princeville water

Installation of new storage tank in April will result in harder water

For The Weekly Post PRINCEVILLE - Next spring, Princeville residents might notice their tap water might not taste right. But it should be only temporary.

A new 100,000-gallon storage tank the village will use to supply its water towers is targeted for installation in April, according to Chad Gardner, the Princeville superintendent of public works. The tank is to replace the current one, located behind Village Hall and installed in the early 1990s.

During the two to three weeks of installation, the village will have to distribute well water instead of water purified through re-

verse osmosis. That will result in harder water temporarily, according to Gardner.

"People remember what the water used to taste like 25-30 years ago? It'll go back to that," he said.

When it met Nov. 3, the Village Board approved a \$298,500 deal with Cady Aquastore, Inc., of Tampico for the tank and installation. The tank is to be largely identical to the current one – steel with a glass-fused interior and ex-

Farmington school levy to dip slightly

FARMINGTON – The Farmington School Board on Monday unanimously approved a resolution that would include a slight reduction in the district's tax levy for 2025.

The proposed levy of 4.5277% for the school district is down from last year's levy of 4.7333%, according to Superintendent Zac Chatterton.

At the same time, the equalized

assessed value of properties in the Farmington district is predicted to increase by 6.2%.

That will trigger a state-required Truth in Taxation hearing since the predicted total of taxes is expected to increase by more than 5%.

The school board's final decision on the 2025 levy will come after a public hearing is held on Dec. 10 at 4:45 p.m. in the Farmington Central Office. A special meeting of the board will follow

In other business, the board unanimously approved a course catalog for next school year, application for a \$50,000 state maintenance grant to continue restroom renovations and a twoyear commitment to the Peoria County Regional Office of Education's alternative learning pro-

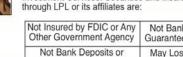

The new tank was to be made of glass-free stainless steel, but the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency rejected that plan in late October because of leeching concerns, according to Gardner.

magical time that tests commitments to work and family but pays dividends many fail to understand.

Unfortunately, I look at Twitter nowadays. Sports news and wildlife videos lure me. But between the headlines, it depresses me to see A.I. videos of African lions doing crazy things, cats and chihuahuas scaring bears through sliding-glass doors and other fakeries.

I'm turning into Thomas. What the phone shows, I scarcely believe. Reality is harder to decipher than ever. That's just one more reason the magic of the natural world is so much better than any video.

Sunday morning after the wettest of the wet snow passed, a doe semerged nearby with a buck in hot pursuit. Panting and wet, she bedded down, not 20 yards away on a hillside across from me. The buck stood below her, soaking wet, panting, wild-eyed and distracted.

Over the next few minutes he chased off two would-be suitors, grunting and running through the creek to prove his mettle to the smaller bucks. Unimpressed, she

eventually ran north. He followed, at top speed.

Who needs fake videos when the real thing is better? Hours earlier, that same point came up while talking deer with Joe Gronewold after Farmington and his son Jack defeated Aurora Christian in a soggy but entertaining football game.

"Stay off your phone," he cautioned. "I'm trying, but I missed a big buck this morning because I was looking at it."

That's a little easier for Gronewold to say since he also shot a big one earlier this fall, pictured on the front page of this edition. "That's what it's all about around here, farming, football and hunting," he said.

Obviously, that's not true for everyone. But farming is big business in these parts, football is still a pastime embraced by many and hunting combines elements of both.

Quick, name things in which central Illinois leads the nation? Soybean and corn production? Yes. Producing bucks with big antlers? Yes. Let me know what else you come up with, because there are no doubt others.

All those boring fields of corn and

beans surrounding us provide a great food source for whitetails. Pockets of timber scattered here and there in Fulton, Knox and Peoria counties offer tremendous whitetail habitat.

Funny thing is, decades ago when the deer herd was rebounding from near extinction, biologists thought whitetails needed vast expanses of timber in order to thrive. Nope. We've got what they need. That's a blessing many overlook. Don't underestimate the importance of the business side of deer hunting to our local economy.

How else to explain that an acre of ground covered in nothing but trees can sell for upwards of \$8,000?

How else to explain trucks with license plates from Pennsylvania, Georgia, New York, West Virginia and elsewhere parked along gravel roads in our counties?

How else to explain local landowners buying tractors, implements, seed and more for recreation?

All that is done just for a chance to witness real, compelling natural drama that A.I. merely mocks.

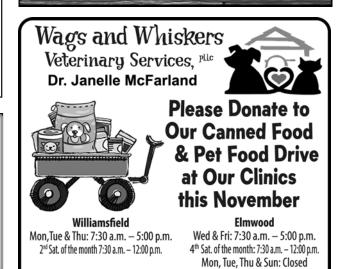

New park a possibility again in Elmwood

For The Weekly Post ELMWOOD - A possible public park in the Fairground Acres subdivision appears to be in play

Fairground Acres developer Fred Paige intends to make the city a formal offer to donate an empty lot for park space, according to Mayor Andrew Almasi. On Nov. 18, the City Council is expected to discuss Paige's offer.

The park possibility first arose in September, after Paige made a verbal offer to donate the property. Opposition from some subdivision residents and lack of a formal offer prompted city officials to set aside the issue early last month.

The situation changed after Paige requested an informal meeting with Almasi, Alderman Bob Paige and Economic Development Director Amy Davis. It was held Oct. 31.

"He said, 'I want to know what happened,' and I said, 'We have some new (council) members and they said we have this offer but we didn't have enough information," Almasi said following the council meeting Nov. 4. "A formal

offer would have been a lot there some other issue? If nicer. He said he would do that."

Bob Paige, who helps oversee city parks, is to research costs associated with maintaining and outfitting the potential-park property. That is to be part of the council discussion next week. Alderman Paige said the parks budget should have enough money to cover the costs.

Possible use of city taxincrement-financing money to transform the lot into parkland appeared to be a sticking point.

The lot is located along Hickory Run at the east end of Fairground Acres, which is located at the city's northeast edge.

Almasi said the proposed lot isn't perfect. It has a ground-elevation issue. But Almasi believes the proposed park will complement West Park and Sweetwater Park, which is on the south side of Elmwood. He suggested West Park is the only one adequate for children's play.

"I asked people, the few that I know who are in opposition, 'Do some research and tell me,"" Almasi said. "Does it decrease property values? Is

we've got a lot of opposition, I would defer to that. But it sounds like a good idea. It's free land, but there could be drawbacks."

Also probably up for approval next week is the 2025 municipal propertytax levy. Last week, City Attorney Bob Potts proposed a levy of \$347,426. The increase from 2024 is just under 5%, the number that would trigger a staterequired Truth in Taxation public hearing.

"You've increased it (that much) every year as long as I can remember," Potts said.

The city's equalized assessed property value increased 6.1% from 2024 to 2025, Potts said.

During public comment, Elmwood resident Phillip Beal asked the council if municipal action will be

taken regarding a derelict property at 701 S. Althea St., the site of a fire a few years ago.

A court hearing scheduled for last week was postponed, so the issue is at a standstill, according to Kaitlyn Wagner, the city building-code officer. She said the building needs to be demolished, because of safety issues. Vermin and inoperable vehicles litter the property. The owners have been unresponsive.

In action items, the council approved a \$3,330 TIF grant to building owners Ron and Cathy Windish for window replacement and maintenance work at 108 E. Main St., former site of Elmwood Telepharmacy. That business closed in October.

The Windishes are seeking a new tenant, according to Davis.

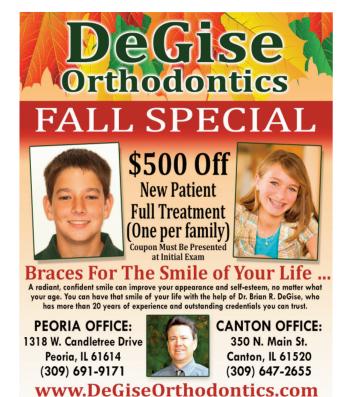

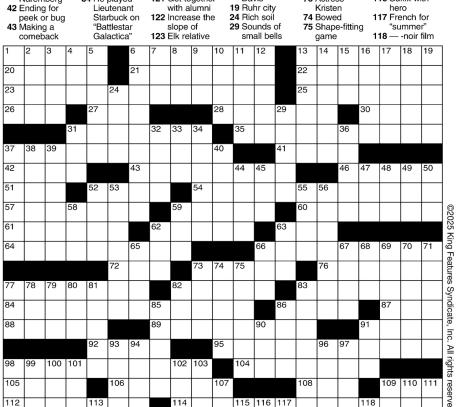

That was his halftime message.

"We were down and had no momentum going into

The team scoring gave E-B 163 points, 12 more than Eureka. The places were reversed Nov. 1 at the Elmwood Sectional, but Eureka's top runner, Gavin Stalter, didn't compete then because of injury. He was 23rd at state, which for the second year in a row was won by Chaz Oberkfell of Gillespie (14:32.1).

"I don't know that I could ask more," E-B Coach Gregg Meyers said. "Aiden ran fantastic, Kam ran absolutely fantastic, Danny ran great, Cole, Kai, all those guys ran fantastic. Eureka beat us, but hats off to them, because they ran absolutely great."

Rockford Christian had 184 points and finished third. El Paso-Gridley, which was third at the Elmwood Sectional, finished fourth at state.

Meyers said the situation began to improve for E-B about six weeks ago. Stevenson concurred. He said he and Faulkner had a conversation about what was necessary to rectify things. They conveyed that message to the rest of the team.

"We just said, 'Let's do this. Let's just be us. Let's just be as strong as we can," Stevenson said. "I think it helped bring some

E-B Coach Kyle Anderson said Hill executed her race almost perfectly. He also said a top-five team finish was a preseason goal for his young team. That appears to augur well for next season.

"There's a lot of experience on this team," said Anderson, who also noted Brimfield's grade-school state prowess. "They've been there before."

So had Sennett, who finished 32nd in 2024 and 51st in 2023. This time, she ran a personal-best and school-record 17:46.25.

"I think the first mile, everyone went out pretty fast, so I just tried to stay relaxed and hold my pace while other people decreased their pace a little bit," Sennett said. "Around the second mile marker, I heard someone say 'Top

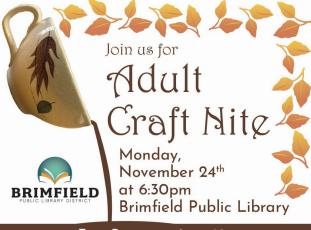
25 is right in front of you,' so I was just trying to catch up with her."

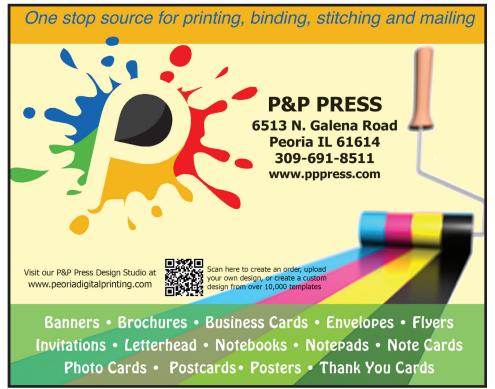

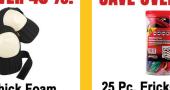
