Galva council OKs lowering tax rate

for The Prairie News GALVA – The Galva City Council gave final approval Monday to a tax levy ordinance that will lower the city's tax rate by \$.056.

The new rate will take effect on May 1, 2026, and run through April 30, 2027.

Still to be seen is the

impact of increased assessed value of city property, which Henry County estimates will increase from \$31 million to \$41 million.

City Administrator David Dyer said the city also gained \$219,000 from the dissolution of TIF 2, which is the area around the Big River Resources LLC ethanol plant.

The council also passed a comprehensive plan for the city and discussed possibly adding a dog park, a splash pad and a train viewing spot. Public input will be sought on those items.

The former Lord Chevrolet building on Market Street was another topic of discussion. Second Ward Alderman John Wirth said

the city needs to know what a buyer's plans for the building are before it is sold.

The building presently has boarded up windows and is in need of paint. Several council members agreed that some language needs to be in place about plans for fixing up the building and what it is

Wyoming man facing porn charges released

for The Prairie News TOULON - Kenneth J. Stahl of Wyoming is scheduled for a Dec. 12 hearing in Stark County Circuit Court on three charges of possession of child pornography on a computer.

Stahl, 33, was arrested on Nov. 7 by Stark County Sheriff's Deputy Calib Ingle. He had been in custody in the Bureau County Jail for two

weeks until a Nov. 21 court appearance in the Stark County Courthouse before Tenth Judicial Circuit Court Judge James A. Mack.

In that Nov. 21 appearance, Stahl pleaded not guilty to the charges and is to be monitored by the Peoria waived his hearing.

Mack agreed with a motion by Stahl's attorney, Christopher McCall of Peoria, to release Stahl from custody. Release was granted despite an objection from Stark County State's Attorney Austin King.

As terms of his release, Stahl is to have only one electronic device, cellphone or tablet, and that device County Pretrial Services Depart-

Additionally, Stahl is ordered to have no contact with anyone age 18 or under, according to King.

Ameren increase

Average increase will be \$3.65 for natural gas bills starting in January

CHICAGO - Ameren IIlinois residential customers will see an average \$3.65 increase on their natural gas bills in January after the Illinois Commerce Commission last week slashed proposed rate hikes for two of the state's largest utilities.

Ameren, which serves about 816,000 customers in central and southern Illinois, initially held off on estimating the impact to customers until it could conduct an in-depth review of the ICC's order, said Brad Kloeppel of Ameren.


The ICC's Nov. 19 rulings arrived after 11 months of reviewing testimony and documents submitted by Ameren and Nicor, consumer protection groups and environmental advocates.

The Commission approved a \$73 million rate increase for Ameren and \$168 million increase for Nicor – more than 40% lower than what the utilities had requested.

Both companies are eligible to propose new rate hikes to the ICC annually in January, though in recent years have done so every other year.

Even with reduced supply costs and a smaller monthly rate increase of \$3.65 vs. the \$9.09 estimated in Ameren's January request, consumer groups like the Citizens Utility Board say any increase in rates is too high.

Kloeppel said underground storage allows Ameren to buy nearly 60% of its winter supply during the summer when prices are lower, thereby saving money for customers.


Dyer said that the larger playground would not pass inspection, as it has been vandalized.
