Town hall draws packed crowd to discuss Stark Co.

WYOMING – Two points were made repeatedly during a well-attended Stark County Town Meeting on Tuesday.

One was that the crowd estimated at more than 160 packing the Paramount Theater on a frigid night was impressive.

Several speakers at the 170-minute meeting said the turnout was the largest ever seen for a town hall.

“At this kind of event I usually speak on voter apathy,” State Sen. Neil Alexander said. “Tonight proves that isn’t an issue in Stark County.”

The other common refrain was that the event also proves Toulon, Wyoming and Bradford should now be considered collaborators instead of rivals.

“Us all coming together is a big change,” said Sharon Cauthon, Bradford’s village president. “There’s no longer a stigma of the towns can’t work together. Just being up here together is the start of a big change.”

Nodding in agreement on the Paramount stage were Toulon Mayor Larry Hollis and Wyoming Mayor Jim Mercer, who also praised the crowd.

“I was overwhelmed,” Mercer said afterwards. “It wasn’t just Wyoming residents. I thought there was a pretty even mix from all three towns.”

Cauthon said the three community leaders regularly share information and ideas and attend meetings of the Stark Council for Continuous Improvement, an under-the-radar group devoted to county-wide economic and social development.

The format of the meeting allowed politicians and business leaders to address the crowd and then answer questions. Most of the informative and, at times, humorous Q&A was devoted to Alexander, State Sen. Li Arellano and State Rep. Travis Weaver.

When Weaver discussed the need for more nuclear power plants in Illinois, an audience member yelled out, “Put one in Stark County and we’ll have lots more jobs.”

Galva street traps truck

Broken service line weakens pavement

GALVA – An Eagle Enterprises garage truck came to a sudden stop on Jan. 21 at about 2 p.m. during its weekly route.

The accident happened in the 400 block of NE 2nd St. A sewer service line collapsed and the back two tires of the truck dropped about 2 feet into the roadway according to Jake McClintic, Galva’s incoming sewer superintendent.

Steve Bell and Tony Interior were at Bell Trucking when the call came in. Bell was able to lift

the back of the garbage truck with his Caterpillar Inc. 938 wheel loader, hooked up and guided by Interior, to extract the truck from the hole.

The 400 block of NE 2nd St. was closed immediately and the Galva Water Department placed barricades around the affected area.

Sewer and water employees fixed the service line on Thursday but will inspect the main sewer line with a camera this week to see if there is any additional damage, as the street remains closed.

If there is damage to the sewer, the city will have to pay for the repairs.

A spokesman for Eagle Enterprises said Monday that two rear tires on the truck were damaged in the incident.

Gripp extended

Bradford schools superintendent receives 3-year contract extension

BRADFORD – In addition to approving a 2025 financial audit and several other items during a busy meeting Tuesday, the Bradford School Board OK’d a three-year contract extension for Superintendent Chad Gripp.


A principal at Bradford since 2009, Gripp was also hired as superintendent in 2016. Marlie Heider was hired as junior high principal in 2023. Gripp is still the grade school principal.

Gripp, 46, will receive 4% raises for each year of his new extension. His old contract was set to expire at the end of Fiscal Year 2028. According to the website govsalaries.com, Gripp was paid \$127,430 in 2024.

An audit of the district’s FY25 financial report by Gorenz and Associates Ltd. of Peoria showed Bradford’s budget was balanced. The only new change requested is to increase the treasurer’s bond.

The building and grounds committee offered recommendations after meeting prior to the regular board gathering. An attempt will be made Feb. 16 to resurface the gym floor, but quotes for a new floor are being gathered. Other projects in the planning stages are determining the life expectancy of the jun-

Galva school budget on target, grant to fund meals

GALVA – Superintendent Joe Becker told the Board of Education Monday that the school district is on target with revenues and expenditures for the 2025-26 school year.

Becker also said the district has again received an Illinois grant to serve free breakfast and lunch to all students every school day. He said that on early-out days cooks will pack a sack lunch to send with each student at the 11:30 a.m. dismissal.

Galva is one of several area schools interested in the Rural Illinois Shared Education program. RISE currently has more than 100 school districts and community col-

leges in its network and would allow for shared teaching and expanded classes. Black Hawk College has also expressed an interest. If there is enough area interest, a next step could be seeking a grant to pay for the program.

In other news, both Galva schools will install LED lighting this summer and the high school will also install dropped ceilings.

Board member John VanDeVelde reported that conversion of the former American Legion hall in Kewanee into an office for Henry-Stark County Special Education is going well and should be done by June.

The board unanimously changed its February meeting to Feb. 17 at 7

p.m. and approved the following: accepting Brandon Macklin as a junior high boys basketball volunteer for the 2026-27 school year; a leave of absence for Anna Olson from about Feb. 1 to April 7; and the resignation of Andrew Bresnahan as custodian.

ior high boiler, getting quotes for air conditioning in the grade school, fixing slides and adding a structure to the grade school playground, getting quotes to add mesh coverings over exterior windows and installing new bleachers in the gym and looking into improving the track surface.

The board also reviewed a pro-

posed 2026-27 calendar and heard a first reading of a new compensation structure for district aides. Under the plan, aides with a teaching license who sub more than 11 days in the same classroom can earn a supplemental payment of \$50 for a full day and \$25 for a half day.

In other personnel matters, the board hired Sarah Bruecks as scho-

lastic bowl head coach to replace Abi Stevenson, whose resignation was accepted. Lexi Church was hired as an assistant. The board also hired Dana Ingels as a transportation monitor and accepted the resignation of Morgan Coleman as boys basketball assistant coach.

Finally, 8th grade promotion is set for May 15 at 7 p.m.

TOWN HALL: County seeks paid administrator

to Stark County were sprinkled throughout the meeting.

- Several came from Stark County Board Chair Kari Bush, who discussed efforts to add a paid administrator to help handle the county’s day-to-day affairs and to find and manage grants.
- Bush said Stark County has even floated the idea of sharing such an administrator with other neighboring counties, so far without any success.
- Bush also noted that the county board, the Henry and Stark County Health Department and the State Bank of Toulon have combined forces to offer primary care, behavioral-health services and a recently opened pharmacy at the First Choice Healthcare facility in Toulon.
- At one point, Wyoming Alderman Steve Hansard suggested the county needs a committee to help promote economic development.
- In response, Cauthon outlined the efforts of SCCI.
- Later, SCCI member Jon Kno-blauch addressed the group’s effort to add to the housing stock in Stark County, which currently has only four homes listed for sale.
- SCCI member and Stark County School Superintendent Brett Elliott

noted a stunning fact gleaned from a University of Illinois survey: Only 17% of the population of Stark County is under the age of 54.

- Mercer said at the meeting that anyone who has a house for sale or wants to bring a business to Stark County should call one of the mayors for assistance. He posted the same idea on the City of Wyoming Facebook page Wednesday.
- Within two hours after that post, Mercer said he had a call from someone seeking to bring a furniture store into Wyoming.
- “People understand they can go to each mayor for help,” he said.
