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Bradford board OKs hirings

BRADFORD – The Bradford School Board on Tuesday approved three hirings and two bids for work.

Hired were former Stark County Deputy William Dorn as school safety officer and Abby Peterson and Lily TerBush as cheerleading coaches.

The bids approved were from MGT Films to install security film on exterior windows at Bradford Grade School (\$3,905) and Bradford Junior High (\$1,546).

The board also plans to pursue bids from Mangieri Refinishing LLC for a new JH gym floor (\$24,900) and from Larson Company for new bleachers in the JH gym (\$191,500).

The board also approved a consolidated district plan to qualify for federal funds.

Bailey to attend Lincoln luncheon

WYOMING – Stark County Republicans have attracted a big name for their annual Lincoln Day Luncheon being held Saturday, March 28, at the Stark County 4H Grounds.

A representative of Republican gubernatorial candidate Darren Bailey called this week to confirm Bailey would be attending the luncheon, according to Stark County Board Member Adam Wilson.

Bailey won his second straight primary election on March 17 to set up a rematch with Gov. JB Pritzker in Illinois. Bailey received 53.5% of the vote to defeat three other candidates.

Also scheduled to attend the 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. event are State Reps. Travis Weaver and Ryan Spain and State Sens. Neil Anderson and Li Arellano.

Galva schools OK new ceiling, lights

GALVA – The Galva School Board approved two bids for projects at the Junior-Senior High School during a busy meeting on March 18.

The board approved Valley Construction’s base bid and alternative bid 1B to install new drop ceilings for \$171,000. Also approved was Tri City’s base bid 2B for new LED for \$147,083.

Superintendent Joe Becker noted that rejecting the first set of bids submitted in February and sending the project out for two separate bids saved the district approximately \$80,000. He said that a \$50,000 school maintenance grant and almost \$40,000 in Ameren incentives will further offset the cost of the two improvements.

The board also unanimously accepted the resignations of Principal Kurtis Smyth and Athletic Director/Dean Marland Rachel effective at the end of this school year.

In other business, the board approved the 2026-27 school calendar that shows a first day for students on Aug. 18, with 1:55 p.m. dismissal until Aug. 28.

The approved calendar shows that there will be a 1:55 p.m. dismissal most Wednesdays. The calendar will provide time for teachers to work in Professional Learning Communities throughout the year to address student-learning

Stark schools up pay for some staff, administrators

WYOMING – The Stark County School Board at its Monday meeting approved pay increases for support staff and building administration staff.

Superintendent Brett Elliott said overall support staff rates will increase by \$1 per hour (4.6-6.8%, depending on the staff member) while administrators and directors will receive 3-4% increases.

Prior to voting in favor of the increases in executive session, Elliott discussed the pay raises. He said the pay rate has gone up 60-90% in the past six years as the district has worked to reach and exceed the state minimum wage.

“We must keep in mind the potential for Illinois to increase the minimum wage again to \$20 to \$22 per hour in the near future,” Elliott said.

Elliott also reported the district received a second estimate for a new elementary school playground and expects another. Estimates so far range from roughly \$250,000 to \$460,000.

Revised grading procedures were OK’d for the Junior-Senior High School in 2026-27. Elliott said the Junior High will pilot a grading practice emphasizing “standards mastery” based on a new scale: A = 90 or above, B = 80 or above, C = 70 or above, D = 60 or above and F = 50 or above

In personnel, the board approved not renewing Teacher Daymon McDowell after this year, giving Megan Lane overload pay for an additional class period through the end of the year and the resignations of Shannon Westphal (intern counselor) and Elizabeth Dietz (kindergarten teacher), effective at the end of this school year.

The board also approved its IHSA membership and heard 5th graders Luke Down and Rennon Morrissey Coperland were selected for the Illinois Principals Association Student Leadership Award.

problems.

The board approved the annual audit by Gorenz and Associates that showed the district received a 4.0 financial recognition score. Becker said cash on hand remains strong and noted that assessed values of properties have increased over the past several years, while the district has maintained a steady tax rate.

Becker also provided the board with a presentation on moving the 6th grade class from the Elementary School to the Jr.-Sr. High School for the 2026-2027 school year. The district is facing challenges in meeting the needs of younger students.

Becker said these include a lack of space for support services; meeting state standards in academic alignment; and with providing expanded course offerings and extracurricular opportunities.

Becker provided proposals from Superintendent Search Firms for the board to consider for hire.

It was reported that the board had only one applicant to be considered as for its student representative spot.

The board also approved the following personnel items for 2026-27:

- Moving fourth-year probationary teacher, Jennifer Maertens, to fifth-year tenured status; third-year probationary teacher, Melissa Ford, to

fourth-year tenure status; second-year probationary teachers Cody Freeman, Kylee Conlin and Christine Betz to third-year probationary status; and first-year probationary teachers Lexi Morse and Tobie Hargens to second-year probationary status.

- Hiring Kylee Robbins as the elementary student services coordinator, Brynn Schipper as an elementary teacher and JV volleyball coach, Anni Suman as a K-12 music/choir teacher, Ashlee Strock as K-12 art teacher, Heather Anderson as H.S. volleyball coach

- Accepting the resignation of English teacher Kelly DeWitte at the end of this school year.

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
