BUSY PRIMARY?

Will turnout improve for primary?

Open seats in House, Senate may get vote out

While races are not very heated locally, next Tuesday's March 17 primary election is shaping up to be unusually busy in parts of Illinois.

Due to retirements, six House and Senate seats in Illinois are open and 60 hopefuls are vying for those positions. Overall, five of the state's 17 Congressional seats are open, which represents roughly one-quarter of all House Democratic retirements and 10% of all House retirements in the country, according to an Associated Press analysis.

The AP reports that by one expert's measure, it's Illinois' largest number of open House seats going back at least 70 years. That has fueled speculation that more voters will take part in this primary than in 2024, when the statewide turnout of 19% was the lowest in more than 50 years.

But those Congressional seats up for grabs are all in the Chicago area. Closer to home, Congressional incumbents U.S. Rep. Eric Sorensen (17th District) and Darin LaHood (16th) are favorites and

there is not much local intrigue.

The big races on the ballot Tuesday are for governor and lieutenant governor, United States Senator, Illinois state comptroller and secretary of state.

The race to replace retiring Sen. Dick Durbin has attracted the most candidates, with 11 names listed on Democratic ballots and six on

the Republican side. U.S. Rep. Raja Krishnamoorthi leads eight of 10 Democratic polls by as much as 26% despite Gov. JB Pritzker's support for Lt. Gov. Julianna Stratton.

Don Tracy has a narrow lead among Republican candidates for Durbin's seat, though polls show

Budget cuts spoil Billtown program

Issue raised on food quality, options

WILLIAMSFIELD – The Williamsfield School Board received plenty of food for thought about food that might not be fit for students' consumption.

Some of the victuals served in the cafeteria are moldy, discolored and stale, according to Addison Byrd, a 17-year-old high school junior who addressed the board Monday night. Portion sizes and variety also have declined recently, she said.

An online petition Byrd launched Feb. 27 that

asked for cafeteria changes has received more than 150 signatures.

"This is not just a matter of quality," said Byrd, a child of Board Member Brittany Byrd. "It is a matter of health and well-being."

Billtown Superintendent David Mills appears aware of the problem. The cafeteria has sustained significant reductions in budget and personnel, part

Elmwood considering solar-panel inspection

ELMWOOD – Concerns over proper installation of solar panels at residential locations may prompt a change in the City of Elmwood's building inspection procedures.

Elmwood Fire Department Chief Bob Tannock addressed the council at its March 3 meeting to push for inclusion in inspections

of solar-panel installations in the city.

Tannock said some solar contractors are taking advantage of small towns that do not have inspections and installing extra panels. Tannock, who is also an electrician, also said his visual inspection of some solar installations show problems.

Tannock had previously met with the building-

 many voters are still undecided. Tracy is a Springfield-based attorney and was chair of the Illinois Republican Party from 2021-24.

Pritzker is running unopposed on the Democratic side with Christian Mitchell as his new Lt. Governor.

Republican gubernatorial candidates are former State Senator and 2022 gubernatorial nominee Darren Bailey, DuPage County Sheriff James Mendrick, businessman Rick Heidner and former WirePoints CEO Ted Dabrowski. Bailey is a clear leader in polls, with up to 34% of the vote.

Four women are running for Illinois comptroller on the Democratic side: Margaret Croke, Stephanie Kifowit, Holly Kim and Karina Villa. Bryan Drew is the lone Republican candidate.

In the race for Illinois secretary of state, Republicans Walter Adamczyk

and Diane M. Harris face one another in the primary for a chance to run against Democratic incumbent Alexi Giannoulis.

Contested elections are few and far between on the local level.

Peoria County Republicans have a Congressional choice in the 17th District between Dillan S. Vancil and Julie Bickelhaupt. Vancil opened his first of six Dame Fine Coffee shops in Monmouth and has also been a railroad worker and served as a school board member for West Central CUSD 235.

Bickelhaupt farms alongside her husband near Mount Carroll and has also served as a county board member. She also manages human relations for her family's insurance business.

The winner will face incumbent Sorensen of Moline, who in 2024 won a second term over Joe McGraw with 53.8% of the vote.

Knox County Republicans and some voters in Farmington will be asked to choose among incumbent Norine Hammond of Macomb, Joshua Higgins of Biggsville and Bailey Templeton of Hamilton for state representative in the 94th district.

Hammond has held her seat since 2010. Higgins is a U.S. Air Force veteran who has served on the school board of West Central CUSD 235 and works selling crop insurance and as a speed-and-agility coach. Templeton is a homeschooling mother.

Some voters are also facing an advisory question asking whether Illinois should adopt signature requirements for independent and new-party candidates that are equal to those required of Democrats and Republicans. Currently, independents and new-party candidates face requirements that are up to 20 times greater.

Islamic fanaticism left little choice in Iran

The lead news for days has been the U.S. and Israeli military operation against Iran. But there is a story behind the story also that needs mentioning.

Republicans have mostly been stating the bombing was a matter of national security. Democrats are stating the bombing should not have taken place, as there was no imminent threat of force against the U.S. by Iran. I tend to take the Democratic Sen. John Fetterman approach on this one, in that Iran was going to do bad things against Israel and the U.S. at some time and the prudent option was to take down the enemy on our terms and not wait for the attack.

While I certainly prefer peaceful resolutions of disputes, there are times only force is understood by those seeking to impose their will on another. Radical Islam reflects fanaticism and zealotry, which believes their religion is just and pure and those who do not adhere to it are worthless and their lives have no value. You cannot negotiate with a zealot, save by force and even then you must fear a knife in the back.

Let's take a look at the modern history of Iran, formerly known as Persia. After World War II, Western

nations sought to develop the oil-rich areas of the Middle East and to create a Jewish state. The house of Saud was supported in Saudi Arabia, Palestine became Israel and the Shah was presented to Iran as its leader.

Iran was thriving from a Western point of view. Oil was flowing and business was going great on all levels. Of real significance was the involvement of women in the Iranian culture. Women were in business and heavily involved in government. The Shah was present and to his detriment he became too authoritarian.

The people, and especially the religious right, rose up and deposed him in early 1979. That created a political vacuum that was filled by the Islamic right. Religious leaders became the government. All of those Western freedoms the business community had been introducing were branded as evil and Satanic by the mullahs.

Even today, Islamic radicals refer to the U.S. as the Great Satan. The populace, which wanted change from the Shah, saw radical Islam as the quickest way to achieve that change. It worked. The problem is the populace did not understand what the change would be.

Radical Islam was very well organized in Iran and its tenets prevailed in all forms of government and society. Iran, which was certainly trending to

Western values in the 1960s and 1970s, essentially regressed to a theocracy of the 700s. The mullahs were the supreme power and individual rights meant nothing to the theologians of Islam. Government was a one-faith affair and everyone needed to comply. That faith held then and still today that the world must be conquered to its ideological beliefs.

This is the Iran we are dealing with today. Radical Islam may not be the majority belief in Iran today, but it is the belief in power.

Americans should be ever thankful that our Constitution mandates freedom of religion and a secular government, albeit with Christian underpinning.

The powers that be in Iran have clearly expressed their beliefs and desire that the U.S. and Israel be terminated from this planet. When one is dealing with that mindset there can be no negotiations, except by force.

While I have many concerns about the U.S. and Israel's actions, in the big picture I see no other option than to destroy the threat that radical Islam presents to world. Whenever a religion forces itself on the populace, there can only be negative results.

BILLTOWN: Cafeteria department staff cut by 40%

of overall district cost-cutting. State metrics indicated district food-service expenses and other aspects were out of line compared with peers.

The Williamsfield cafeteria once had a salad bar and a hot-panini station, among other items.

"This is like a college cafeteria, things I had never heard of doing in public schools for free that we were doing every day or every week," Mills said.

"The cafeteria department took a 40% staffing cut and a major cut to their budget, which was out of control. I think people were unaware of what would happen to the food when we started los-

ing \$200,000 a year in our kitchen."

Board members approved an audit of the food-service program. Mills expects to receive audit help from the Illinois State Board of Education, the Knox County Health Department and Nancy Brown, the district food-service manager.

Among other things, the audit is designed to help improve cafeteria efficiency and adjust the menu, depending on the day and on what's popular among students.

Regarding food quality, Mills said health-department inspections of the cafeteria have been strong in general. He suggested some issues might be related to how food is pre-

pared.

"Five minutes of doing something quicker than you should have will lead to mold, possibly," Mills said. "Some of that is simply refining the process and being more careful."

But Mills made it clear the district can't afford to hire more cafeteria workers. More money for better products might become available through a district deficit-reduction plan Mills is formulating.

The younger Byrd advocated for the return of the salad bar, the paninis and a snack cart that featured chips and ice cream. It doesn't appear that will be

in the offing, at least at previous prices.

"Gone are the days of selling salads for \$1.50 when we have \$5 (invested) in it. We can't," Board President Chad Goff said.

Among other business, the board authorized a \$95,885.48 deal with Heart Technologies, Inc., of East Peoria for 39 security cameras and accessories. The project is split between two fiscal years, according to Mills. About \$51,500 in grant money will help fund it.

Board members also approved hiring Meranda Derham as a second-shift custodian.

codes committee on the same subject and said Alderman Tim Teel suggested bringing an inspector from the Peoria Fire Department to examine any solar installations in town. Teel said cost of the service could be added to the building permit for a solar array.

City of Peoria Fire Division Chief Nate Rice accompanied Tannock at the meeting. Rice said in Peoria, the solar inspector reviews plans before construction in regards to schematics and wiring. Rice said protection for battery storage areas is also an issue.

Tannock was told by the Peoria inspector that some projects already done in Elmwood would not be allowed in any jurisdiction he knows of. "The papers would not have got off his desk," Tannock said.

The building-codes committee was to meet March 10 to discuss the matter for a possible recommendation to the full council. A Zoning Board text amendment to include the Elmwood Fire Department in review process of permit applications was also tabled until the next meeting.

In other action regarding building

codes, the council approved adopting the 2024 International Building Code, 2024 International Residential Code and the 2024 International Existing Building Code.

The council also approved an ordinance amending the city's current building-codes fee schedule. Approved changes are increasing the cost for rooftop solar installation from \$175 to \$200, increase of a demolition permit from \$50 to \$100 and inclusion of hot tubs and spas along with swimming pools for a \$50 permit.

Treasurer Bonnie Beal reported that Elmwood is considering hiring West Central CPA of Monmouth as the new city auditor. The city's previous auditor has retired. Elmwood Township also uses West Central CPA for audit work, Beal said. Beal also said spending so far has been on track in regards to the city budget.

Economic Development Director Amy Davis reported that a preliminary engineering report has been accepted by a USDA engineer for the wastewater lagoon project. Davis said the city has received \$1 million in federal Community Project Funding

and should hear by June 1 if it qualifies for an Illinois Environmental Protection Agency loan.

Annexation of 14 acres of timber ground the city purchased north of Maple Lane Country Club last year will be on the next council agenda, Davis said.

Davis said she is conducting a small-business growth series with the University of Illinois Extension on March 23, 31, April 6, 13 and 20. Marketing, budgeting, business planning and advertising will be the focus of the free series, held from 6-8 p.m. each night at Nighthawks Coffee, 120 W. Main St. Registration is due by March 16 at go.illinois.edu/Small-BusinessGrowth.

During public comment, Tracey Mas addressed the board about ongoing litigation with the city regarding required facade work at Woppers Bar. Mas said her sister, Terri Bednar, should not be contacted about the facade and does not have authority to authorize work. Mas said there is a dispute about ownership of the bar that is also in litigation due to what she called will misrepresentation and forged documents.

Farquer faces more charges in Mercer Co.

ALEDO – The former Williamsfield School District superintendent has been accused of additional crimes regarding alleged inappropriate access of student health records.

Tim Farquer pleaded not guilty to five new charges Monday in Mercer County Circuit Court. A pretrial hearing was scheduled for 11:30 a.m. April 13. Farquer is on paid administrative leave from his job as Mercer County School District superintendent.

State's Attorney Grace Simpson filed the additional charges March 5 – three counts of official misconduct and one count each of computer tampering and unlawful access to medical records. Farquer, 53, first was charged last September with all three crimes, one count each.

At that time, Farquer was accused of ordering district nurse Amber Wood to illegally divulge student health and vaccination information regarding an outbreak

that month of hand-foot-and-mouth disease, among other things.

The Weekly Post left a telephone message with Simpson about the new charges.

Farquer is alleged to have committed the three original offenses on or about Sept. 1 of last year. Among the new charges, four allege wrongdoing on or about last May 2, according to court documents. The revised charging document doesn't include the circumstances

of the alleged May criminal activity.

An additional official-misconduct charge stemmed from the September date. The official-misconduct accusations are felonies, punishable by two to five years in state prison. The other charges are misdemeanors.

Farquer's attorneys have argued federal statutes regarding health-record privacy apply to medical professionals, not school superintendents. Those records are part of a stu-

dent's overall record, consistent with state law.

Farquer resides in Williamsfield, where he was superintendent for a decade.

No new charges were filed against two Mercer County school information-technology employees who face the same initial accusations as Farquer.

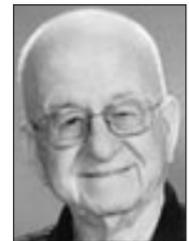

Elmwood senior Andrea Glenn and junior Brooke Allen were unanimous picks to the first team of the Prairie-land North All-Conference team in girls basketball.

They were joined on the first team by Brimfield junior Layni Linthicum and teammate Katie Doe, a sophomore.

Linthicum averaged 8.5 points, 4 rebounds and 2.5 assists and steals per game. Doe also averaged 8.5 points, with 5 rebounds per game.

“For Layni and Katie to put up the numbers they did was impressive be-

cause they had to do it all for us,” Brimfield Coach Josh McKown said.

A pair of seniors, Elmwood’s Natalie Babcock and Brimfield’s Schyer Meinders, were second-team choices. Farmington junior Lindsey Shriber was also a second-team selection.

Ella Essex, a Farmington freshman, earned a special mention.

In the Lincoln Trail Conference, Princeville’s Sahara Streitmatter, who surpassed 1,000 points for her career this season, was a first-team pick on the all-LTC team. She averaged 15.5 points and 5.7 rebounds a game.

Princeville’s Addison Buckley and

ROWVA-Williamsfield’s Megyn Erlacher were named to the all-LTC second team.

R-W’s Lauren Johnson was an honorable-mention all-LTC choice.

the field and Dee-Mack was 15-for-46. On 3s, Brimfield was 5-for-15, Dee-Mack 5-for-18. Dee-Mack was 6-for-6 on free throws, Brimfield 3-for-4.

The X factor, such as it was, might have been Albritton. The 5-foot-11 senior guard’s first long-distance basket, 35 seconds into the third quarter, gave the Chiefs an 18-18 tie. Another 3 at 7:46 of the fourth made it 28-27

Dee-Mack. Albritton finished with a team-high 14 points.

“He was one of the guys we were gambling to not hit,” Carlson said. “He was 0-for-4 in the first half and then started hitting them in the second half. I don’t think any of them was a gigantic momentum-mover. If he had missed like in the first half, then we’re talking differently here.”

Doe struggled from the field early, but he broke

through in the fourth quarter by driving to the hoop. Back-to-back such baskets put the Indians ahead 38-36 with 2:45 to play.

“For some reason, his left hand is what he favors when he goes to the basket. I think that throws teams off, knowing he’s a right-handed player,” Carlson said. “He kept us in it, giving us a chance.”

Earlier, sophomore Griffin Hougham helped improve Brimfield chances. With his team trailing 13-5 midway through the second quarter, Hougham hit two 3s as Brimfield outscored Dee-Mack 11-2 down the stretch. Doe capped it with a backdoor layup as time expired, off a dish from Dawson Traphagan.

By the time of Doe’s

final drive, Dee-Mack appeared to be prepared.

“(He) did an excellent job of getting to the basket and finishing,” Dee-Mack Coach Chad Cluver said about Doe. “We knew he could. At the end, we did a better job of doubling him when we needed to.”

With that, the prep careers of Doe, Burkitt, Traphagan and fellow senior starter Jackson Kappes ended. They helped give Brimfield its first regional title since 2016. And they sought to make it clear a 36-12 loss in December to Dee-Mack wasn’t a true representation of their play.

“I love my teammates,” Birkett said. “We wanted it so bad. It’s been 10 years since we’ve been anywhere near this. But even in the summer, we all wanted to go to state. I’m lucky that we got here. I wish we would have gotten farther.

“It was only one point.”

in the paint, good mid-range and 3-pointers,” Crawford said. “It’s draining.”

According to Lozier, it led to the first running-clock defeat of his varsity career.

Trouble arose early for Farmington, despite its modest lead. Farmington had at least five turnovers in the first quarter. The Farmers had been averaging fewer than 10 per game as of late, Lozier said. Passes slipped through or overshot Farmington players and went out of bounds, among other unforced errors.

The West Hancock zone defense also affected the Farmington offensive flow, according to Crawford. Farmington had only three 3s, something Dahl sought to limit after the Farmers made 10 in a regional-title victory over Sherrard.

“It seemed like we got a little tight on offense and missed some shots, and after that ...,” Lozier said. “We did about everything we could throw at Froman. He was just on tonight. Sometimes you run into a buzzsaw like that.

“It’s not like we didn’t have our shots. We just missed them. Been a fun ride, though.”

Senior swingman Jack Gronewold had 11 points to lead Farmington. Sophomore forward Logan Gardner had eight points, and Crawford scored seven.

The next day, Crawford

was under Lozier’s tutelage again, this time as an employee. Crawford works part time at Lozier Oil Co., of which the now-former coach is president.

“He’s a very special guy, especially in my heart,” Crawford said.

Farmington runs into buzzsaw at sectional

CHILLICOTHE – Inside and out, Farmington couldn't stop Warsaw West Hancock in their Class 2A Chillicothe Sectional semifinal.

West Hancock had 11 3-pointers, including four from 31-point-scorer Hunter Froman, and 12 points from 6-foot-10 Cooper Knowles in a 71-41 victory March 3 at Illinois Valley Central. It sent West Hancock (26-8) to a sectional title game March 6 against Peoria Manual, which won 57-41.

The semifinal result also sent Farmington Coach Marty Lozier into retirement. He had a 90-59 five-season record, including 17-14 in 2025-26.

Lozier and Farmington players were misty-eyed in the locker room following their defeat. But given time, senior guard Landon Crawford became clear-eyed about what he and his teammates accomplished and how improbable it all

might have seemed at one point.

"Coming from a team that was 2-8 to start the season and to be a top-32 team in 2A basketball in Illinois is just a blessing, really," Crawford said. "You don't see a lot of teams start that bad and running their entire schedule in the new year."

Seeded fourth in its post-season sub-sectional, Farmington recovered from widespread injuries to win 14 of its final 18 games. Among the early losses was one to second-seeded West Hancock, by four points at the Macomb-Western Holiday Tournament. Knowles had 29 points then.

This time, Froman did most of the damage. He had 12 consecutive West Hancock points during a four-minute, second-quarter span. That helped turn a 14-9 Titans deficit into a 24-18 lead, which they extended to 33-24 at the half. They had five 3s in the quarter and shot

better than 50% on them overall.

"Usually we don't have that long of a stretch of making them," said winning coach Jeff Dahl, who coached Warsaw to the 1997 Class A state championship. "I wish we shot that well every night. It would be easy to coach."

Froman, a junior, scored three in an 11-point West Hancock streak that

opened the second half. Then Knowles, a senior, had two alley-oop dunks as West Hancock finished the quarter with a nine-point run to a 63-32 lead. He had 10 third-period points, including a 3.

"We have a lot of good defenders, but it just takes a lot to guard a kid that's 6-10 and another who's 6-3 and can play at all levels –

Dee-Mack rallies, bounces Brimfield

MONMOUTH – For Tom Burkitt and his Brimfield boys basketball teammates, their Class 1A Monmouth Sectional semifinal ended too abruptly. Just like their season.

Deer Creek-Mackinaw came back in the fourth quarter March 4 to beat Brimfield 41-40. Tkye Albritton's 3-pointer, his fourth of the second half, with two minutes to play in the game proved decisive for Dee-Mack (26-7), the top seed in its sub-sectional.

Two nights later at United High School, Tremont defeated archrival Dee-Mack 47-45 to advance to the Macomb Supersectional.

Second-seeded Brimfield (25-8) had two chances to win in the waning seconds of its semi. The better chance came from Connor Doe, who had a game-leading 17

points.

With Shaun Denniston and Jerry Hahn defending, Doe missed a left-side drive to the basket. The move worked for him for most of the fourth quarter, when he scored 11. Burkitt got the rebound. But his buzzer-beating, awkward-angled, well-defended attempt from the right corner wasn't close.

"I got the rebound and I just couldn't believe I got it," a subdued Birkett said afterward. "I dribbled it. I looked up. I saw people look at me, but I felt like there was no time, so I shot it. The second I shot it, I knew it wasn't going in."

"I feel like it was over so fast. I was literally just speechless. I couldn't believe it."

The last-second attempts capped a game that was even in most statistical aspects.

According to Brimfield Coach Scott Carlson, his team was 16-for-43 from *Continued on Page 15*
