New bleachers for Bradford

Gym updates top \$200,000

BRADFORD – The Bradford School Board approved updates for the gymnasium, recognized employee service milestones and made personnel changes at its Tuesday meeting.

The board approved a bid of \$191,500 from Larson Company to replace bleachers in the Junior High gymnasium and also OK'd a bid of \$24,900 from Mangieri Refinishing for a new gym floor. Work will be done this summer.

The board also recognized the following staff members for service to the district: Kevin Ioder, 25 years; and Bobbi Jo Chadwick, 20 years; Stephenia Bosch, Jill Stahl, Tara Blundy, Shaunna Bowen and Lexi Church, five years.

In personnel, the board rehired all current non-certified staff for the 2026-27 school year and to hire Linnea Nordstrom as

Navigating through insurance after the storm

TOULON – After the major storm went through Stark County and Toulon on April 17, we thought it would be a good idea to explain the process and let people know what to expect.

Our agency writes insurance for several different insurance companies. Our competitors have a lot of good companies as well. This article is of a general nature and not specific to one insurance company. Some things can vary between companies.

Most insurers will send in a CAT crew (short for catastrophic) These are adjusters trained to assess major storm damage. Many of them will work seven days a week to get through these claims.

The adjusters will assess your damage and write their own estimates. Insurers do not hire contractors to do the repairs; the property owner needs to hire a contractor with whom they are comfortable. Insurance adjusters are not allowed to recommend contractors.

In my experience, the esti-

mates done by the CAT crew have been very fair. If there are discrepancies between the contractor and the adjuster estimates, the contractor can likely work that out with the adjuster.

Here are some terminology you need to be familiar with:

- Replacement cost is the settlement clause that pays for the cost to replace with new material in place of old.

- Actual cash value is the settlement clause that pays the depreciated value of the damaged items (roof, siding, windows etc.) ACV is calculated

as full cost to replace minus depreciation. For example, an item is 5 years old and has an expected useful life of 25 years. In that case, 20% of its useful life has been used, so ACV will equal 80% of the cost to replace.

The adjuster will calculate the ACV loss and pay that up front. If you have RC, the difference between RC and ACV will be paid after repairs have been made. If you have ACV, this does not apply to you.

ferred to here is called recoverable depreciation. It is very possible you could have RC on your home, but the roof is covered as ACV. In the past 5 years many insurers no longer offer RC on roofs over 5-10 years old.

If you do not have RC on your property it could be that you did not want to pay the extra premium to have it due to the age or condition of your property, or RC may have not been offered by the insurer.

Auto insurance has used ACV forever. If you total out a 10-year-old car, the insurance does not pay you for a brand new one. Roofs are similar situation, although more than five years ago it was much easier to get RC.

Cosmetic damage is basically dents in exterior metal surfaces such as metal roofing, siding, gutters and so on. Cosmetic damage changes the appearance (dents) but does not result in failure to function. In the past 5 years, some insurers

have started to exclude cosmetic damage.

From what we are seeing, many homeowners policies do still cover cosmetic damage while many farm policies exclude cosmetic damage. Although I am not involved with making these decisions, the reason most farm policies exclude cosmetic damage is due to the massive amount of metal surfaces on a farm compared to fairly minimal metal surfaces on a home.

Please note, holes in vinyl siding are not consid-

ered cosmetic damage. These are covered even if there is a cosmetic-damage exclusion on the policy.

Also, insurance will cover what is damaged but will not cover undamaged areas of your house in order to get them to match.

For auto claims there is no cosmetic exclusion, so hail dents in autos are covered as long as the auto has comprehensive coverage. Adjusters will also write estimates for hail damage to autos but you might as well go ahead and get your own estimate as well. If you do not get the auto repaired, you are still entitled to the claim payment. From that point on, you may be able to insure that auto for liability, but not for collision and comprehensive.

Some home or commercial insurers have started using a percentage deductible for wind/hail claims. If your property is insured for \$500,000 and has a 1% deductible, it will be 1% of \$500,000 or \$5,000, not 1% of damages.

As many of you are aware, there was a major insurance crisis nationwide over the past 4-5 years due to inflation on building and auto repair. During COVID, most insurance companies paid more in claims than they accepted in premiums. That resulted in premiums going up and some coverages being restricted. As an agent, we would rather not have these restrictions, but we have no control over it.

We are thankful that, as far as we know, no one was injured in the storm.

And please note that this article is a general description of insurance claims. Each insurance company and type of policy will vary.



The City of Galva ("City") is seeking proposals from qualified development entities to complete the restoration or rehabilitation of the old Chevy Building in downtown Galva. The property is zoned B-1 (Retail & Limited Service). In collaboration with the selected developer, the city envisions a retail or service space that carefully preserves the buildings' envelope and historic integrity while activating additional development on the east end of Market/Commercial Street.

Located on an approximately 8,942 square foot parcel bounded on the North by Market Street and on the South by Commercial Street, the Old Chevy Building property is situated near a gas station, a seed company, a grocery store, a residential area, and an empty lot to the east that stretches to Chester Street. To the west of the property is the rest of downtown Galva, which offers many amenities, including restaurants, bars, offices, and retail establishments.
